SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The National Lotteries Commission (The NLC) is a public entity established by Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the NLC can be divided into two categories, namely "regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries" and "administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)".

The Distributing Agencies (DA's) who are appointed by the Minister of Trade & Industry are responsible for the adjudication of the funding applications as per the Lotteries Act and applicable Regulations.

The NLC requires a suitably qualified service provider to supply and installation of CCTV Cameras and Access control for Hatfield Office in Pretoria.

2. PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENT

2.1. EQUIPMENT DESCRIPTION/PURPOSE: -

CCTV CAMERAS

- Installation of approx. 40 indoor cameras 20 outdoor infrared cameras and recording system
- Capture high quality, undistorted clear imagery of the overall activities occurring around the office parameter, corridors, parking, passages, building entrances etc.
- An uninterruptible power supply that will provide emergency power to the system for up to 8 hours during power failures.
- 1080p IP cameras support or latest technology
- Advanced video search
- Setup of all devices and commissioning of control room viewing console
- Setup of multiple profiles on the system for different roles, e.g., viewing only, viewing and playback, etc.
- Recording system must record on motion detection.
- High-Definition video output
- Ability to store footage for 120 days or more. All cameras' recordings must be recorded.
- Additional storage must be available to be added.
- Third-party system integration

• Storage methods (Central storage or Distributed storage) with a lockable rack cabinet

ACCESS CONTROL SYSTEM

- Approx. 15 doors of access to be controlled.
- Installation of access control points or commissioning the existing
- Latest software for access control
- Setup of multiple profiles on the system for different roles
- Link access control monitoring station to control room.
- User enrolment setup in a location other than control room
- Provide time and attendance system linked to access control.
- Visitor management,
- Card readable systems
- System that can register 500 users and can be extendable.

3. WARRANTY AND MAINTENANCE

- Provide a written works guarantee for the period of 24 months from the date of site handover to the client.
- If during this period the equipment is not in good working order, or not working satisfactorily owing to faulty material, design or workmanship, the bidder will be notified, and immediate steps shall be taken to rectify the defects and/or replace the affected parts on site at his own expense.
- The bidder shall maintain and keep the equipment in good working condition for the full period on expiry of the manufacturer's warranty.

5. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The service provider will report to the NLC Facilities (FMU) Department.

6. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The expected duration of the project is 30 days after the receival of the PO.

SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1.1 News and press releases
- 1.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, NLC.

1.2 Precedence of documents

- 1.2.1 This RFQ consists of several sections (see list). Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFQ and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFQ submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFQ shall take precedence.
- 1.2.2 Where this RFQ is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that NLC may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by NLC.
- 1.2.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFQ. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of NLC as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of NLC in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

1.3 Preferential procurement reform

- 1.3.1 NLC supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, NLC insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.
- 1.3.2 NLC shall apply the principles of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, (Act

No. 5 of 2000) to this proposal read together with the Preferential No. 5 of 2000) to this proposal read together with the Preferential Procurement Regulations published with effect from 16 January 2023("the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022").

- 1.4 National Industrial Participation Programme
- 1.4.1 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).
 - 1.5 Language
 - 1.5.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.
 - 1.6 Gender
 - 1.6.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.
 - 1.7 Headings
- 1.7.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.
 - 1.8 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993
- 1.8.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFQ and/ or subsequent agreement. NLC reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to NLC.
 - 1.9 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information
- 1.9.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFQ is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA read with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022. The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom NLC is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, NLC is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.
- 1.9.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with

- the NLC Data Privacy Policy.
- 1.9.3 The following persons will have access to the Personal Information collected:
- 1.9.3.1 NLC personnel participating in procurement/award procedures; and
- 1.9.3.2 Members of the public: within seven working days from the time the bid is awarded,the following information will have to be made available on National Treasury's e- Tender portal.
- 2.10. Rejection of all Bids/Quotation and Disclaimer

The NLC reserves the right to reject all bids when deemed necessary. This is justified when there is lack of effective competition, or bids/quotation are not substantially responsive.
