BID CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

1 Agreement

The successful bidder will be expected to sign the Contract Form (Part 1) of this bid document within 30 days of the date of notification by the Siyancuma Municipality that his/her bid has been accepted.

2 Completion of Bid Documents

- (a) The original bid document must be completed fully in black ink and signed by the authorised signatory to validate the proposal. All the pages must be initialled by the authorised signatory. Failure to do so may result in the invalidation of the bid.
- (b) Bid documents may not be retyped or altered in any way.

3 Alteration or Qualification of Bid

No unauthorised alteration of this set of bid documents will be allowed. Any unauthorised alteration will disqualify the proposal automatically. Any ambiguity has to be cleared with contact person for the bid before the closure date.

4 Authorised Signatory

- (a) A copy of the recorded Resolution taken by the Board of Directors, members, partners or trustees authorising the representative to submit this bid on the bidder's behalf must be attached to the Bid Document on submission of same.
- (b) A bid shall be eligible for consideration only if it bears the signature of the bidder or of some person duly and lawfully authorized to sign it for and on behalf of the bidder.

5 Submission of Bid

- (a) The bid must be put in a sealed envelope, or envelopes when the two-envelope system is specified, clearly marked with the bid number, title as well as closing date and time and placed in the *Tender Box at the Siyancuma Local Municipality by not later than 11h30 on 16 January 2026*
- (b) Faxed, e-mailed and late bids will not be accepted. Bids may be delivered by hand, by courier, or posted at the bidder's risk and must be received by the deadline specified above, irrespective of how they are sent or delivered.

6 Opening, Recording and Publications of Bids Received.

- Bids will be opened in public immediately after the bid closure date, or at such
- time as specified in the bid documents. If requested by any bidder present,
- names of the bidders, and if practical the total amount of each bid and of any alternative bids will be read out aloud
- Bids received in time recorded and entered in a register which is open for public inspection.

7 SARS TCS Pin

- **a.** It is a compulsory requirement to submit active and valid Tax Compliance Status (TCS) Pin for independent verification of Tax status as at Bid evaluation stage.
- b. Bids submission not supported by a valid original Tax Clearance Certificate and a SARS TCS Pin will be non-compliant.
- c. Consortia / joint ventures /sub-contractors are involved; each party must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate and SARS TCS Pin.

8 Evaluation of Bids

Bids will be evaluated in terms of their responsiveness to the bid specifications and requirements as well as such additional criteria as set out in the bid documents.

9 Acceptance or Rejection of a Bids

The Siyancuma Local Municipality reserves the right to withdraw any invitation to submit a bid and/or to re-advertise or to reject any bid or to accept a part of it. The Siyancuma Local Municipality does not bind itself to accepting the lowest bid.

10 Registration on Accredited Supplier Database

It is expected of all prospective service providers who are not yet registered on the Central Supplier Database to register online (www.csd.gov.za). The Siyancuma Local Municipality reserves the right not to award proposals to prospective suppliers who are not registered on the CSD (Central Supplier Database).

12 Stamp and Other Duties

The successful bidder will be liable for all duties and costs on legal documents resulting in the establishment of a contract and for the surety and retentions.

13 Language of Contract

The contract documents will be compiled in English and the English versions of all referred documents will be taken as applicable.

14 Procurement Policy

Bids will be awarded in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022, pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, No 5 of 2000.

15 Expenses Incurred in Preparation of Bid

The Siyancuma Local Municipality shall not be liable for any expenses incurred in the preparation and submission of the bid.

16 Wrong Information Furnished

Where a contract has been awarded on the strength of the information furnished by the bidder which, after the conclusion of the relevant agreement, is proved to have been incorrect, the Siyancuma Local Municipality may, in addition to any other legal remedy it may have, recover from the contractor all costs, losses or damages incurred or sustained by the

17 Validity Period

Bids shall remain valid for 90 days after the bid closure date.

18 General and Special Conditions of Contract

The General Conditions of Contract as well as any Special Conditions of Contract that may form part of this set of bid documents will be applicable to this bid in addition to the conditions of bid.

19 Municipal Rates, Taxes and Charges

- (i) The bidder to provide their municipal account of rates and taxes of both the Bidding entity and its directors' in its Bid Document submission. Any bidder which is or whose directors are in arrear with their municipal rates and taxes due to any Municipality within South Africa for more than three months and have not made an arrangement for settlement of or same before the bid closure date will be disqualified.
- (ii) Bids submission not supported by a municipal account will be non-compliant. In the event of leasing, a lease agreement must be attached to the bid document.

20 Contact with Municipality after Bid Closure Date

(i) Bidders shall not contact the Siyancuma Local Municipality on any matter relating to their bid from the time of the opening of the bid to the time the contract is awarded. If a bidder wishes to bring additional information to the notice of the Siyancuma Municipality, it should do so in writing to the Siyancuma Local Municipality. TERMS OF REFERENCE

APPOINTMENT OF A TRAVEL AGENT FOR SIYANCUMA LOCAL MUNICIPALITY FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS

1. PURPOSE

The Siyancuma Local Municipality intends to appoint a suitable travel agent to administrate air travel, accommodation, car rental/shuttle services and meal requests as needed by the municipality from date of appointment.

2. OBJECTIVE

The main objective is to eliminate the delays of service delivery, which sometimes result in/to unnecessary deviations.

This contract will be awarded to a service provider that intends to assist the Municipality by providing market related prices (cost efficiency), with high quality goods and services, which ultimately seek to ensure value for money

SCOPE OF WORK

1 FLIGHTS (DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL)

- 1) The travel agency must be able to obtain at least three comparable quotations from different airlines for domestic and international flights. Confirmation of receipt of request to be send by the service provider
- 2) The travel agency must separately indicate its service/ booking fees on each quotation.
- 3) The municipality will indicate the preferred travelling times.
- 4) The travel agency must forward their quotation to the municipality's representative who will make the final selection and inform the travel agency within a reasonable time. Emergency logistical arrangements must also be considered. Final details will be included in the SLA.
- 5) After confirmation by way of an official purchase order from the municipality, the travel agency will make the necessary flight arrangements with the preferred airline.
- 6) The travel agency is required to confirm flight bookings in writing (email) to the municipality's representative and will communicate any post booking changes to flights, telephonically and in writing (email) to the municipality's representative.
- 7) Proof of payment to be submitted to the municipality after request has been actioned, before officials depart.
- 8) The travel agency is required to be available for all bookings and cancellations of airline tickets. An emergency telephone number must be provided for in cases of emergency.
- The travel agency must always endeavour to make the most cost effective arrangements and reservations on behalf of the municipality.
- 10) The travel agency is required to investigate any complaints from travelers and do follow-ups on the recovery of lost baggage as well as facilitating any insurance claims that might arise.

2 CAR RENTAL RESERVATIONS

- 1. The travel agency must be able to obtain at least three comparable quotations from different car rental companies. However, if obtaining three quotations is impractical due to unavailability or any other exceptional case, a single quotation will be accepted. The type of vehicle requested will depend on the municipality's requirements. Confirmation of receipt of request to be send by the service provider
- 2. The travel agency must separately indicate its service/ booking fees on the quotation.
- 3. The travel agency must forward their quotation to the municipality's representative who will make the final selection and inform the travel agency within a reasonable time. Emergency logistical arrangements must also be considered. Final details will be included in the SLA.

- 4. After confirmation by way of an official purchase order from the municipality, the travel agency will make the necessary arrangements with the car rental company.
- The travel agency will confirm the car rental booking in writing (email) to the municipality's representative and will communicate any post booking changes to car rental, telephonically and in writing (email) to the municipality's representative.
- 6. Proof of payment to be submitted to the municipality after request has been actioned, before officials depart.
- 7. The travel agency is required to be available for all bookings and cancellation of car rentals. An emergency telephone number must be provided for in cases of emergency.
- 8. The travel agent/municipality must be registered as a preferred client of the car rental company in order for the officials to travel efficient and effectively.

3 ACCOMMODATION BOOKINGS

- The travel agency must obtain at least three comparable quotations from different hotels and guest houses. However, if
 obtaining three quotations is impractical due to unavailability or any other exceptional case, a single quotation will be accepted.
 Safety must be taken into consideration.
- 2) The travel agency must forward their quotation to the municipality's representative who will make the final selection and inform the travel agency within a reasonable time. Emergency logistical arrangements must also be considered. Final details will be included in the SLA.
- 3) The accommodation must be arranged nearest to the venue at which the event takes place.
- 4) The municipality may also require the travel agent to make bookings at hotels specifically chosen by the municipality in instances where travel time and cost is to be minimized.
- 5) The travel agency must separately indicate its service/ booking fees on each quotation.
- 6) Proof of payment to be submitted to the municipality after request has been actioned, before officials depart.
- 7) Parking must be included in bookings where applicable.
- 8) The travel agency is required to be available for all bookings and cancellation of accommodation. An emergency telephone number must be provided for in cases of emergency.

4 MEALS

All meal arrangements will be provided as and when required by Siyancuma Municipality.

Although the municipality will endeavour to utilize the travel agent for most of its bookings, the municipality reserves the right to, in exceptional cases make bookings directly with suppliers.

NB!!! The appointed service provider must comply with MFMA Cost Containment Regulations, 2023 and must adhere to the municipality's Travel & Subsistence Policy.

1. Definitions

- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the provider, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the provider under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied.
