- 4 Tenderers are requested to furnish the full registered name of the tendering company/supplier on the Form of Quotation and Form of Acceptance, Form B.
- 5 Tenderers are also required to sign each page of the Form of Quotation and Form of Acceptance, Form B, in the space provided at the bottom of each page.

## CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

- 2.3 To capacitate and upskill the learners on Environmental Impact: Organic farming reduces pollution by avoiding synthetic chemicals and promoting practices that conserve water and soil. It also supports biodiversity and reduces the carbon footprint of farming.

**SPECIFICATIONS**

- The training for basic organic production, and compost and vermicompost training should entail the following elements.

**BASIC ORGANIC PRODUCTION**

1. **Soil Health:** Organic farming emphasizes the importance of maintaining healthy, fertile soil. Practices such as crop rotation, cover cropping, and composting enhance soil structure and fertility.

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2. **Biodiversity:** Encouraging a diverse range of plants and animals on the farm supports ecological balance. Organic farms often integrate multiple crops, beneficial insects, and natural predators.
3. **Natural Pest Management:** Instead of relying on chemical pesticides, organic farming uses natural methods for pest control. This includes introducing beneficial insects, using biological control agents, and implementing physical barriers.
4. **Sustainable Practices:** Organic farming focuses on sustainable resource management. This includes water conservation, reducing waste, and minimizing the use of non-renewable resources.

### **Benefits of Organic Farming**

2. **Soil Management:** Focus on improving soil health through composting, green manures, and natural fertilizers. Regular soil testing can help you understand nutrient needs and avoid deficiencies.

2. **Layering and Moisture Management:** Participants learn how to properly layer these materials in compost piles or bins, ensuring that the right balance of carbon-rich (brown) and nitrogen-rich (green) materials is maintained. Proper moisture control is also emphasized to support the composting process.
3. **Turning the Compost:** Farmers are trained on how to turn and aerate the compost pile regularly to facilitate the decomposition process and ensure the compost remains oxygenated.
4. **Compost Maturity:** The training includes a module on recognizing when the compost is fully matured and ready to be applied to crops. Farmers are taught how to test for the right texture, smell, and temperature to ensure the compost is rich in nutrients.
