8.1 Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFQ and/or its receipt of a Quotation in response to it. Please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- modify the RFQ's goods / service(s) and request Respondents to re-bid on any changes;
- reject any Quotation which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- disqualify Quotations submitted after the stated submission deadline;
- not necessarily accept the lowest priced Quotation or an alternative bid;
- place an order in connection with this Quotation at any time after the RFQ's closing date;
- award only a portion of the proposed goods / services which are reflected in the scope of this RFQ;
- split the award of the order/s between more than one Supplier/Service Provider should it at Transnet's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- cancel the quotation process;
- validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;

10 Legal review

11 Security clearance

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the goods and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET. Obtaining the required clearance is the responsibility of the Successful Respondent. Acceptance of the bid is also subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent will implement all such security measures as the safe performance of the contract may require.

12 National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. 13 Tax Compliance

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Transnet and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents tax obligations.

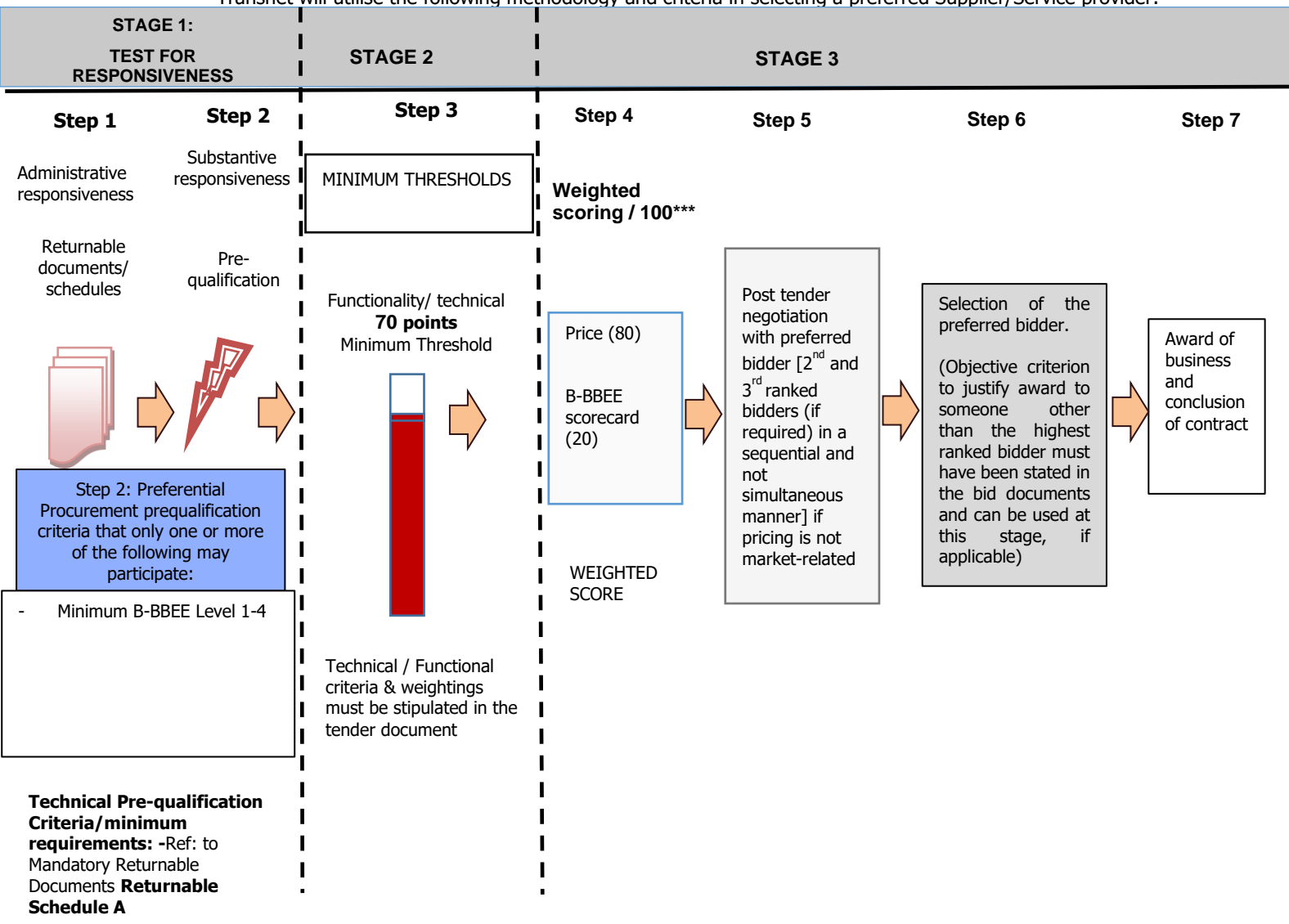

Respondents are to note that Transnet will round off final technical scores to the nearest 2 (two) decimal places for the purposes of determining whether the technical threshold has been met.

- Preference points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table indicated in Section 4.1 of the B-BBEE Preference Points Claim Form.

1.5 STEP FIVE: Post Tender Negotiations (if applicable)

- Respondents are to note that Transnet may not award a contract if the price offered is not market-related. In this regard, Transnet reserves the right to engage in PTN with the view to achieving a market-related price or to cancel the tender. Negotiations will be done in a sequential manner i.e.:
 - first negotiate with the highest ranked bidder or cancel the bid, should such negotiations fail,
 - negotiate with the 2nd and 3rd ranked bidders (if required) in a sequential manner.
- In the event of any Respondent being notified of such short-listed/preferred bidder status, his/her bid, as well as any subsequent negotiated best and final offers (BAFO), will automatically be deemed to remain valid during the negotiation period and until the ultimate award of business.
- Should Transnet conduct post tender negotiations, Respondents will be requested to provide their best and final offers to Transnet based on such negotiations. Where a market related price has been achieved through negotiation, the contract will be awarded to the successful Respondent(s).

1.6 STEP SIX: Objective Criteria (if applicable)

Transnet reserves the right to award the business to the highest scoring bidder/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder. The objective criteria Transnet may apply in this bid process include:

- A commercial relationship with a Domestic Prominent Influential Person (DPIP) or Foreign Prominent Public Official (FPPO) or an entity of which such person or official is the beneficial owner; and
- Reputational and Brand risks

1.7 STEP SEVEN: Award of business and conclusion of contract

- Immediately after approval to award the contract has been received, the successful or preferred bidder(s) will be informed of the acceptance of his/their Quotation by way of a Letter of Award. Thereafter the final contract will be concluded with the successful Respondent(s).
- Otherwise, a final contract will be concluded and entered into with the successful Bidder at the acceptance of a letter of award by the Respondent.

2 Validity Period

Transnet requires a validity period of 180 [One Hundred and Eighty] from the closing date of this RFQ, excluding the first day and including the last day.

Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bid, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process has not been finalised within the validity period. However, once the adjudication body has approved the process and award of the business to the successful bidder(s), the validity of the successful bidder(s)' bid will be deemed to remain valid until a final contract has been concluded.

3 Disclosure of contract information

PROVISION OF LIFTING EQUIPMENT EXAMINATION AND LOAD TESTING SERVICES FOR TRANSNET SOC LTD (REGISTRATION NO. 1990/000900/30) OPERATING AS TRANSNET PORT TERMINALS (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "TPT") AT THE PORT OF EAST LONDON MULTI PURPOSE TERMINAL FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTY-SIX (36) MONTHS

1. BACKGROUND

The East London Multi-Purpose Terminal (EL MPT) has three operating areas namely the Combi Terminal for containers & break bulk operation, the Grain Elevator for bulk grain products and the Car Terminal. In these various areas there are lifting equipment which are used to execute the work to enable the realization of operational goals and targets. Therefore, the condition of such equipment is of high importance as the unavailability will result in operational inefficiency which will impact on customer satisfaction.

Historically, EL MPT did not have a Lifting Machinery Inspector (LMI) and thus utilized the services of Transnet National Ports Authority to oversee the examinations and load testing of equipment. This has recently come to a stop due to unavailability of resources within this sister division of Transnet.

Therefore, EL MPT must take the necessary steps to ensure that it acquires the services of a LMI who will oversee the examination and load testing of lifting equipment in accordance to OSHAct and Transnet's Codes of Practice pertaining to lifting equipment.

2. PURPOSE

The aim of the scope is to ensure the following:

- a) Examination of all lifting equipment in accordance to OSH Act and Transnet's Codes of Practice (COP)
- b) Load test equipment in accordance to OSH Act and Transnet's Codes of Practice

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work of the Service provider/LMI will cover the entire Terminal. That will be Combi, Grain Elevator and Car Terminal.

3.1 Examinations

The contractor shall examine all lifting equipment, issue and endorse all log sheets as per the requirements of Transnet COP 29 and P. 027 for high mast poles.

3.2 Load testing

Contractor shall ensure that all equipment is load tested as per required intervals stipulated in the OSHAct and COP 29. If there are differences in the intervals between the OSHAct & COP 29, in terms of time, the shorter testing interval shall take precedence.

Same will apply on the actual testing load, the more stringent load shall take precedence. It must be noted that consideration must be made to Original Equipment Manufacturer's specifications when load testing equipment. If it so happens that OEM requirements are less stringent than the OSHAct and COP 29, the LMI must make the Technical Manager aware of such a case as the OEM will need to be informed so that a decision can be made.

3.3 Time related issues

All examinations to be concluded within the first two weeks of the month with all the logbooks being up to date.

The invoices should be received by the procurement department no later than the 20th of each month. This will ensure that all lifting equipment related orders processes on SAP are concluded by the 25th of each month.

3.4 Qualifications of the Examiner and Company Certification

The Examiner and Company shall have the following certificates:

- Lifting Machinery Inspector(LMI) certificate from the Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA). Service provider to supply a certified copy of this certificate and attach covering letter from ECSA, stating clearly what their "Scope of Work" is.
- Lifting Machinery Entity(LME) certificate from Department of Labour for the entity. The LME certificate must clearly stipulate the scope of approval for the entity.
- Artisan trade test certificate(preferably Millwright) for the Inspector/Examiner.

3.5 Transnet code of practice 29

Transnet uses its own code of practice in conjunction with the OSHAct. All lifting equipment within Transnet therefore must comply with the requirements of 'Code of Practice 29'. Transnet makes provision for external Examiners to be trained and certified on administering this code. The service provider is thus required to comply to this code and provide the following:

- Transnet Code of Practice 29 training certificate for the Examiner.
- If the service provider does not have the certificate, they will have to get training via Transnet Engineering school of excellence.
- The costs related to getting the certification will be on the service providers expense.
