SECTION 1: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND RFP SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. INTRODUCTION

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is a public entity established by the Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997 as amended, to regulate the National Lottery and other lotteries and to administer the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund ("NLDTF"). In December 2014, the Lotteries Amendment Act 32 of 2013 was promulgated and Regulations thereof published on 14 April 2015.

In line with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act No. 1 of 1999 ("PFMA") and Treasury Regulations, the NLC seeks to engage the services of duly qualified service providers to the NLC seeks to engage the services of duly qualified service providers to submit a proposal to develop a total reward strategy for the National Lotteries Commission.

2. BACKGROUND

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) seeks to appoint a qualified and experienced service provider to conduct SHE Representative Functions and Combined First Aid Level 1 & 2 Training Courses for the National Lotteries Commission.

The objective is to equip designated personnel within the National Lotteries Commission (NLC) with the essential knowledge, skills, and competencies required to effectively fulfill their roles as SHE (Safety, Health, and Environmental) Representatives and First Aiders, in compliance with the Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993) and other relevant regulations.

3. OBJECTIVES

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) invites suitably qualified and experienced service providers to submit proposals to conduct SHE Representative Functions and Combined First Aid Level 1 & 2 Training Courses.

This training aims to:

- Meet the legal requirements stipulated in South Africa's OHS legislation for the appointment and training of SHE Representatives and First Aiders in the workplace.
- Empower employees to identify, report, and mitigate health and safety risks.
- Enable a swift and competent first aid response in case of medical emergencies or workplace injuries.
- Foster a proactive safety culture within the NLC by building awareness and accountability.
- Encourage continuous safety improvement and employee involvement in SHE matters.
- Provide practical and theoretical training to enhance the confidence and capability of NLC staff in performing their designated SHE and First Aid responsibilities effectively.
- Contribute to the reduction of workplace injuries, illnesses, and incidents through effective health and safety practices and trained emergency response personnel.

4. MANDATE

The NLC Human Capital (HC) department requires potential bidders to assist with conducting SHE Representative Functions and Combined First Aid Level 1 & 2 Training Courses

4.1 SCOPE FOR CONDUCTING SHE REPRESENTATIVE FUNCTIONS AND COMBINED FIRST AID LEVEL 1 & 2 TRAINING COURSES.

4.1.1 The appointed service provider will be required to:

- Conduct accredited SHE Representative training in line with Department of Labour and OHSA requirements.
- Conduct Combined First Aid Level 1 & 2 training in accordance with Department of Labour/Health and Safety regulatory body standards.
- Provide all necessary training material, certificates, assessment tools, and equipment.

- Deliver the training across NLC offices (Head Office and Regional Offices), as determined by the NLC.
- Issue certificates of competence to all successful participants.
- Submit a training completion report including attendance registers, assessment results, and evaluation forms.

5. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The service provider shall work closely with the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) office.

6. DURATION OF THE MANDATE

Four (4) weeks to deliver both SHE Representative Functions and Combined First Aid Level 1 & 2 Training Courses.

SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotations (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the NLC.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFP without prior written permission from the NLC.
- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the NLC.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official NLC Purchase Order form has been received.
- 1.6 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za.
- 1.7 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant.

2. General rules and instructions

- 2.1 News and press releases
 - 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFP or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the NLC.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
 - 2.2.1 This RFP consists of a number of sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFP and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFP submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFP

shall take precedence.

2.2.2 Where this RFP is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the NLC may in its sole discretion elect to

2.2.3 import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by the NLC.

2.2.4 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFP. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the NLC as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the NLC in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

2.3 Preferential procurement reform

2.4 The NLC supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the NLC insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.

2.5 Bidders must be registered with the central supplier database (CSD) and submit CSD report reflecting tax compliant.

2.6 National Industrial Participation Programme

2.7 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).

2.8 Language

2.8.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.

2.9 Gender

2.9.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

2.10 Headings

2.10.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFP document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.

2.11 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993

2.11.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFP and/ or subsequent agreement. the NLC reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to the NLC.

2.12 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information

2.12.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates, and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA read with the Preferential.

Procurement Regulations, 2023. The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the NLC is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the NLC is compelled to submit information to the National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.

2.12.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the NLC Data Privacy Policy.

2.12.3 The following persons will have access to the Personal Information collected:

2.12.3.1 The NLC personnel participating in procurement/award procedures; and

2.12.3.2 Members of the public: within seven working days from the time the bid is awarded, the following information will have to be made available on National Treasury's e-Tender portal:

2.12.3.2.1 contract description and bid number.

2.12.3.2.2 names of the successful bidder(s) and preference points claimed.

2.12.3.2.3 the contract price(s) (if possible).

2.12.3.2.4 contract period.

2.12.3.2.5 names of directors; and

2.12.3.2.6 date of completion/award.

2.12.4 The NLC will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e. the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the procedures specified in the NLC PAIA manual.

2.12.5 In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

3. Formal Briefing Session

There will be no compulsory briefing session.

4. Validity Period

4.1 The NLC requires a validity period of 120 Days against this RFP.

Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bids, on the same terms and conditions. A written letter will be sent to every bidder that responded to the bid. In terms of procedural fairness, the bidders will be given an opportunity to respond, in writing, to the terms and conditions of the bid and the bid price. Such acceptance of the terms and conditions of bid and bid price becomes legally binding in the procurement process. Any bidder, that did not respond to the extension of the bid validity period, in writing, **WILL NOT** be considered further for the bid upon expiry of the initial validity period.

4.2 Bidders are to note that they may be requested to extend the validity period of their bids, on the same terms and conditions, if the internal evaluation process is not finalized within the validity period.

5. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

5.1 Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information.

5.2 The NLC may not award business to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD.

5.3 Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

6. Confidentiality

- 6.1 Bids submitted for this Request for Proposals will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding.
- 6.2 The NLC reserves all the rights afforded to it by the POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in Bid Proposals.
- 6.3 The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The NLC and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the NLC in terms of this bid award and only for the purposes as detailed in this RFP and in accordance with any applicable law.
- 6.4 The Bidder shall notify the NLC in writing of any unauthorized access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and report such crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

7. Communication

- 7.1 Specific queries relating to this RFP should be submitted penelope@nlcsa.org.za, before the closing date.
- 7.2 In the interest of fairness and transparency the NLC's response to such a query may be made available to other bidders.
- 7.3 It is prohibited for bidders to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of the NLC in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 7.4 Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of the state for a specified period.

8. Supplier Performance

- 8.1 The National Lotteries Commission conducts regular performance reviews in accordance with the requirements for the classification of the contract and or stakeholder by making use of supplier evaluation forms. The evaluation is conducted against the deliverables or scope of the contract with a minimum of an annual review done for contracts longer than a year and a review at completion of contract for those contracts less than a year.
- 8.2 Ad-hoc performance reviews shall be conducted where non-performance is identified outside the review period.

- 8.3 Non-performance will be addressed with at least a formal letter advising specific non-performing areas and stating remedial action/s required within specific time frames. Non-adherence to remedial actions shall lead to escalating performance management actions.
- 8.4 Any party to this agreement may request to participate in a joint performance review where appropriate and seek continuous improvement opportunities.

SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA

The NLC will evaluate all proposals in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2023 and Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act. No. 5 of 2000 (PPPFA). The six (6) phase evaluation criteria will be considered in evaluating the proposals.
