- Unless otherwise stated in the Conditions of Tender, a contract will be concluded with the tenderer who scores the highest number of tender adjudication points.
- The City of Cape Town intends to appoint one main tenderer and one alternative tenderer to provide all the required services under this contract.
- The alternative tenderer shall be utilised when the main tenderer defaults, refuses or is unable to do the work due to capacity or other constraints during the contract period.
- The alternative tenderer will be notified by the City of Cape Town representative to commence with services in terms of the specification and conditions of tender and contract. Should this happen, the alternative tenderer will be given a notice period of one month to commence work.

Q: Item 1.13 of the pricing schedule indicates that the size in square meters of the substation is greater than 600 m² but up until what size square meter is the biggest substation. A: Please refer to the notice 1 published.</p> <p>3. Q: Will the tenderer staff be authorized to work on substations and overhead lines? A: The tenderer staff shall have a responsible person authorized in terms of NRS 040-3:2007 as per clause 5.1.1.7 of the specification. The authorized responsible staff will be responsible for accepting permits and supervising staff on site.</p> <p>4. Q: What safety precautions does the tender allow when working in dangerous areas? A: The tender makes provision for the tenderer to use security services and a reactive team onsite when working in areas that are prone to crime as per clause 18 of the specification. The use of security is subject to approval by the City of Cape Town representative.</p> <p>5. Q: Does this tender require tenderers to have vehicles to execute work? A: The tenderer is required to have vehicles as per clause 5.1.1.12 of the specification. Tenderers are also required to have tools and equipment as per clause 4 of the specification.</p>
