T1.1.1: TENDER NOTICE AND INVITATION TO TENDER

The Inner-City Regeneration (ICR) Programme is a flagship initiative led by the City Manager's Office, aimed at transforming Durban's inner city into a well-managed, inclusive, and economically vibrant urban centre. The ICR Programme is structured around 15 strategic workstreams, addressing key focus areas such as housing delivery, safety, public realm management, transport, social infrastructure, economic revitalization, and governance.

The City Manager has approved the appointment of a **Consultant Programme Manager** to provide dedicated leadership, strategic coordination, and operational oversight to accelerate delivery, enhance reporting integration, and strengthen alignment with municipal, provincial, and national priorities.

The Programme Management Team will be responsible for centralised oversight and coordination across all 13 workstreams, ensuring alignment to municipal priorities, timely delivery, effective stakeholder engagement, and optimal use of resources.

T1.2: TENDER DATA

T1.2.1 STANDARD CONDITIONS OF TENDER

The conditions of tender are the Standard Conditions of Tender as contained in Annex F of the CIDB Standard for Uniformity in Construction Procurement (July 2015) as published in Government Gazette No 38960, Board Notice 136 of 2015 of 10 July 2015.

F.2: TENDERER'S OBLIGATIONS

F.2.1 Eligibility: General

A Tenderer will not be eligible to submit a tender if:

- (a) the Tenderer submitting the tender is under restrictions or has principles who are under restriction to participate in the Employer's procurement due to corrupt or fraudulent practices.
- (b) the Tenderer does not have the legal capacity to enter into the contract.
- (c) the Tenderer does not comply with the legal requirements as stated in the Employer's current SCM Policy.
- (d) the Tenderer cannot provide proof that he is in good standing with respect to duties, taxes, levies and contributions required in terms of legislation applicable to the work in the contract.
- (e) In the event of a Compulsory Clarification Meeting:
 - i) the Tenderer fails to attend the Compulsory Clarification Meeting.
 - ii) the Tenderer fails to have form "Certificate of Attendance at Clarification Meeting / Site Inspection" (in T2.2) signed by the Employer's Agent or his representative.
- (f) in the case of JV submissions, two or more JV entities have common directors / shareholders or common entities tendering for the same works.
- (g) at the time of closing of tenders, the Tenderer is not registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD) as a service provider. In the case of a Joint Venture, this requirement will apply individually to each party in the Joint Venture.
- (h) The tender fails to complete and sign the Declaration of Municipal Fees in T2.2: "Returnable Documents" and submits the required documentation. Reference is to be made to Returnable Document T2.2.12.

Eligibility

Tenders will be checked for compliance with the ELIGIBILITY requirements, as specified in Clause F.2.1. Tenderers not in compliance will be deemed non-responsive.

Functionality

FUNCTIONALITY will be evaluated to determine the responsiveness of tenders received. The minimum score for **FUNCTIONALITY** is **70 points**. Those tenders not achieving the minimum score will be deemed non-responsive.

The functionality Criteria, Sub-Criteria, Points per Criteria/ Sub-Criteria, Returnable Documentation and Schedules, Method of Evaluation, and Prompts for Judgement are as specified in T1.2.3: "Additional Conditions of Tender".

Preference Point System

Targeted Procurement

The Municipality does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender. It reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of a tender to place orders. Bidders shall not bind the Municipality to any minimum quantity per order. The successful Tenderer (s) shall be bound to provide any quantities stipulated in the specification.

The Inner-City Regeneration (ICR) Programme is a flagship initiative led by the City Manager's Office, aimed at transforming Durban's inner city into a well-managed, inclusive, and economically vibrant urban centre. The ICR Programme is structured around 15 strategic workstreams, addressing key focus areas such as housing delivery, safety, public realm management, transport, social infrastructure, economic revitalization, and governance.

The City Manager has approved the appointment of a **Consultant Programme Manager** to provide dedicated leadership, strategic coordination, and operational oversight to accelerate delivery, enhance reporting integration, and strengthen alignment with municipal, provincial, and national priorities.

The Programme Management Team will be responsible for centralised oversight and coordination across all 13 workstreams, ensuring alignment to municipal priorities, timely delivery, effective stakeholder engagement, and optimal use of resources.

- Monitor progress against agreed milestones and ensure corrective actions are implemented promptly.

3.6 Infrastructure Engineer / Built Environment Specialist

- Lead the analysis, assessment, and conceptual design of major built environment interventions—
 roads, stormwater, public realm upgrades, building refurbishments—within the inner-city regeneration
 portfolio
- Coordinate across all 13+ workstreams to align infrastructure elements such as road widening, sanitation upgrades, lighting, and surveillance infrastructure for a cohesive public realm.
- Provide guidance on best practices, defend contractual terms, and resolve technical disputes when they arise.
- Ensure adherence to environmental impact assessments and by-laws; liaise with provincial/national regulators for approvals and compliance
- Serve as technical liaison between municipal departments, external consultants, contractors, property owners, and precinct stakeholders.

4. Reporting Lines

The Programme Manager Consultant will:

- Report directly to the City Manager or his designated representative.
- Work closely with the ICR Lead, the ICR Core Team, and all workstream leads.
- Provide regular updates to the City Manager's Operations Office Cluster and the City Manager's Support Team.

5. Required Deliverables

The Consultant Programme Manager will be required to submit the following deliverables:

- Inception Report (within 10 working days of appointment)
- Weekly Progress Dashboards (including fiscal and programme updates)
- Monthly Consolidated Progress Reports

- Quarterly Performance Reports aligned with National Treasury and municipal reporting requirements
- Regularly updated ICR Risk Register
- Consolidated Spatial Map of ICR Initiatives
- Two-day site visit coordination report
- Close-out Report at the end of the contract period

6. Duration

The appointment will be for a **period of three (3) years**, subject to annual performance reviews, satisfactory delivery of key outputs, and the availability of funding.

7. Contract Management

The City Manager's Office will manage the contract. Oversight will be provided by the ICR Core Team, with performance monitoring at quarterly intervals.

Annex F

(normative)

Standard Conditions of Tender

F.1 General

F.1.1 Actions

- **F.1.1.1** The employer and each tenderer submitting a tender offer shall comply with these conditions of tender. In their dealings with each other, they shall discharge their duties and obligations as set out in F.2 and F.3, timeously and with integrity, and behave equitably, honestly and transparently, comply with all legal obligations and not engage in anticompetitive practices.
- **F.1.1.2** The employer and the tenderer and all their agents and employees involved in the tender process shall avoid conflicts of interest and where a conflict of interest is perceived or known, declare any such conflict of interest, indicating the nature of such conflict. Tenderers shall declare any potential conflict of interest in their tender submissions. Employees, agents and advisors of the employer shall declare any conflict of interest to whoever is responsible for overseeing the procurement process at the start of any deliberations relating to the procurement process or as soon as they become aware of such conflict, and abstain from any decisions where such conflict exists or recuse themselves from the procurement process, as appropriate.

Note: 11 A conflict of interest may arise due to a conflict of rotes which might provide an incentive for improper sets in some circumstances. A conflict of interest can areads on apparatures of managenest that can under mine confidence in the ability of that person to act properly in his or her position even if no improper acts result.

- 2) Conflicts of interest in respect of those engaged in the pronounced process include direct, indirect or family interests in the tender or occome of the procurement process and any personal blan, inclination, obligation, allegiance in layely which would in one may affect any decisions taken.
- **F.1.1.3** The employer shall not seek and a tenderer shall not submit a tender without having a firm intention and the capacity to proceed with the contract.

F.1.2 Tender Documents

The documents issued by the employer for the purpose of a tender offer are listed in the tender data.

F.1.3 Interpretation

- F.1.3.1 The tender data and additional requirements contained in the tender schedules that are included in the returnable documents are deemed to be part of these conditions of tender.
- **F.1.3.2** These conditions of tender, the tender data and tender schedules which are only required for tender evaluation purposes, shall not form part of any contract arising from the invitation to tender.
- F.1.3.3 For the purposes of these conditions of tender, the following definitions apply:
- a) conflict of interest means any situation in which:
 - someone in a position of trust has competing professional or personal interests which make it difficult to fulfill his or her duties impartially;
 - an individual or organisation is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal or corporate benefit; or
