This it seeks to achieve through the development and operation of the 9 003 hectare Coega Special Economic Zone (SEZ), a transhipment hub and a leading investment destination in Africa, providing highly skilled competence and capacity for the execution of quality complex infrastructure and related projects throughout South Africa and selected markets on the African continent, and advisory on the development of industrialization and logistics zones. The CDC's advanced capabilities are successful enablers in economic zone development and management, real assets management, infrastructure planning and development for National, Provincial, Local Government Departments and State-owned Entities, technology integration while realising related socio-economic impact areas such as skills and SMME development. The foundational culture of the CDC's approach, backed by core values, is innovation and continuous improvement.

The CDC has been appointed by the Department of Education (DoE), KwaZulu-Natal Province to assist with rolling out Infrastructure projects for the KwaZulu-Natal School Building Programme.

INVITATION TO TENDER AND SCOPE OF WORKS

The CDC is inviting capable and competent Contractors with an active CIDB grading of 8GB or higher, for upgrades and additions at Amatikwe Primary School, in Inanda, Ethekwini Metro, KwaZulu-Natal. Emerging contractor with a CIDB Grading of 7GB PE CIDB are not eligible to bid.

The project scope includes the construction of new: 2 x Multipurpose classrooms, 1 x computer lab, 1 x media centre, 1 x SNP kitchen, 11 classrooms, 1 x Grade R Block comprising of 3 classrooms and ablutions, 1 x administration block, 1 x team teaching space, 1 x guardhouse, 1 x refuse and recycling area, HOD and counselling rooms, ablutions, storerooms and external works including but not limited to fencing, water storage tanks, retaining walls and civils works.

Decanting facilities in the form of mobile, demountable container classrooms for purchase to be provided complete with lighting, electrical plug points, blackboard, pin boards, *NB* administration block to be provided with burglar bars, alarm system and air conditioner. Renovations to existing 4 separate blocks to accommodate 7 classrooms. Demolition of 1 x Guard House, 1 x 5 classroom block and kitchen, 1 x Team teaching block, 1 x Admin block, 1 x 5 classroom block, 5 x ablution blocks and external works including but not limited to 1x tennis court, parking, fence, septic tank, aprons walkways, tank stands and removal of trees.

Reference is to be made to the tender drawings for more details.

The contract period shall be 18 (Eighteen) calendar months from date of handover of site, including annual builders' holidays.

CONDITIONS

- (a) Bidders shall be registered with the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) and should have a minimum active CIDB Contractor grading of 8 GB or higher potential emerging contractors with 7GB PE CIDB grading are not eligible to make submissions and will not be considered.
- (b) The following legislation shall apply:

- The CDC Procurement Policy shall apply the 90/10 preference point system, as per the Preferential Policy Framework Act 2000: Preferential Procurement Regulation 2022. The allocation of preference points will apply as follows: 90,
 - Specific Goals (B-BBEE Status Level of Contributor)
- (d) Bidders and all its Consortium/Joint Venture (JV) members, if any, must confirm their company registration with Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) (formerly CIPRO) as CDC will not award any bid to any business that appears on the CIPC List of de-registered businesses.
- All Bidders must be Value Added Tax (VAT) Vendors and the Form of Offer must include VAT. (e)
- Bidders (all the members in the Bidding Team in the case of Consortia or Joint Ventures) must provide proof of registration (f) on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) or provide a Treasury CSD registration number e.g. MAAAO
- The CDC will only award the Bid to a Successful Bidder who is tax compliant. The tax compliant status of the Bidders (and (g) all the members in the Bidding Team in the case of Consortia or Joint Ventures) will be verified through the CSD and South African Revenue Services (SARS) website.
- (h) As per amended construction codes, companies with less than 51% black shareholding (QSEs & Generics) are to submit a valid SANAS Accredited B-BBEE Verification Certificate (with the full applicable B-BBEE elements) USE with at least 51% or 100% black shareholding and EMEs with an annual turnover of R 3 million are required to submit a B-BBEE verification certificate from a SANAS accredited verification agency as they have to comply with the 30% sub-minimum requirement on the QSE Skills Scorecard to avoid being discounted a level. EMEs with a turnover of less than R 3 million are exempt from complying with the subminimum requirement and may submit an affidavit or a certificate issued by CIPC, confirming their ownership and annual turnover.
- In case of a Joint Venture (JV)/Consortium, a consolidated B-BBEE certificate would be required, and it must be (i) accompanied by individual B-BBEE Certificates/affidavits of their entities to confirm the type of enterprise.
- (j) Bidders must complete and sign the POPI Act form. In case of Joint Venture/Consortium, a separate form in respect of each party to the JV must be completed.
- Bidders will be evaluated on functionality and are expected to meet the minimum of 65 points threshold in order to be (k) evaluated further. The evaluation criteria for measuring functionality and weight of each criterion is provided in the document.
- CDC will not award more than two active projects to one bidder, unless one project has reached 80% completion stage (1) and beyond. Capacity assessment may be conducted in an event that the recommended bidder is the only responsive service provider and has already been awarded two contracts.
- Public servants are prohibited from conducting any form of business with organs of state, whether in their own capacity (m) as individuals or through companies in which they are directors. Verification will be done, and bidders will be disqualified should they be found to be in contravention with the regulations. A letter of confirmation must be provided with this bid document should a bidder have been granted permission by National Treasury to conduct business with an organ of state: and (n) The successful bidder will be required to comply with the Occupational Health and Safety Act and Regulations, Act (85
- of 1993); Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Disease Act, Act (130 of 1993) and Disaster Management Act, Act (57 of 2002) and, all relevant legislations throughout the duration of the contract. Upon appointment of the successful bidder, the service provider will be required to develop Occupational Health, Safety and Environmental Management Systems in compliance to the CDC Norms and Standards.
- Upon award the successful bidder will be required to provide valid proof of registered Construction Health and Safety (0) Officer or Construction Health and Safety Manager (CHSO/CHSM) with SACPCMP within the prescribed period. No candidate registration will be accepted. The CHSO/CHSM must have proven record of years of experience as follows: CIDB Grading 8 = > 5 years.
- This project is a Construction Industry Development Board's Contract Skills Development Goal (CSDG) programme, and (p) the successful Bidder will be required to fulfil the set targets.
- No telephonic or any other form of communication with any other CDC member of staff, other Procurement representative, (q) relating to this request for tender will be permitted.
