1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

The Environment and Agriculture Management Department of the City of Tshwane (CoT) is requesting for a service provider for the facilitation of AEL application and compliance reports for Rebecca Street Crematoria.

2. BACKGROUND

In terms of Section 22 of the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004) states that "No person may without a provisional atmospheric emission licence (PAEL) or an atmospheric emission licence (AEL) conduct an activity (a) listed on the national list anywhere in the Republic; or (b) listed on the list applicable in the province or anywhere in that province".

Regulation 893 of 22 November 2013 of Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004), lists all activities which result in atmospheric emissions and may have a significant detrimental effect on the environment. In particular it includes Crematoria in subcategory 8.2 of the Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004).

The City of Tshwane's Rebecca Street Crematoria was issued with a Provisional Atmospheric Emission Licence (PAEL) in terms of the Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004) on the 28 April 2022 by Gauteng Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (GDARD).

As per the conditions 6.4 & 9.8 of the PAEL, the City is required to submit stack emission results for both stacks in a quarterly basis and also for the inclusion in the annual report to be submitted to GDARD.

In that regard, the City is looking for a Service Provider who can assist in complying with the conditions of the PAEL for Rebecca Street Crematoria. The Service Provider will also be required to compile application for Atmospheric Emissions Licence for Rebecca Street Crematoria, in terms of the Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004.

3. PROJECT SCOPE

The service provider is required to ensure compliance to AQA legislation. The scope of the project includes, but is not restricted to, the following tasks Rebecca Street:

- A. Compilation and submission of the atmospheric emission licence application, emission monitoring (quarterly, bi- annual, annual results), bi-annual reports, annual reports and/or atmospheric impact assessment report for Rebecca Street in terms subcategory 8.2 of the Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004). The content of the report should include but not limited to the following information:
 - Simplified block diagram with the name of each unit process in a block;
 showing links between all unit processes or blocks.
 - Process flow chart(s) clearly indicating inputs, outputs, and emissions at the site of works, including points of potential fugitive emissions and emergency releases.
 - Provide raw material information, production and by-production rates and emissions information.
 - Provide information on emission monitoring requirements.
 - Provide point source emission information.
 - Provide information on management and mitigation measures.
 - Area and/or line source emission estimation information.
 - Provide information on appliances and measures implemented to prevent air pollution for the entire operation at the site of the works, highlighting information for listed activity or activities proposed in respect of the application.

- List potential start up, maintenance, shut down, upset conditions, and associated responses related to the operations at the site of the works, highlight possible releases and responses for the proposed listed activity or activities in respect of the current application.
- Provide information on disposal of waste and effluents arising from abatement equipment control technology.
- Assess the impact of crematoria on the receiving environment.
- Sample and analyze emissions in accordance with the ISO standards as stipulated in Annexure A (Methods for sampling and analysis) of the Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004).
- Determine and analyses the mass concentration of pollutants from the crematoria using the isokinetic stack monitoring instrument.
- Provide analysis of emissions impact on human health.
- Provide analysis of emissions impact on the environment.
 Contain information or documents of public participation conducted.

The project deliverables for Rebecca Street Crematorium include the following:

- a) Compilation and submission of the atmospheric emission licence application for Rebecca Street Crematorium in terms subcategory 8.2 of the Air Quality Act (NEM: AQA), 2004 (Act 39 of 2004).
- b) Execute emission measurements, analyse and compile a report(s) at Rebecca Street, for the purpose of providing the emissions information required by the licensing authority.
- c) Conduct public participation which will include advertising on newspapers.
- d) Attend consultation meetings with the licensing authority and submit minutes of the meetings to the project manager.
- e) Attend meetings and write minutes of the meetings as and when required by the project manager.
- f) Measure emissions from the crematoria using isokinetic stack monitoring instrument.
- g) Compilation of the accurate atmospheric impact report.
- h) Submission of electronic and/or hard copy of Atmospheric Emission License to the project manager.
- i) Pollutant Emission trend.
- j) Compliance audit report.
- k) Major upgrades project (i.e., abatement equipment or process equipment), and;
- I) Greenhouse gas emission reporting in terms of NAEIS Regulations.
