

- 1.4. The City of Cape Town is divided into three Distribution Areas (East, North, and South), each containing four Districts as outlined in table 1 of addendum A of the specification, including Eskom-supplied areas within the boundaries of these Distribution Areas as specified in table 2 of the same addendum.
- 1.5. The City distribution network includes different type of substations such as mini substations, primary substations, secondary substations, protected and unprotected substations and they are grouped in the following sizes:
- 0 to 200m² – Small substation
 - More than 200m² and up to 600m² – Medium substation
 - More than 600m² and up to 1000m² – Large substation
- The sizes excludes the substation building or any physical structure. Substations with size more than 1000m² (excluding substation building or any physical structure) shall be compensated using item 1.1 and 1.2 of the pricing schedule. The estimate number of substations in each Distribution Area is outlined in addendum A table 3.
- 1.6. Electricity Generation and Distribution department facilities include the depots, office blocks, training centre etc. within the areas as per clause 1.4 of the specification.
- 1.7. Where necessary and with prior written approval of the Contract Manager, the contractor may be requested to clean substation and electricity facility grounds around street lighting networks in the Eskom supply areas where EG&D is responsible for public lighting maintenance.
- 1.8. The Contractor shall be required to provide security services due to some of the work to be carried out in areas which are subject to sporadic violence, the security services will be as and when required. A site specific risk assessment will be conducted if the necessity for security is identified by both parties (contractor and the City of Cape Town's representative), the Contractor shall employ reliable security guards from security companies. The security guards and the security company shall be registered with Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSIRA) as deemed necessary to ensure compliance with security requirements as defined in clause 18. The specific level of security to be utilised shall be approved by the City of Cape Town's representative.
- 1.9. The contract period shall be 36 months from the commencement date of the contract.
- 1.10. All workmanship shall be guaranteed for 6 months.

2. ALLOCATION OF WORK

- 2.1. For each particular job, the main contractor shall be issued with an official instruction in the form of a Purchase Order after which he/she shall acknowledge receipt of the instruction. However, if the main contractor confirms in writing that he/she will not be able to commence work with an adequate workforce within five (5) working days the work will then be offered to the alternative contractor. The alternative contractor will be given a notice period of fifteen (15) working days to commence work.
- 2.2. All planned work is envisaged to be carried out during normal working hours from 7h30 to 16h00.
