1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

This quotation is for the appointment of a service provider(s) for the rendering of the following services within the city, excluding aggressive/violent animals; -

CATEGORY A

- The collection and disposal of carcasses throughout the seven regions of the City upon instruction by an authorized Environmental Health Practitioner.

NB: Service provider (1 service provider or more per cluster) to be appointed for collection and disposal of carcasses: -

Cluster 1	Regions 3, 6 and 4
Cluster 2	Regions 1 and 2
Cluster 3	Region 5 and 7

NB: In case where the city is unable to appoint a service provider for a specific cluster as mentioned above, due to non-responsive bids, or any other challenge that renders it impossible for the appointed service provider for a specific cluster to render services in his/ her cluster, the Health Department reserves the right to instruct the available service provider/s to render a service at the cluster having such demand in line with the fee structure of that service provider. The appointed service provider/s will be bound by this decision as it is done in the interest of public health.

CATEGORY B

- One (1) service provider for the collection and impounding of nuisance animals in the city of Tshwane's area of jurisdiction.

The City of Tshwane Health Bylaws for the keeping of animal's birds, and poultry provides for procedures to be followed prior to impounding of animals and the National Health Act provides a mandate for the city to keep the environment in a safe and hygienic manner. The quotation will be valid for a period of one (1) year with effect from 01 December 2025 or date of appointment (whichever comes last).

One service provider (depending on qualification upon Capacity response time and meeting all other requirements) may qualify for both A and B, simultaneously)

2. BACKGROUND

According to section 24 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa as amended, everyone has the right to an environment that is not harmful to their health and well-being. Chapter seven of the Constitution also states clearly as one of the objects of the Local Government: "to promote a safe and healthy environment".

Part B of Schedule 5 of the Constitution lists the control of public nuisances, facilities for the accommodation, care and burial of animals as a competency reserved for local government. The City of Tshwane in advertising the tender for the collection and disposal of carcasses as well as the collection and impounding of nuisance animals seek to address its responsibilities in terms of the mandate granted to it in terms of the Constitution.

This quotation request will benefit the City of Tshwane in ensuring a safe and healthy environment through the removal of dead carcasses, that may pose a health nuisance, ensuring the safe transportation and disposal of same in a manner agreed upon with the municipality. Further, to impound nuisance animals that may, in the opinion of the Health Department, pose a threat to the health of individuals/ community.

The rendering of this service in the City of Tshwane further enhances the city's ability to attain the strategic objectives below:

Strategic Objective 3: To fight poverty, and build clean, healthy, safe and sustainable communities.

- KPA 3.8: Promote a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment and reduce the burden of preventable diseases on our people and our economy, including chronic illness, TB, HIV and Aids.

This quotation further displays the commitment of the city to serve its residents who will directly benefit by living in a clean and healthy environment free of any health nuisance.

All services rendered in terms of this quotation will be done **upon instruction of the department or where the nuisance is initially sighted by the service provider, the department will have to approve such collection and disposal.**

3. PROJECT SCOPE

SERVICE PROVIDER REQUIREMENTS

The City of Tshwane is inviting bids from the service provider/s which have the competency to:-

- 3.1. handle animal care matters including the impounding of animals creating a nuisance in public areas, excluding aggressive animals in line with the City of Tshwane Keeping of animals by-law; as well as the transportation thereof;
- 3.2. transport animals in compliance with the Animal Protection Act 71 of 1962 and the Animal Health Act 7 of 2002 and relevant regulations.
- 3.3 source the necessary transportation and equipment to collect, handle and dispose of carcasses.
- 3.4 (i) The service provider/s appointed must comply with all related legislative requirements in terms of keeping and handling of animals, such as the Animal Protection Act of 1962, the City of Tshwane bylaws, the Labour Relations Act and any other law relating to animals and related employee matters.
- 3.5 The above requirements must be met always ensuring compliance with the following legislation applicable to the service to be rendered.
 - Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984
 - Animal Protection Act 71 of 1962
 - National Health Act 61 of 2003
 - Labour Relations Act 66 of 1995
 - Animal Health Act 7 of 2002

3.6. SPECIFICATIONS

3.6.1 One or more bidder/s will be awarded, (if more than one) one bidder per cluster under **category A**, bidder/s will be evaluated in terms of the requirements of PPPFA. 3.6.2 This quotation request is for the removal and safe disposal of carcasses **found on the streets and/ or open ground, sidewalks, main routes and freeways**. The quotation request covers the collection, receipt and disposal of carcasses collected by the service provider upon instruction from the city of Tshwane.

This quotation request includes the removal and safe disposal of carcasses or similar, from private property upon instruction of an authorized Environmental Health Practitioner to remedy a health nuisance. The costs incurred will be recovered by the Health Department from the owner of the premises.

3.6.3 The means of safe disposal of the carcasses should be either by incineration in an approved facility or at an approved institution of animal preservation e.g the Pretoria Zoo or disposal at an approved landfill site. Proof of such incineration / donation or safe disposal at the approved landfill sites, and pictures of the collected carcasses must be submitted with the monthly records and invoices for payment.

3.6.4 The service provider must provide a depot with refrigeration facilities for the storage of carcasses prior to disposal.

3.6.5 The service provider must have a valid contract to utilize a specific landfill site within the city for disposal and submit proof of same within 15 days of commencement of the contract.

3.6.6 The service provider will keep proper and identifiable records related to all services rendered in terms of this agreement and charge the fees as per pricing schedule.

3.6.7 In case of direct removals and disposal or surrender of animals to an animal preservation institution, an EHP must be present during the collection of that animal.

3.6.8 Appropriate and approved vehicles and equipment for transportation, efficient disposal of carcasses should be provided.

3.7 COLLECTION TIME FRAMES

The collection of carcasses upon instruction from the CoT should be affected within **three (3) hours** of the service provider receiving the instruction, except in exceptional circumstance in which case the service provider will give prior notification to the CoT of the reasons for non-adherence to the stipulated time frame, e.g. multiple deaths due to traffic accidents.

3.8 CONTROLS FOR THE COLLECTION OF CARCASSES

3.8.1 The quotation request will be awarded subject to the approval of the following, which will be subject to regular inspections by the Department

- premises,
- equipment,
- vehicles and
- staff component.

3.8.2 The records kept by the service provider will be subjected to regular audits by the City of Tshwane.

3.8.3 The service provider will submit monthly records to the city of services provided in terms of this agreement.

3.8.4 The service provider will provide a monthly summary report of services provided, together with its invoice, pictures of collected carcasses, and proof of safe disposal.

3.8.5 The service provider will invoice the CoT monthly by the 3rd day of each following month after which the service has been rendered. The invoices will indicate the following:

- number and type of animal attended to,
- the type of service provided,
- the date of the service,
- the contact details of the third party who requested the service, where available, and
- picture evidence depicting the rendering of the service and
- the amount invoiced.

3.8.6 The CoT will pay validated invoices of the service provider within 30 days from invoice date, in accordance with National Treasury Regulations

CATEGORY B

3.9 IMPOUNDING OF ANIMALS – UPON INSTRUCTION

3.9.1 The collection of animals and subsequent impounding thereafter will be done only upon receipt of instructions from the CoT Municipal Health Services.

3.9.2 The service provider will provide pound services on behalf of the CoT. The service provider will keep the animals at the pound for a maximum period of seven (7) days as per the City of Tshwane Keeping of Animals, Birds and Poultry Bylaw. After

the initial seven (7) days the service provider must deal with the animals in accordance with its policies.

3.9.3 The service provider will provide care, shelter, food, water and medicine, including other necessary medical treatment to all animals in the pound. The service provider will inform the owner (where identity of such owner and address is known) of an impounded animal in writing that the animal has been impounded and a copy of such notice must be submitted with the records and invoice at the end of each month.

3.9.4 The service provider must provide proof of access to an animal technician or veterinary doctor for emergencies and dispensing medications.

3.9.5 The service provider will collect impounding tariffs determined by the city, on behalf of the Department, on animals collected by their owners and give receipts for such monies collected.

3.9.6 The service provider will keep proper and identifiable records related to all services rendered in terms of the ~~tender~~ **quotation**

3.10 CONTROLS FOR THE IMPOUNDING OF ANIMALS

3.10.1 The quotation request will be awarded subject to the approval of the following, which will be subject to regular inspections by the Department.

- premises,
- equipment,
- vehicles and
- staff component.

3.10.2 The records kept by the service provider will be subjected to regular audits by the CoT.

3.10.3 The service provider will record all payments received for impounded animals upon collection by their owners. These amounts collected from owners will be offset against the service provider's monthly invoice payments.

3.10.4 The service provider will submit seven (7) day records to the CoT of services provided per impounded animal in terms of this agreement.

3.10.5 The service provider will provide a monthly summary report of services provided, together with its invoice.

3.10.6 The service provider will invoice the CoT monthly, by the 3rd day of each following month after which the service has been rendered. The invoices will indicate the following:

- number and type of animal attended to,
- the type of service provided,
- the date of the service,
- the contact details of the **official** who authorised the service, and
- picture evidence depicting the rendering of the service and
- the amount invoiced.

3.10.7 The city will pay validated invoices of the service provider within 30 days from invoice date, in accordance with national Treasury Regulations.

3.11 PREMISES AND EQUIPMENT.

3.11.1 The service provider should provide appropriate facilities as per legislation to keep any impounded animals in the impounding center for the prescribed maximum period of 7 days and keep a register and other relevant records for all animals in the pound.

3.11.2 Such facilities should have approved provision for isolation of sick and/or injured animals as well as animals on heat.

3.11.3 Appropriate and approved vehicles and equipment for the collection and transportation of animals.

GENERAL

3.12. PERSONNEL

3.12.1 The service provider will appoint an adequate number of competent personnel who will be charged with the provision of the services in terms of this arrangement.

3.12.2 The service provider will provide branded protective clothing and relevant equipment to their personnel rendering services in terms of this arrangement.

3.12.3 The service provider will upon request provide proof of continuous risk assessment and evaluation as required in terms of the Occupational Health and Safety Act.

3.13 PENALTY CLAUSES.

3.13.1 Failure of the service provider/s to provide requested records on time as stipulated in this agreement will result in the non-payment of the invoice **until such records are received**.

3.13.2 Failure of a service provider/s to collect a carcass within three hours of notification will result in the non-payment by the CoT for the invoiced amount for the same services rendered. (Except in exceptional circumstances, in which case the service provider will give prior notification to the CoT of the reasons for non-adherence to the stipulated time frame, e.g., multiple deaths due to traffic accidents.

4. DELIVERABLES

The successful bidder must render the service in line with the project scope and adhere to all, time frames as mentioned in the project scope for submission of reports and invoices.

Stage 4: PREFERENTIAL POINTS SYSTEM

The preferential point system used will be the 80/20 points system in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act 5 of 2000) Regulations 2022.

- 80 points for price
- 20 points for Specific goals

SPECIFIC GOALS

- Bidders are required to submit supporting documents for their bids to claim the specific goal points.
- Non-compliance with specific goals will not lead to disqualification but bidders will not be allocated specific goal points. Bidders will score points out of 80 for price only and zero (0) points out of 20 for specific goals.
- CoT shall act against any bidder or person when it detects that the specific goals were claimed or obtained on a fraudulent basis.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.

- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
