1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this exercise is to appoint a service provider for the translation of the vision 2040 indaba outcomes report.

2. BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: 25 public entities.

SANParks' operations are totally guided by its vision statement and mission statement. As a public entity, the organisation is committed to act in pursuance of transformation of South Africa's society in support of entrenching South Africa's democracy. In this regard, the organisation has adopted a transformation mission to guide its efforts accordingly.

3. TERMS OF REFERENCE

3.1 Background

The Vision 2040 Indaba, hosted by SANParks from 3 to 5 September 2025 in Gqeberha, represented a pivotal moment in South Africa's conservation journey. The Indaba brought together over 250 delegates, including government leaders, traditional authorities, scientists, community representatives, and civil society organisations, to co-create a new inclusive direction for conservation. The resulting Vision 2040 Indaba Outcomes Report captures the deliberations, strategic commitments, and shared aspirations that emerged from this landmark event. It reaffirms SANParks' commitment to a people-centred, inclusive, and regenerative conservation model under the Vision 2040 framework, which positions conservation landscapes as spaces of justice, prosperity, and ecological integrity. To ensure accessibility and inclusivity, SANParks seeks to translate this 29-page (including cover pages) English report into key South African languages namely isiXhosa, Southern Sesotho and tshiVhenda, to broaden participation and ownership among diverse linguistic communities.

3.2 Purpose of the Assignment

The purpose of this assignment is to translate the Vision 2040 Indaba Outcomes Report from English into three South African languages — isiXhosa, Southern Sesotho, and tshiVhenda — ensuring linguistic accuracy, cultural sensitivity, and conceptual clarity while maintaining the tone and style of the original text.

3.3 Scope of Work

- Translate the 29-page Vision 2040 Indaba Outcomes Report into isiXhosa, SeSotho, and tshiVhenda.
- **Number of English words in the document:** 9354
- **Font Ariel:** 12
- **Line spacing:** 1.5 Paragraphs Justified
- The translated versions must be the same as the English layout (***NB: no pictures on the report text only***).
- Ensure accuracy, consistency, and preservation of meaning, particularly for technical and policy terminology related to conservation, governance, and transformation.
- Conduct proofreading and quality assurance for each translated version.
- Ensure language flow to maintain meaning intended on the original document.
- Submit all translations in editable electronic format (MS Word and PDF).
- Maintain confidentiality of all SANParks documents and information shared.
- The documents can be shared via pdf/word document and/or URL link.

Functionality Evaluation Criteria

- Bidders are required to demonstrate their ability to undertake the required services and provide proof of expertise and resources to provide the required services.
- Bidders are required to score a minimum of **80** points out of a possible **100** to proceed to the second stage/phase of evaluation
- Bid offers that fail to score the required number of points (**80**) per the functional requirements will be eliminated.
- The onus rests with the bidder to supply sufficient information to allow for the proper scoring, evaluation and award of points.
- Functionality points shall be awarded per the following provisions.

NB Performance Standards & Quality Control-

Should any deliverable be deemed substandard, inaccurate, incomplete, inconsistent, or not aligned with the agreed specifications, SANParks may:

- Reject the deliverable, in whole or in part; and


- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
- (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,
