

Jordaan to return to Rugby World Cup in new role

● Bay-born star to assist Bok Women's coaching staff

The last time Zenay Jordaan left the pitch at the Rugby World Cup, she was carried off shoulder high by her Springbok Women teammates and England opponents, but she will return later this year, albeit in a new capacity.

The 34-year-old Nelson Mandela Bay-born Jordaan played her last Test for the Bok Women at Waitakere Stadium in Auckland, New Zealand, in 2022, bringing to a close a 36-cap career, at the time the most played by any South African player.

Come England and RWC 2025, Jordaan, who recently completed World Rugby's Level 3 coaching course, will return to the global showpiece with the Springbok Women in a coaching capacity, assisting SA's coaching staff as part of World Rugby's Gallagher High Performance Academy programme.

Incidentally, incumbent Bok Women assistant coach Laurian Johannes-Haupt was in a similar role in 2022, but she has since progressed into a full-time coaching role in SA Rugby's high-performance department.

Jordaan joined the Springbok Women training camp in Stellenbosch last week as the "on-field" element of her high-performance course kicked in, much to the delight of the former flyhalf.

"I really enjoyed the online part of the course thus far and I learnt so much from so many experienced coaches in that time," Jordaan, who is also assistant coach for the Bulls Daisies, SA's top provincial team, said.

"It certainly added to my knowledge and composure as a coach.

"On the field is where I am at my most happy, so to have this opportunity to come and implement those guidelines was as pleasing.

"The fact that I know those players and played with some others at the last tournament has made life easier for me.

"Also, with Laurian [Johannes-

Haupt], who walked this journey before me, there was another bonus.

"She has given me good advice where needed, and I can always check in with her if I am not sure about something.

"What has struck me thus far is the quality of the coaches they have here and how they manage to bring the message across to the players.

"There is good communication going both ways.

"The players are asking good questions and what impressed me is the clarity of communication regarding the sessions so far."

The Bok Women are hoping to improve on their previous best finish

at the Rugby World Cup (10th in 2010 and 2014) in England, and Jordaan is quietly optimistic about that.

"So far so good — the 100-day countdown has started, but we should not get ahead of ourselves," she said.

"The most important thing will be to make the most of each training session and get the maximum value out of that.

"It might sound far away, but it will go fast from here on in, so the quality of work at training from here on in will be very important."

Springbok Women performance coach Swys de Bruin said Jordaan's presence was welcome.

"We all know what a brilliant player she was and to have the intellectual property of one of the legends in the women's game around is very positive," he said.

"As to her role in the coaching set-up, I am adamant about the development of female coaches, as I believe they are the best way forward in the women's game.

"Zenay is already involved with the best provincial team in the country and to have her around is a benefit to us all.

"The growth of rugby is about spreading the word, not keeping everything in a secluded group of people." — SA Rugby Communications

Punjab coach tells players not to ease up

Punjab Kings coach Ricky Ponting was delighted that his side had qualified for the Indian Premier League (IPL) playoffs for the first time in 11 years but said he had told his players not to lose focus as they "haven't achieved anything yet".

Punjab registered their best performance in 2014 when they finished runners-up to Kolkata Knight Riders, but failed to make the playoffs in the subsequent 10 seasons.

They have looked formidable under Ponting and captain Shreyas Iyer this season, however, securing a top-two finish after nine wins in 14 matches.

"It's obvious this is a really talented team and they are all on the same page and heading in the same direction," Ponting told the host broadcasters after Punjab beat Mumbai Indians in their final regular season match on Monday.

"It's a great achievement till now, but really, if you look back, we haven't achieved anything yet.

"That's the one thing I've been saying to the players since the moment we qualified.

Champions League place a win for Guardiola

Manchester City manager Pep Guardiola said finishing third in the Premier League in this turbulent season was as good as winning the title, after a 2-0 victory at Fulham on Sunday that ensured Champions League football in the new campaign.

Goals from Ilkay Gundogan and Erling Haaland sealed the win for City, and Guardiola praised his players for their fighting spirit to keep going in a campaign where injuries and ill-fortune dogged the team almost from the start.

"It's like a title, [due to] the obstacles," Guardiola told the BBC. "When you continue [to struggle], you finish 10th, 11th, 12th or 13th. "This is the destiny of all the

teams in the Premier League when they are in November, December or January and you cannot fight for the

Premier League like you have done for many years.

"People can say, 'I don't want to fight again, just to qualify for the Europa League'.

"We continued playing good and we were there [third in the table to qualify] and we did it.

"At the end, we finished third, not miles away from Arsenal, but the distance to Liverpool is huge.

"We have to improve, and hopefully we can do it."

Guardiola suggested there would be new faces in his squad next season, but "not too many" as he looks to trim the number of players in the first team.

Jack Grealish was a noticeable ab-

sentee from the match-day squad against Fulham amid questions over his future.

But asked if he was happy for the player to stay, Guardiola insisted that Grealish's absence was simply the consequence of having a big squad.

"Who said I am not happy with him? It is not personal, I don't have any problem with any of the players. "I am the person who fought for him to come here, and to stay in the last season," Guardiola said.

"In the last game, we had six players who stayed at home; this time, it was five.

"But it is that simple, it is nothing else. What happens in the future [is up to the club], not me." — Reuters
