DETAILED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1. Background

The SABC KZN office has two Chillers, which are part of the water-cooling system. Water is channelled from the cooling towers into the Chillers through the condenser pipes. Over the years the condenser water pipes have developed internal corrosion, as a result the risk of the plant room flooding is imminent, if the status of the corroded pipes is not addressed.

The most contributing factor for the corrosion in the pipes is the office proximity to the sea. There have been a few incidents, whereby the condenser pipes burst due to rust, resulting in flooding in the plant room. Based on this, it is evident that the equipment is long overdue for a replacement to safeguard the Chillers for the next coming years.

2. Scope of work

- Removal of all corroded water pipes and dispose away from site.
- Connect the new water condenser pipes to the Chillers, run and test the equipment before handover.
- The new piping will be hot dip galvanized and coated with anti-corrosion prima; final finish will be painted brilliant green.
- Piping will be pressure tested to 10 bars for 24hrs, certificate to be issued.
- The new piping must be warranted against defects for 5years.
- Existing water isolation valves to be used.
- Butt weld to used.
- X-ray needed on all new piping.
- Mild steel with thickness of 10-20mm.
- Length of the pipes to be replaced 35m

3. RFQ Response Information

Effective Date of Bid

Vendors should state in writing that their quotation to the SABC and all furnished information, including price, will remain valid and applicable for 90 days from the date the vendor quotation is received by the SABC.

4. Costing

The quotation must reflect a detailed cost breakdown, and any indirect costs associated with the rendering of required service as per the schedule in the Scope of Service.

5. Contract Works Area

- **5.1.** The Contractor shall confine his activities to the Contract Works site and the access route to this site.
- **5.2.** A list of names of working staff and ID proof will be submitted to the SABC. Workers will wear clothing clearly identifying the identity of the supplier.
- **5.3.** The site area is inside a broadcasting environment; therefore, care should be taken to reduce noise and dust when executing the work.

- 11.1. The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay any expenses or losses which may be incurred by the Tenderer in the preparation and delivery of his tender. The Corporation reserves the right to accept a separate tender or separate tenders for any one or more of the sections of a specification. The corporation also reserves the right to withdraw the tender at any stage.

- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

- (a) "tender" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) "rand value" means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
