Post the appointment on the framework agreement, the department will call all qualifying service providers and issues request for task orders as necessary. The request for task orders will be based on Option A: Priced Contract with Activity Schedule and Option G. Term contract. Option A will also entail the employer appointing the service providers based on the percentage fee of the actual value of construction works as per Annexure 3: Framework for the determination of professional fees associated with the delivery of a package of this bid. Preference and scoring for the award of the task order will be done as per LDPWR&I Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022 - or as amended, at the time of the issuing of the request for task order and will be included on the Request for Quotations. Generally, the Appointment from list of approved service providers will be based on Method 2 (Financial offer and preferences), unless otherwise stated on the RFQ.

Civil works

The process of inviting service providers during the RFQ will be based on the nature (either complex or simple) and size of the project (estimated total value of the project).

For Complex Projects, only companies with registered professional engineer(s) and/or professional Architects shall be considered.

The estimated value of the social facilitation services applicable to the project will be used to determine the size of enterprises (small, medium or large) to be invited as follows:

- (i) Where the estimated costs of the project is less than R 6 million, all the bidders within the framework agreement will be invited.
- (ii) Where the estimated costs of the project is above R 6,01 million and less than R 50,01 million, only medium and large enterprises will be invited.
- (iii) Where the estimated costs of the project is above R 50,01 million, only large enterprises will be invited.

C2.1 Pricing assumptions

C.2.1.1 General

- **C.2.1.1.1** The *Consultant* will be paid either under Option G (Term Contract) i.e. on a combination of Time Charges (sum of the products for each of the *staff rate* multiplied by the time appropriate to that *rate* properly spent on work in the contract) and Option B: Priced Contract with Activity Schedule.
- **C.2.1.1.2** Expenses as provided for in the contract are paid in addition to the total of the Time Charges and lump sum prices.
- **C.2.1.1.3** There is no adjustment to the lump sums for items in the Task Schedule if the amount, or quantity, of work within that activity later turns out to be different to that which the *Consultant* estimated at the time that the Task Schedule was accepted by the *Employer*. The only basis for a change to the lump sum prices is as a result of a compensation event (See Clause 60.1).

C.2.1.2 Staff rates

Where option G will be used, the service provider will be requested to provide staff rates, covering the following:

- C.2.1.2.1 The staff rates are the prices charged for staff, excluding VAT, but including

1 Background

The Limpopo Department Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure (LDPWR&I) is the Implementing Agent (IA) of choice for all provincial departments within the Limpopo Province. Currently all planning and implementing activities are implemented through LDPWR&I.



1. COMMUNITY FACILITATOR'S KEY ACTIVITIES

1.1 COMMUNITY FACILITATION PLANNING

Social facilitation planning takes place simultaneously as part of normal or overall infrastructure project planning. As key champions for the process, social development managers or delegated resources should work closely with the project technical manager to ensure that project planning is integrated from the initiation of each project. All relevant community facilitation activities, tools and deliverables should be identified with clear timeframes as part of the project planning process. The plan with the activities should be approved by the LDPWRI's technical and social development programme manager, including the client. The role of the social development programme manager or delegated resource is to track, monitor and report progress on all the identified community facilitation outputs or results as per the plan.

1.2 STAKEHOLDER MAPPING AND ANALYSIS

The team led by the social development programme manager or delegated resource should conduct a thorough mapping and analysis of all stakeholders likely to be impacted by the project/s. This includes the identification, ranking and analysis of all key stakeholders. The idea is to determine stakeholder interests, identify power-brokers and influencers and method of engagement for each category of stakeholders. Once this is done, the project team will be able to develop appropriate strategies targeting all stakeholders, especially those that are either supportive or have the potential to disrupt the project/s. The choice of tools for stakeholder mapping vary and care should be taken to customise them to suit the complexities of each situation. Figures 3 and 4 below show sample templates that may be used for stakeholder mapping and analysis.

1.3 STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

Having identified stakeholders in the previous section the Facilitator now knows the powers and influence of the different role players. The aim is to ensure that each project lands smoothly by engaging stakeholders

with the most influence or power in the community. The Community Facilitator or delegated resource has to ensure community buy-in and ownership of the project without creating unrealistic expectations. The objectives of the project must be understood by all stakeholders, including community members.

The following key points provide guidelines for engaging and managing the various categories of stakeholders once they have been identified and classified:

- High power, interested people: Stakeholders who must be fully engaged or strong efforts made to satisfy them.
- High power, less interested people: The project team or delegated resource should work with these stakeholders to keep them satisfied. They must not feel alienated.
- Low power, interested people: keep these stakeholders informed about the project's progress, and address with them any major issues that may arise.
- Low power, less interested people: These stakeholders should be monitored and excessive communication should be avoided.

Each project team must be aware that every project's success heavily depends on the support and collaboration of various stakeholders whose roles must be fully acknowledged. Failure to obtain the buy-in of key stakeholders may impact negatively on the project's success. Some of the challenges which need to be managed by the community facilitator include:

- Conflict arising from lack of proper consultation on the project and its objectives.
- Lack of appreciation of the importance of the project and its relevance to the community and nation at large.
- · Misinformation and misinterpretation resulting from lack of or poor communication,
- Lack of proper mechanisms for dealing with conflict arising from the project.

Factors to consider when engaging various stakeholders the Community Facilitator will have to thoroughly plan for engagements. The stakeholder engagement plan should amongst other things consider the following:

- Local protocols: cultures norms and practices;
- Governance: Alignment with existing national and provincial development plans and municipal IDPs; municipal by-laws.
- Local community dynamics: scan of current situation in area inundated for the project/s;
- Compliance with environmental standards.

Apart from the above, the community facilitator is expected to:

Clearly communicate and articulate project objectives to stakeholders, including details of why it
is being implemented/introduced.

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- Identify and communicate areas of alignment/linkages with local, regional and national development plans.
- Establish and manage expectations of stakeholders on the project: Explain how the project will benefit the community, including who is being targeted.
- Facilitate the establishment and selection of community representatives on the Project Steering Committee (PSC). The PSC will become the main interface between the project team and the contractor on the one hand, and the community (stakeholders) on the other.
- Identify and track issues using an issue log. The Issue Log should be used to resolve or unblock
 matters that may negatively impact progress. Every issue identified should be tracked and
 reported as part of the project reporting.
- Develop and manage stakeholder communication plan: This plan will guide how each stakeholder
 will be engaged, including the frequency and methodology to be used, i.e. not all stakeholder will
 informed using the same approach.

1.4 COMMUNITY PROFILING

A community profile records high level information on a broad range of factors which may justify the need for or negate the project. Depending on the nature of the project and timeframes, a good community profile can be compiled using various tools such as desktop research on secondary data and action-based research techniques such as community resources mapping, transect walk, interviews, focus group discussions and community dialogues. Key information in the profile should include but not limited to:

- Demographic profile: population size and household structure, e.g. number of households.
- Socio-economic status: main source of livelihoods, general poverty status, unemployment, etc.
- State of service delivery: state of social infrastructure Basic information such as boundaries and composition of the community before starting to work in an area
- · Local political dynamics: main actors and influencers
- · State of social cohesion in the target community

1.5 PROJECT BASELINE STUDY

The purpose of a baseline study is to provide the status quo of the situation before the project is implemented. The baseline will then be used to monitor implementation effectiveness and to measure the impact of the project against the desired outcomes. The baseline study serves a number of purposes, not limited to the following:

 Providing data that measures conditions before a project starts so as to enable a comparison of the before and after scenario or picture.

- Strengthening rationale for the project while motivating and building stakeholders support, and.
- Provide baseline data or reference point for impact assessment and setting of realistic indicators for the project.

A key deliverable of the base-lining process is a socio-economic report with recommendations. The role of the social development manager or delegated resource in the baseline process includes the following:

- Develop a Terms of Reference (ToR) for the baseline study. Regardless of whether the baseline study will be conducted externally, internally or a combination of both, ToR play a critical role summarizing the key elements of the baseline study. The specific content of the ToR will depend on each project.
- Identify or develop research tools for data collection and analysis.
- Compile and disseminate baseline report to key stakeholders, including interested community
 members. The dissemination of the report will assist in raising awareness, generate further
 discussion and feedback. The tools for disseminating the report should be part of the project
 communication plan.

1.6 RECRUITMENT OF LOCAL LABOUR

One of the key roles of the social development project manager or delegated resource is to ensure that all projects create jobs or absorb as much local labour as is technically feasible. The LDPWRI places emphasis on the recruitment of local labour in order to maximise impact or attainment of set government development outcomes through job creation, skills development and transfer. This makes it critical that all the labour and skills requirements should be included in the project tender documentation that is issued to the public. The social development manager or delegated resource is expected to:

- · Identify the most appropriate source of information to use in the recruitment process. e
- Develop a data base for recruitment (key to ensure objectivity/trust).
- Develop a template for profiling potential candidates (Information to be captured should include, ID number, gender, age, ward, etc).
- Liaise with the main contractor on which skill requirement will be met locally outside of domestic requirements.
- Identify the channel (local newspapers, ward committees, hailers, notice boards, community radio stations, NGOs, etc.) for advertising of recruitment notices.
- Ensure that all local labour requirements are clearly included in the tender,
- Ensure that the local labour requirements are included in the project contracting arrangements to ensure compliance
- Report progress on labour as part of normal project reporting.

1.7 PROJECT RISKS MANAGEMENT

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C3 Scope of Work



In the LDPWRI's own experience, projects can be negatively affected by a number of risks arising from onsite labour disputes, local political dynamics as well as service delivery protests. Such risks need to be properly managed through a risk management plan. The community facilitator or delegated resource in collaboration with the principal agent and other team members must critically analyse and find appropriate mechanisms to deal with any conflicts that have the potential to stop projects from going ahead. While not being prescriptive, there are numerous ways available to resolve conflicts within the ambit of the laws of the country and where necessary, legal advice should be sought.

1.8 MONITORING

Regular onsite project meetings and engagement with all key stakeholders form an important part of the successful management of social infrastructure projects implemented by the LDPWRI. Site meetings provide a regular platform for assessing progress; deal with issues arising from the implementation process and keep stakeholders abreast on either progress made or any changes in the scope of the project. The social facilitator is expected to use such site meetings to:

- Track issues for resolution or action based on the issues log.
- Monitor, track and report on progress in terms of softer development outcomes, and
- Communicate with stakeholders as a way of managing expectations on the project.

1.9 IMPACT EVALUATION

Government conceives projects based on a specific theory of change, which is anchored on certain desired national development imperatives. The ability of the project to meet the desired objectives defines whether a project is a success or not. Thus, impact evaluations enable project managers to assess the effectiveness or impact of every project against set goals, objectives or outcomes based on pre-determined indicators. The role of the community facilitator or delegated resource is to ensure that an evaluation plan is developed and all progress tracked and reported against the community facilitation plan. A critical area for the LDPWRI as an implementing agent is the overall contribution of social infrastructure to the socio-economic development in the country. Project impact can be measured in the form of direct outputs, i.e. short term results, as well as indirect and induced outcomes, i.e. medium to long-term results.

- Direct impact: measures the direct impact resulting from the delivery of social infrastructure and includes total spend on empowerment, number of jobs and skills developed or transferred.
- Indirect impact: measures upstream impact arising demand for local suppliers of goods and services, as well as labour.
- Induced impact: measures shifts in development profiles of communities, e.g. changes in local spending patterns on goods and services, household incomes, new networks, new enterprises, incidence of crime, disease, poverty, social cohesion and quality of life.

1.10 PROJECT GOVERNANCE

The role of the social development manager, community facilitator or delegated resource is critical in ensuring that a project is governed transparently in the interest of sustainable or good service delivery. The following roles are critical to ensure project implementation meets good service delivery practice:

- Establishing PSC and train members
- Identify and participate in relevant local platforms
- Regular participation in the Project Steering Committee as per meeting schedule
- · Participate in site meetings based as per project meeting schedule, and
- Compilation of reports with respect to softer development targets as required by all stakeholders and clients

1.11 PROPOSED FRAMEWORK IMPLEMENTATION PROTOCOL

The LDPWRI's new business case refers to community facilitation as a key differentiator and important embedded service in our service delivery approach. In order for the framework to support quality service delivery, the following recommendations have to be supported by EXCO:

- Institutionalisation of community facilitation in the LDPWRI through appropriate HR policies on performance management.
- Community facilitation needs to start when the project is initiated, even in the case where external service providers are to be used
- Community facilitation Terms of Reference (ToR) need to be included in all project tender and contracting documentation to ensure that the process is conducted in all targeted projects.
- The LDPWRI needs to finalise and approve standardised professional services and attached costing model for Community facilitation (for internal project teams –as disbursements, and external service providers).



Specific goals for the tender and points claimed are indicated per the table below.

For complex projects, the department may also consider additional information during the evaluation of the proposals. This may include amongst others, the following – which will be considered during RQF and evaluation thereof:

– Current performance of the service provider in relation to similar works allocated by the department.

- Experience of the consultants (Consultant's general experience and record in the field covered by the ToR) only professional engineers will be considered.
- Submission of a proposed project approach/methodology that best represents the ToR.
- Submission of proposed project schedule, or work plan that best represents the ToR.

LDPWR&I or any organ of state reserves the right to cancel any RFQ and consider advertising any tender on open tender as the case may be when it is necessary to do so.

12 Invoices

Invoices submitted shall be a Tax invoice inclusive of VAT. The invoice shall comply with requirements, if any, established by the Employer. A copy of the task order shall accompany the Tax Invoice, together with a CD of approved deliverables.

13 Vendor registration

The Consultant shall complete vendor registration forms before the first assessment date. Such forms and the submission requirements shall be obtained from the Employer.
