3. SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA

3.1. Evaluation Stages

AIRPORTS COMPANY SOUTH AFRICA will use three stage evaluation criteria when considering received quotations. The evaluation criteria will consider the Mandatory Documents, Functionality and Price and BEE.

A staged approach will be used to evaluate bids. The requirements of any given stage must be complied with prior to progression to the next stage. ACSA reserves the right to disqualify bidders without requesting any outstanding document/information. The stages are as follows:

3.4 Price and BBEE

This is the final stage of the evaluation process and will be based on the PPPFA preference point system of **80/20.** Price will amount to <u>80</u> points, whilst preference will be <u>20</u> points. The award of business will be made to a bidder which has scored the highest overall points for this stage of the evaluation, **unless objective criteria exists**, justifying an award to another bidder or ACSA splits the award or cancels the bid, etcetera.
