A. BID DOCUMENTS

Rules for Bidding

- JCT is not bound to accept any of the proposals submitted and reserves the right to call for presentations from short-listed bidders before final selection.
- JCT reserves the right to terminate this appointment or temporarily defer the work, or any part thereof, at any stage of completion should JCT decide not to proceed with the bid.
- JCT also reserves the right to appoint any other person to undertake any part of the tasks.
- The service provider must be a single legal entity with all other necessary expertise secured. JCT will enter into a single contract with a single entity for the delivery of the work set out in these bid documents.
- The bidding entity shall be the same entity that will execute the bid. Any bid found to be fronting for another entity or entities shall be disqualified immediately.
- The service provider and its affiliates are disqualified from providing goods, works and services to any private party to this Agreement, or any eventual project that may result, directly or indirectly from these services.
- JCT reserves the right to return late bid submission unopened.
- Should the contract between JCT and the service provider be terminated by either party due to reasons not attributable to the service provider, the service provider will be remunerated for the appropriate portion of work completed up to a maximum amount of not more than the total fee bid by the service provider for the appropriate phase of the project during which the appointment was terminated.
- Bids must be submitted with all official Bid Forms that are contained within this tender document and duly completed.

- All prices shall be quoted in South African currency and be **VAT inclusive.**

Grounds for Disqualification

Joburg City Theatres reserves the right to disqualify any bidder which does any one or more of the following, and such disqualification may take place without prior notice to the offending bidder, however the bidder shall be notified in writing of such disqualification:

1. Bidders who do not submit a **valid Tax PIN** issued by **SARS**, on the closing date and time of the bid.

2. bidders who submitted *incomplete information and documentation* according to the requirements of this Bid
3. bidders who submitted *information that is fraudulent, factually untrue or inaccurate*, for example memberships that do not exist, BEE credentials, experience, etc.;
4. bidders who received information not available to other vendors through fraudulent means; and/or
5. Bidders are reminded that *all alterations in the bid document must be signed in full* by the bidder's authorised signatory and an accompanying letter on the bidder's official letterhead must be provided indicating such alterations.
6. This bid, correctly endorsed is to be addressed to Joburg City Theatres and must be deposited into the tender box at the time and date shown herein. Under no circumstances will late tenders be accepted.
7. The bid document is to be completed in **black ink pen** and in full. It is not to be retyped at all.
8. The bid document is to be *submitted in full in the same order as issued* with all sections attached.
9. Proposal that do not meet Joburg City Theatres' requirements shall be considered as unsuitable and non-responsive and shall be rejected.
10. Bidders are required to *cost for all the items as required*. If not, the proposal will be rejected as non-responsive.

Notice to Bidders

The costs of preparing the proposal, negotiation and any other engagement pursuant to this bid shall be for the sole account of the bidder and shall not be reimbursed by Joburg City Theatres under any circumstances.

Joburg City Theatres reserves the right to amend, modify or withdraw the BID in part or *in total* including terminating any associated proceedings at any time, without prior notice to the bidders and without liability to compensate or reimburse any person in relation thereto.

Joburg City Theatres' reserves the right to accept or reject any of the proposals submitted; and shall be under no obligation or bound to do so.

Joburg City Theatres reserves the right to adopt any submission by any Bidder(s) and to include information therein into other procurement documentation of Joburg City Theatres without compensation to the authors of such information.

Amendment of Bid Documents

At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, JCT may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective bidder, modify the tender document by amendment.

All prospective bidders who have received the bid document will be notified of the amendment in writing and same will be binding on them.

In order to allow prospective bidders reasonable time in which to take the amendment(s) in account in preparing their bids, JCT at their discretion, may extend the deadline for the submission of bids.

B. PREPARATION OF BIDS

Language of Bid

The bid prepared by the Bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the bid exchanged by the Bidder and JCT shall be written in English.

Bid Price

- The Tenderer shall supply all the price information required in the price schedule, failure to do so shall invalidate the Tender.
- No claim for price escalation will be considered unless it is specifically stated that this Tender is subject to adjustment. Failure to complete this clause will result in the Tender prices being deemed to be firm.
- Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in JCT's Conditions of Tender, Memorandum of Agreement or the Price Schedule, any claim for an increase in the Tender prices herein quoted shall be submitted in writing.
- The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.
- The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of statement by the supplier.
- Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.
- All prices must include Value Added Tax.
- All tax invoices submitted by the Bidder must show the Value of the supply, the amount of tax charged and the consideration for the supply.
- All price(s) must be net with all discounts and settlement discount already deducted.
- Price(s) must include cost of supply, transport of personnel delivery and off-loading (if applicable).
- Price(s) must include cost of all labour, equipment, delivery of labour to site, materials etc. and without any extra or additional charges to Joburg City Theatres whatsoever.
- Any and all alterations to the bid price must be signed in full by the bid's authorized signatory and an accompanying letter from bidder on their official company letterhead will indicate such alterations. Failure to this will disqualify the bid

Period of Validity of Bids

- Bids shall remain valid for 120 days after the closing date of bid prescribed by JCT. A bid valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by JCT as non-responsive.
- In exceptional circumstances, JCT may solicit the Bidder's consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the response thereto shall be made in writing. A Bidder may refuse the request. A Bidder granting the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its bid.

Closing date of Bids

- JCT may, at its discretion, extend this deadline for submission of bids by amending the bid documents, in which case all rights and obligations of JCT and Bidders previously subject to the deadline will thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.

Late Bids

Any bid received by JCT after the deadline for submission of bids prescribed by JCT, will be rejected and/or returned unopened to the Bidder.

Modification and Withdrawal of Bids

- The Bidder may modify or withdraw its bid after the bid's submission, provided that written notice of the modification or withdrawal is received by JCT prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of bids.
- The Bidder's modification or withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked and dispatched in accordance with the provisions of clause 6. A withdrawal notice may also be sent by fax, followed by a signed confirmation copy, post marked not later than the deadline for submission of bids.
- No bid may be modified subsequent to the deadline for submission of bids.
- No bid may be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of bids and the expiration of period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the bid form.

Certified Copies/Commissioner of Oaths Certification

Where certified copies of documents are specifically required in the Bid Data or Returnable Documents, the bidder shall submit certified copies of such documents together with its bid submission.

Unless otherwise stated in the bid, all certified copies shall:

- Be certified by a Commissioner of Oaths;

- Be clear, legible and complete;
- Not be older than **three (3) months (90 days)** from the bid closing date.

Failure to submit certified copies where expressly required may render the bid **non-responsive** or result in the bidder being requested to clarify or submit the required documentation, where permitted in terms of the applicable procurement legislation, regulations and the Employer's Supply Chain Management Policy.

Note: The Employer reserves the right to verify the authenticity of all documents submitted and to request the originals for inspection at any stage of the procurement process. Any false declaration or fraudulent documentation may result in disqualification, cancellation of any award, and any other action permitted by law.

Improper Lobbying /Interference

Any prospective Bidder who is found to have lobbied an official or Councillor in respect of bid application including any other business with Joburg City Theatres will face the following charges:

- Immediate disqualification.
- Blacklisted against any bid in future.
- Company name will be given to all Local Authorities about the conduct.”

No relaxation, indulgence or waiver granted by Joburg City Theatres to the Bidder shall in any way operate as an estoppel against Joburg City Theatres in the exercise by it of its right hereunder.

Requirements to Submit Proposals

- All schedules in this document must be populated and will form part of the quotation
- A completed Joburg City Theatres supplier registration application form which is available for download from Joburg City Theatres’ website (www.joburgtheatreptyltd.co.za). Alternatively, if the supplier is registered on the JCT database, then the service provider need only submit all the mandatory documents with this application.
- The contractor will need to provide examples /references of similar such works performed.

C. BID OPENING AND EVALUATION OF BIDS

Opening of Bids

- The bidder’s names, bid modifications or withdrawals and such other details as JCT at its discretion may consider appropriate, will be announced at the opening. No bid shall be rejected at bid opening, except for late bids.
- Bids that are not opened and read out at bid opening shall not be considered further for

evaluation, irrespective of the circumstances.

Clarification of Bids

During evaluation of bids, JCT may, at its discretion, ask the Bidder for a clarification of its bid. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing.

Evaluation Criteria

Bidders will be evaluated based on the information as contained in their Submissions, and this may be further supplemented by presentations and clarification information as may be requested from the Bidders.

Evaluations will as far as possible be based on evaluation templates prepared by Joburg Theatre's evaluation committees prior to opening of Submissions. The criteria set out in the document shall be applicable and may not be altered after the Submissions have been opened unless it is clear that such alterations will not disadvantage any Bidder or give an unfair advantage.

Submissions will be evaluated and the Contract awarded in accordance with the SCM regulations, MFMA, Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act and the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022 and other applicable legislation, the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and if applicable, any other special conditions of contract.

The bid will be evaluated on the following stages:

- **Stage 1 – Administrative Requirements**
- **Stage 2- Functionality**
- **Stage 3 – Price and special goals**

D. AWARD OF CONTRACT

Period of Contract

The Contract shall be valid for a period of thirty-six (36) months from the date of appointment, subject to:

- satisfactory performance by the Contractor;
- continued compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract;
- annual performance reviews conducted by Joburg City Theatres (JCT); and
- the availability of approved budget.

The appointment of the successful Contractor shall not constitute a guarantee of any minimum value of work or quantity of goods during the Contract Period. Work shall be commissioned on an as-and-when-required basis through the issuance of official Purchase Orders.

The Contractor shall remain responsible for the completion of any Purchase Order or installation project issued before the expiry of the Contract Period, including all warranty, defects liability, and contractual obligations applicable to such work.

Any extension of the Contract Period shall be subject to the applicable legislative framework, the Employer's Supply Chain Management Policy, satisfactory contractor performance, and the prior written approval of Joburg City Theatres.

Acceptance of Bid

A valid and binding Contract and/or Service Level Agreement with the successful Bidder will be concluded immediately following the time that Joburg City Theatres emails / delivers a letter of acceptance of this bid to the Bidder.

Local Office

In order to be considered for an appointment in terms of this bid, bidders must have an office within the Johannesburg Municipality. The address of this local office must be indicated on the **SERVICE PROVIDERS INFORMATION** below and which will be regarded as the domiciliumcitandietexecutandi for the purpose of any contract or service level agreement arising from this bid submission.

Contract Amendments

No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

Enhancement in Rates

The tender rates shall be taken to be firm and the supplier shall not be entitled to any price variation or escalation.

Assignment

The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with JCT's prior written consent.

Delays in the Supplier's Performance

1. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by JCT in the contract.
2. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of

services, the supplier shall promptly notify JCT in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s).

3. As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, JCT shall evaluate the situation and may at its discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
4. No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or local authority.
5. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
6. Except as provided under GCC clause 3.25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall procure the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC clause 3.22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC clause 3.21.2 without the application of penalties.
7. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, JCT shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

Penalties

Subject to GCC clause 3.25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, JCT shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. JCT may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC clause 3.23.

Indemnity

- The Contractor agrees that the occupational use of JCT's premises and buildings shall be at his own risk, and that he acknowledges the risks and dangers inherent therein.
- The Contractor furthermore acknowledges that JCT and / or its employees shall not be liable or responsible for any loss, liability, damages, accident or injury, whether fatal or otherwise, of whatsoever nature and howsoever arising, whether directly from the permission granted by JCT to execute certain events or otherwise, including but not limited to, the use of the premises and / or buildings, and indemnifies JCT and/or its employees against all and any loss of / or damage to property, or injury or death, and any

claim for such loss, damage, injury or death, from any cause whatsoever and howsoever arising, which may be suffered in this regard.

- The Contractor and / or its officers, employees, agents, concessionaires, suppliers, Contractors or customers shall not have any claim of any nature against the JCT for any loss, damage, injury or death which any of them may directly or indirectly suffer (whether or not such loss, damage, injury or death is caused through negligence of JCT or its agents or employees) or for:
 - any latent or patent defect in the premises;
 - a fire on the premises;
 - a theft from the premises;
 - the Premises or any part thereof being in a defective condition or state of disrepair;
 - force majeure of *causus fortuitus* or any other cause either wholly or partly beyond the JCT's control;
 - the use of the services offered on the premises;
 - consequential loss howsoever caused;
 - any loss or damage whether to persons or property caused by riots, civil commotion, insurrection or actions taken by the Contractor or JCT to mitigate the effect of / or prevent the aforesaid; and any other cause whatsoever.
- Save for any willful acts or omission or gross negligence by JCT, its officers, employees, agents, concessionaires, suppliers and Contractors, the Contractor indemnifies JCT and holds it harmless from and against all claims, actions, damages, liability and expense in connection with loss of life, personal injury and / or damage to property arising from or out of any occurrence in, upon or at the premises or the occupancy or use by the Contractor of the premises.

Compliance with Legislature

- All successful Tenderers, Tendering on items where labour and/or equipment are included, shall enter into an agreement with JCT, indemnifying JCT from the provisions of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (85 of 1993).
- The Contractor is to ensure compliance with the provisions of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (85 of 1993) & all relevant regulations, inclusive of all its employees & other Contractors on the site. The Tenderer shall provide a suitable health and safety plan appropriate for the contract tendered for.
- The Contractor shall comply with all laws relating to wages and conditions generally governing the employment of labour.

Workmen's Compensation

The Tenderer shall, prior to commencement of any work on site in terms hereof, give written proof that he is registered as an employer in terms of Section 80 of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act, 130 of 1993 and the Tenderer shall remain registered as such for the duration of the contract awarded and shall pay all monies due to the Compensations Fund in terms of Section 15 of Act 130 of 1993. Failure to comply will result in the Tenderer being disqualified.

1) Background

Joburg Theatre (SOC) Ltd trading as Joburg City Theatres (JCT), an independent municipal entity wholly owned by the City of Johannesburg Metropolitan Municipality (“COJ”), operates in order to provide world class theatre entertainment to the citizens of Johannesburg. The company continuously strives towards transformation from both within its core employment, procurement and governance practices; and also its productions and audience inclusiveness.

With effect from January 1st 2013 Joburg Theatre (SOC) Ltd and Roodepoort City Theatre NPC t/a Joburg Promusica were integrated into a single theatre management company (***Joburg City Theatres***), which also institutionalised the operation of the newly established Soweto Theatre.

Joburg City Theatres uphold its **vision** statement: *“We are the providers of the integrated management of world class African theatre venues and a high quality, entertaining, innovative and inclusive programme which serves the diverse communities of the City of Joburg.”*

To succeed, significant increased operational efficiency is critical. That means Joburg City Theatres must be cost efficient. Operational efficiency is important not only to cost saving, but also to attracting and retaining theatre audiences, as the organization strives to become responsive to customers’ needs and the market’s demands.

2) General Requirements Overview of responsibilities of the service provider’s

Joburg City Theatres (JCT) hereby invites proposals from all prospective service providers to propose a cost-effective solution for below mentioned.

Service Providers are required to respond to this bid demonstrating that their proposed approach and solutions are a probable fit to JCT's requirements and are required to complete all categories as stipulated within this document. All information contained in this bid or given by management or staff of JCT is solely for the purpose of providing Service Providers with relevant information with which to complete and submit their proposals.

The appointed service provider will be monitored on the following basis: **Timeliness of service delivery; Quality of the service provided; Provision of services in compliance with clearly stated specifications;**

3) Scope Of Work

Joburg City Theatres (JCT) requires the appointment of a suitably qualified and experienced service provider for the supply and delivery of staff uniforms on an as-and-when-required basis for a period of thirty-six (36) months.

The successful bidder will be responsible for the manufacture, supply, branding (where applicable), sizing, fitting, delivery and replacement of uniforms for employees across all JCT sites.

4) Objectives

The objectives of this bid are to:

- Provide quality uniforms that promote a professional corporate image.
- Ensure employees are supplied with compliant PPE.
- Standardise uniforms across the organisation.
- Ensure timely replacement of worn or damaged uniforms.
- Obtain value for money through a competitive procurement process.

5) Technical Specifications

General Requirements (Applicable to All Uniform Items)

5.1 General Technical Requirements

All uniforms supplied under this Contract shall:

- Be manufactured from first-quality materials free from defects.
- Be suitable for daily occupational use and capable of withstanding normal industrial laundering.

- Be supplied in a full range of sizes, including petite, standard, tall and plus sizes where applicable.

- Maintain individual staff measurements.
- Replace incorrectly sized garments at no additional cost.
- Cater for petite, standard and plus-size employees.
- Cater for maternity wear where required.
- Supply garments in South African standard sizes unless otherwise requested

8) Composition of Uniforms

Local Production and Content Requirements

- Only **locally produced textile products** will be considered for this tender.
- In accordance with the applicable **Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022**, the stipulated minimum threshold for **local production and local content** for textile, clothing, leather, and footwear products is **100%**.

- For tender evaluation purposes, a **basket of commonly used goods and services** has been identified based on the current contract requirements.
- Bidders are required to submit pricing for the specified basket of goods and provide a **comprehensive product catalogue** covering all uniform and PPE items offered.
- Only bids that meet the prescribed minimum threshold for local production and content will proceed to the next stage of evaluation, which will include:
 - Functionality assessment; and
 - Evaluation in terms of the **80/20 Preference Point System** as prescribed in the **Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022**.

9) Samples

Joburg City Theatres (JCT) reserves the right to request product samples from shortlisted bidders as part of the technical evaluation process to verify compliance with the specifications contained in this bid document.

Samples shall be evaluated to determine whether the proposed products meet the minimum quality, functionality and performance requirements specified by JCT.

9.1 Sample Evaluation Criteria

Samples may be assessed against, but not limited to, the following criteria:

- Fabric quality, composition and weight (GSM), where applicable.
- Stitching quality, seam strength and overall workmanship.
- Colour consistency and colour fastness.
- Branding quality, including embroidery, printing or heat transfer (where applicable).
- Fit, sizing accuracy and garment finish.
- Comfort, functionality and suitability for the intended working environment.
- Durability and construction quality.
- Compliance with the technical specifications and applicable SANS, ISO, EN, ANSI or equivalent standards.
- Quality of trims, zippers, buttons, fasteners and other accessories.
- Overall appearance, professional finish and presentation.

9.2 Submission of Samples

The following conditions shall apply:

- Only shortlisted bidders may be requested to submit product samples.

- JCT's Supply Chain Management (SCM) Unit will notify shortlisted bidders in writing of the sample requirements, including the items required, quantities, submission date, time and delivery location.
- Samples shall be submitted at the bidder's own cost and risk.
- All samples submitted shall be representative of the products that will be supplied for the duration of the contract and shall comply fully with the tender specifications.
- Samples shall be clearly labelled with the bidder's name, tender number, item description, product code (where applicable), size and colour.
- Packaging, branding and labelling shall reflect the standard that will be maintained throughout the contract period.

9.3 Evaluation of Samples

JCT reserves the right to:

- Conduct visual inspections of all submitted samples.
- Perform practical assessments or product testing where considered necessary.
- Request additional supporting documentation, including technical data sheets, compliance certificates or laboratory test reports.
- Verify compliance with applicable quality, safety and local content requirements.
- Compare submitted samples with the technical specifications and approved product catalogue.

Where necessary, JCT may request independent laboratory testing to verify product compliance. Any such testing shall be conducted in accordance with recognised industry standards.

9.4 Non-Compliance

Failure to comply with any sample request may result in the bid being declared non-responsive. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Failure to submit samples within the stipulated timeframe.
- Submission of incomplete or incorrect samples.
- Samples that do not comply with the technical specifications.
- Samples that differ materially from the products proposed in the bidder's submission.
- Failure to provide supporting documentation requested by JCT.

9.5 Retention of Samples

JCT reserves the right to retain compliant samples submitted by the successful bidder for the duration of the contract.

Retained samples may be used as reference standards for quality assurance, inspection and acceptance of future deliveries.

Samples submitted by unsuccessful bidders may be collected by the respective bidders within thirty (30) calendar days after the award of the contract. Samples not collected within this period may be disposed of by JCT without further notice.

9.6 Important Notes

- Samples shall not be submitted together with the tender submission unless specifically requested by JCT.
- Requests for samples may be issued at any stage of the evaluation process where considered necessary to verify compliance with the tender specifications.
- The submission of samples upon request is mandatory and forms an integral part of the technical evaluation process.
- The cost of preparing, transporting and submitting samples shall be borne entirely by the bidder.
- Submission of compliant samples does not, on its own, guarantee the award of the contract.

10) Product Catalogue Requirements

Bidders shall submit a comprehensive product catalogue as part of their tender submission. The catalogue shall provide sufficient technical information to enable Joburg City Theatres (JCT) to evaluate the products offered against the minimum technical specifications contained in this bid document.

The catalogue shall, as a minimum, include the following information for each product offered:

- Product photographs or illustrations.
- Product descriptions and technical specifications.
- Fabric composition and material specifications.
- Fabric weight (GSM), where applicable.
- Available colours.
- Available sizes and comprehensive size charts.
- Product dimensions, where applicable.
- Technical data sheets.
- Manufacturer's product brochures or specification sheets.
- Applicable compliance certificates and product certifications (e.g. SANS, ISO, EN, ANSI or equivalent standards).
- Warranty information.
- Care and washing instructions for garments.
- Details of branding options, including embroidery, screen printing or heat transfer, where applicable.

- Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS/SDS) for products where required by legislation or where hazardous substances are contained or used.
- Country of origin and confirmation of compliance with the prescribed local production and local content requirements.

Where alternative products are offered, bidders shall clearly indicate the equivalent product specifications and demonstrate compliance with the minimum requirements contained in this bid document.

The catalogue submitted shall accurately represent the products that will be supplied throughout the duration of the contract. JCT reserves the right to verify the information contained in the catalogue against submitted samples, manufacturer's specifications and delivered products.

NB: The product catalogue forms an integral part of the technical evaluation. Failure to submit a comprehensive catalogue containing the required information may result in the bidder scoring lower during the functionality evaluation or, where the omission affects compliance with mandatory technical requirements, the bid being declared non-responsive.

11) Quality Requirements and Quality Assurance

11.1 Quality Requirements

All uniforms and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) supplied under this Contract shall:

- Be new, unused, and free from defects in material and workmanship.
- Comply with all applicable South African National Standards (SANS), Occupational Health and Safety Act, 85 of 1993, and any other relevant legislation and industry standards applicable to the products supplied.
- Be manufactured using high-quality materials suitable for their intended purpose and capable of withstanding normal working conditions.
- Be accompanied by the manufacturer's warranty, where applicable.
- Be clearly and permanently labelled with the product description, size, manufacturer's details, fabric composition, care instructions, batch number (where applicable), and any applicable safety certification.
- Be supplied in the correct sizes, colours, styles, and specifications as ordered by Joburg City Theatres (JCT).
- Be free from manufacturing defects including, but not limited to, faulty stitching, fabric flaws, broken zippers, defective fasteners, colour inconsistencies, loose threads, and poor finishing.
- Be delivered in suitable protective packaging to prevent damage during transportation and storage.

11.2 Fabric and Garment Quality Standards

Unless otherwise specified, all textile products shall meet the following minimum quality requirements:

- Excellent colour fastness to washing, rubbing, perspiration, and sunlight.
- Controlled fabric shrinkage within acceptable industry tolerances after washing.
- Consistent fabric weight (GSM) in accordance with the specified product requirements.
- Uniform colour consistency across all production batches.
- High seam strength and reinforced stitching at stress points.
- Appropriate stitch density to ensure durability and professional appearance.
- Fabric free from excessive pilling, snagging, distortion, or fading under normal usage.
- UV-resistant fabrics where garments are intended for prolonged outdoor use.
- Breathable and comfortable fabrics suitable for the intended working environment.

11.3 PPE Quality Requirements

All Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) supplied under this Contract shall:

- Comply with the applicable SANS, ISO, EN, ANSI or other recognised international standards specified in the technical specifications.
- Be fit for purpose and suitable for the identified workplace hazards.
- Bear the relevant certification and approval markings where applicable.
- Be supplied with original manufacturer's certification and certificates of conformity where applicable.
- Be accompanied by technical data sheets and user instructions.
- Be supplied with maintenance and storage instructions where applicable.
- Be fully traceable to the manufacturer through batch numbers, serial numbers or product identification markings where applicable.
- Have an adequate shelf life and clearly marked expiry dates for consumable items where relevant.
- Be supplied in the manufacturer's original packaging unless otherwise approved by JCT.

11.4 Quality Assurance

The successful bidder shall implement and maintain an effective quality assurance system throughout the duration of the Contract.

Quality assurance measures shall include, but not be limited to:

- Routine inspection of raw materials prior to manufacture.
- Fabric quality testing, including verification of composition, weight, durability and colour consistency.
- Inspection of garments during manufacturing to ensure compliance with approved specifications.
- Final inspection prior to packaging and dispatch.
- Verification that branding, embroidery and printing comply with JCT requirements.
- Quality inspections to ensure correct sizing, workmanship and finishing.
- Batch consistency to ensure all garments supplied under the Contract remain uniform in colour, fabric, construction and appearance.
- Traceability of production batches where applicable.

JCT reserves the right to:

- Conduct quality inspections at any stage of the manufacturing or delivery process.
- Request independent laboratory testing of fabrics or PPE to verify compliance with the specified standards.
- Inspect manufacturing facilities where considered necessary.
- Reject any goods that do not comply with the Contract specifications or quality standards.

11.5 Defective Goods

Should any goods supplied be found to be defective, damaged, incorrectly sized, incorrectly branded, or otherwise non-compliant with the Contract specifications, the successful bidder shall:

- Replace the defective goods at no additional cost to JCT.
- Collect and remove rejected goods from JCT premises.
- Deliver replacement goods within seven (7) working days, or within such period as agreed by JCT.
- Bear all costs associated with collection, transportation, replacement, and redelivery.

Repeated quality failures may constitute a material breach of contract and may result in the application of contractual remedies, including suspension of orders, performance penalties, or termination of the Contract.

11.6 Manufacturer's Warranty

Where applicable, the successful bidder shall provide manufacturer's warranties for all uniforms, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), and related products supplied under this Contract.

Unless otherwise specified, all products shall be covered by a minimum warranty period of twelve (12) months from the date of acceptance by Joburg City Theatres (JCT) against manufacturing defects and faulty workmanship.

The warranty shall, as a minimum, cover:

- Manufacturing defects.
- Faulty workmanship.
- Fabric defects.
- Defective stitching and seam failure.
- Colour fading or excessive colour loss under normal washing and usage conditions.
- Premature fabric deterioration or material failure under normal use.
- Faulty zippers, buttons, fasteners, press studs, buckles and other garment accessories.
- Defective branding, embroidery or screen printing resulting from poor workmanship.
- Delamination, cracking or peeling of reflective materials where applicable.

Where any product fails to meet the required quality standards during the warranty period due to a manufacturing or workmanship defect, the successful bidder shall, at no additional cost to JCT:

- Replace the defective item with a new item that complies fully with the Contract specifications.
- Collect the defective item from the designated JCT site.
- Deliver the replacement item within five (5) working days of notification, unless otherwise agreed in writing by JCT.
- Bear all costs associated with collection, transportation, replacement and redelivery.

The warranty shall not limit any other rights or remedies available to JCT under the Contract or applicable South African law.

Failure to honour warranty obligations or repeated warranty claims resulting from poor product quality may constitute a material breach of contract and may result in the application of contractual remedies, including performance management measures, suspension of orders or termination of the Contract.

12) Contract Period

The Employer intends to appoint **one (1) suitably qualified and experienced service provider** to undertake the Supply and delivery of staff uniforms for Joburg City Theatres.

The Contract shall be valid for a period of **thirty-six (36) months** from the date of appointment, subject to:

- satisfactory performance by the Contractor;
- continued compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract;
- annual performance reviews conducted by Joburg City Theatres (JCT); and
- the availability of approved budget.

The appointment of the successful Contractor shall **not constitute a guarantee of any minimum value of work or quantity of goods** during the Contract Period. Work shall be commissioned on an **as-and-when-required basis** through the issuance of official Purchase Orders.

The Contractor shall remain responsible for the completion of any Purchase Order or installation project issued before the expiry of the Contract Period, including all warranty, defects liability, and contractual obligations applicable to such work.

Any extension of the Contract Period shall be subject to the applicable legislative framework, the Employer's Supply Chain Management Policy, satisfactory contractor performance, and the prior written approval of Joburg City Theatres.

13) Delivery Requirements

The successful bidder shall ensure the timely supply and delivery of all uniforms and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in accordance with the requirements of Joburg City Theatres (JCT).

The successful bidder shall maintain an effective Quality Management System throughout the duration of the Contract. JCT reserves the right to request evidence of the bidder's quality management procedures, including ISO 9001 certification or an equivalent documented quality management system, where applicable.

13.1 General Delivery Requirements

The supplier shall:

- Deliver all goods to the designated JCT site(s) as specified in the official Purchase Order.
- Deliver only new, unused, defect-free products that fully comply with the Contract specifications.
- Ensure that all items are properly packaged, labelled and protected against damage during transportation.
- Include all delivery, packaging, handling, off-loading and transportation costs in the tendered prices.

- Coordinate deliveries with the designated JCT representative and comply with JCT's receiving procedures and delivery hours.
- Obtain proof of delivery signed by an authorised JCT representative for every delivery.
- Immediately notify JCT in writing of any anticipated delivery delays, stating the reasons for the delay and the proposed revised delivery date.

13.2 Delivery Lead Times

The successful bidder shall adhere to the following maximum delivery periods unless otherwise agreed in writing by JCT.

Where operational requirements necessitate urgent deliveries, the supplier shall make every reasonable effort to accommodate JCT's requirements without compromising product quality.

13.3 PPE Quality Requirements

All Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) supplied under this Contract shall:

- Comply with the applicable SANS, ISO, EN, ANSI or other recognised international standards specified in the technical specifications.
- Be fit for purpose and suitable for the identified workplace hazards.
- Bear the relevant certification and approval markings where applicable.
- Be supplied with original manufacturer's certification and certificates of conformity where applicable.
- Be accompanied by technical data sheets and user instructions.
- Be supplied with maintenance and storage instructions where applicable.

- Be fully traceable to the manufacturer through batch numbers, serial numbers or product identification markings where applicable.
- Have an adequate shelf life and clearly marked expiry dates for consumable items where relevant.
- Be supplied in the manufacturer's original packaging unless otherwise approved by JCT.

13.4 Inspection Upon Delivery

JCT reserves the right to inspect all goods upon delivery to verify:

- Quantity supplied;
- Product specifications;
- Sizes and colours;
- Branding requirements;
- Workmanship and finishing;
- Compliance with applicable standards; and
- Overall product quality.

Acceptance of a delivery by JCT shall not constitute acceptance of latent defects or relieve the supplier of its obligations under this Contract.

JCT reserves the right to conduct supplier quality audits, manufacturing facility inspections and product verification exercises at any reasonable time during the contract period to ensure continued compliance with the Contract requirements.

13.4.1 Continuous Improvement

The successful bidder shall implement appropriate corrective and preventive actions where quality deficiencies are identified. Where requested by JCT, the bidder shall submit a corrective action plan detailing the root cause of the non-conformance, the corrective measures implemented and the timeframe for resolution.

13.5 Incorrect, Damaged or Defective Goods

Where goods are found to be defective, damaged, incorrectly branded, incorrectly sized or otherwise non-compliant with the Contract specifications, the supplier shall:

- Collect the rejected goods at its own cost;
- Replace the affected goods within five (5) working days of notification;

- Bear all costs associated with collection, replacement and redelivery; and
- Ensure that replacement items are identical to the approved specifications.

13.6 Delivery Performance

The successful bidder shall maintain a minimum on-time delivery performance of 95% throughout the contract period. JCT may monitor the supplier's delivery performance through regular contract reviews and may request corrective action where service levels are not achieved.

Repeated failure to meet the agreed delivery timeframes may constitute a material breach of contract and may result in the application of contractual remedies, including performance management measures, recovery of damages, suspension of orders or termination of the Contract.

14) Occupational Health & Safety

Require compliance with:

- Occupational Health and Safety Act
- SANS standards
- ISO standards
- PPE Regulations

15) Insurance

15.1 General

The successful bidder shall, at its own expense, obtain and maintain all insurance policies required by applicable South African legislation and any additional insurance necessary to adequately cover the risks associated with the supply, handling, transportation and delivery of uniforms and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) under this Contract.

The required insurance shall remain valid for the full duration of the Contract.

Where the successful bidder appoints subcontractors, the bidder shall ensure that such subcontractors maintain equivalent insurance cover appropriate to the services they perform.

The successful bidder shall, upon request by Joburg City Theatres (JCT), provide documentary proof that the required insurance policies are valid and remain in force throughout the contract period.

15.2 Minimum Insurance Requirements

Without limiting the bidder's obligations under the Contract, the successful bidder shall maintain, where applicable, the following minimum insurance cover:

- Public Liability Insurance sufficient to cover claims arising from injury to persons or damage to property resulting from the bidder's operations.
- Goods-in-Transit Insurance covering loss of or damage to uniforms, PPE and related goods during transportation and delivery until acceptance by JCT.
- Employers' Liability Insurance and/or Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases (COIDA) cover for all employees engaged in the execution of the Contract, as required by law.
- Motor Vehicle Insurance for all vehicles used in the performance of the Contract.
- Any other insurance required by applicable legislation or reasonably necessary to protect both the bidder and JCT against risks associated with the Contract.

15.3 Claims and Liability

The successful bidder shall be solely responsible for any loss of, or damage to, goods prior to acceptance by JCT and shall promptly replace any lost, stolen or damaged goods at its own cost.

The maintenance of insurance shall not limit or reduce the successful bidder's contractual responsibilities or liabilities under this Contract.

15.4 Evidence of Insurance

JCT reserves the right, at any time during the contract period, to request copies of insurance certificates, proof of premium payments, or any other documentation confirming that the required insurance cover remains valid and in force.

Failure to maintain the required insurance or to provide satisfactory evidence thereof may constitute a material breach of contract.

15.5 Limitation of Liability

Neither Party shall be liable to the other for any indirect, consequential or special damages, including but not limited to loss of profit, loss of revenue, loss of business opportunity or anticipated savings, except where such liability cannot be excluded in terms of applicable South African law or where such damages arise from fraud, gross negligence or wilful misconduct.

16) Co-Ordination

The Contractor shall coordinate all activities necessary for the proper execution of the Works, including coordination with the Employer, the Employer's Representative, other contractors,

utility service providers and relevant authorities.

The Contractor shall plan and execute the Works in a manner that minimises disruption to the Employer's operations and ensures that all work is carried out efficiently and safely.

The Employer shall not be liable for any delay, disruption, additional costs or financial losses arising from the Contractor's failure to properly coordinate its activities, resources, subcontractors or suppliers.

The Contractor shall immediately notify the Employer in writing of any matter that may affect the progress or coordination of the Works.

17) Product Delivery Requirements

The Contractor shall ensure that all goods, materials and equipment supplied under this Contract are delivered in accordance with the Contract requirements.

The Contractor shall:

- a. Bear all costs associated with packaging, handling, transportation, off-loading and delivery. These costs shall be deemed to be included in the Contract Price.
- b. Familiarise itself with the delivery locations, receiving procedures and receiving hours applicable to each Joburg City Theatres (JCT) site before delivery.
- c. Ensure that deliveries are made only during the Employer's approved receiving hours unless otherwise authorised in writing.
- d. Deliver all goods within the turnaround times specified in the Contract or Purchase Order.
- e. Where delivery within the required period is not possible, immediately notify the Employer in writing, stating the reasons for the delay and the proposed revised delivery date. No extension shall be valid unless approved in writing by the Employer.
- f. Ensure that all goods are properly packaged, labelled, protected and transported in accordance with applicable legislation, manufacturer's recommendations and industry best practice.
- g. Replace, at its own cost, any goods damaged during transportation, handling or delivery.
- h. Deliver only new, unused and defect-free goods unless otherwise specified.

Repeated failure to comply with delivery requirements may constitute a material breach of contract and may result in the Employer exercising any contractual remedies available, including rejection of deliveries, recovery of damages or termination of the Contract.

- Request clarification of the tender documents, if necessary, by notifying the JCT at least five (5) working days before the closing date stated in the tender data.

19) Conditions and Evaluation of Bids

Responses will be evaluated using a predefined set of evaluation criteria. The evaluation criteria are designed to reflect JCT requirements in terms of identifying a suitable service provider and to ensure the selection process is transparent and afford all bidders a fair opportunity for evaluation and selection.

The following conditions of tender apply for this assignment: The bid will be evaluated on a three-stage process.

STAGE 1 – ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

Bids that do not meet any one of the following criteria (valid proof/certification must be provided if required) will be disqualified and will not be evaluated further:

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General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
 - 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
 - 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
 - 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
 - 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
 - 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
 - 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
 - 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
 - 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
 - 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the goods are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
 - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad markets its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.

- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the goods covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price, which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the

supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.

- 1.25 "Supplier" means the successful bidder who is awarded the contract to maintain and administer the required and specified service(s) to the State.
- 1.26 "Tort" means in breach of contract.
- 1.27 "Turnkey" means a procurement process where one service provider assumes total responsibility for all aspects of the project and delivers the full end product / service required by the contract.
- 1.28 "Written" or "in writing" means hand-written in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services (excluding professional services related to the building and construction industry), sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific goods, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 Invitations to bid are usually published in locally distributed news media and on the municipality/municipal entity website.

4. Standards

- 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information inspection

- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall

extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent Rights

- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 6.2 When a supplier developed documentation / projects for the municipality / municipal entity, the intellectual, copy and patent rights or ownership of such documents or projects will vest in the municipality / municipal entity.

7. Performance security

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque.
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that goods to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage be subject to inspections, tests and analyses, the bidder or contractor's premises shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the purchaser or organization acting on behalf of the purchaser.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the goods to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the goods or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such goods or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Goods and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract goods may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected goods shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with goods, which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected goods shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute goods forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected goods, purchase such goods as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 22 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size

weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1 Delivery of the goods and arrangements for shipping and clearance obligations, shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract.

11. Insurance

- 11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified.

12. Transportation

- 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

13. Incidental Services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any:
- (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
 - (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- 14.1 As specified, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and;
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.

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16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.

16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Variation orders

18.1 In cases where the estimated value of the envisaged changes in purchase does not vary more than 15% of the total value of the original contract, the contractor may be instructed to deliver the goods or render the services as such. In cases of measurable quantities, the contractor may be approached to reduce the unit price, and such offers may be accepted provided that there is no escalation in price.

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.

21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

21.3 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the goods are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

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- 21.4 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 22.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.5 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a goods contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase goods of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

- 22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
 - (b) if the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgement of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner, as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

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- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the supplier as having no objection and proceed with the restriction.
- 23.5 . Any restriction imposed on any person by the purchaser will, at the discretion of the purchaser, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the purchaser actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
- (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

- 23.7 . If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the supplier to the purchaser or the purchaser may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the supplier in regard to goods or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

25. Force Majeure

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier for goods delivered and / or services rendered according to the prescripts of the contract.

28. Limitation of Liability

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

- (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
- (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

31. Notices

31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.

31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

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- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid SARS must have certified that the tax matters of the preferred bidder are in order.
- 32.4 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose municipal rates and taxes and municipal services charges are in arrears.

33. Transfer of contracts

- 33.1 The contractor shall not abandon, transfer, cede assign or sublet a contract or part thereof without the written permission of the purchaser

34. Amendment of contracts

- 34.1 No agreement to amend or vary a contract or order or the conditions, stipulations or provisions thereof shall be valid and of any force unless such agreement to amend or vary is entered into in writing and signed by the contracting parties. Any waiver of the requirement that the agreement to amend or vary shall be in writing, shall also be in writing.
