## 3. BACKGROUND

SABC Kimberley premise was declared as a National Key Point (NKP) Sites in 2008 under National Key Point Act, Act 102 of 1980. SABC, as a national key point is required to obtain the services of trained security personnel from a private security company since SABC does not have in-house security personnel.

In terms of control of access to public, premises and vehicle Act 53 of 1995 the SABC is required to have security for 24-hour security services. According to the National Key Point Act 102 of 1980 SABC is therefore having to be safeguarded by a registered and compliant security service provider for the duration of the precincts NKP status.

The purpose of the Protection Services Department is to protect the South African Broadcasting Corporation personnel, tangible and intangible assets, visitors within safe and pleasant working environment on a 24-hour basis.

## 4. REQUIREMENTS AND SCOPE OF SERVICES

# Importance of Physical security

- · Ensure effective access control
- Minimize the possibility of interruption of operations
- To ensure compliance with the National Key Points Act 102 of 1980

## **NKP** requirements

Day shift personnel: three (3) x Grade C, one (1) x Grade B who will operate as a shift supervisor.

Night shift personnel: three (3) x Grade C and one (1) x Grade B who will operate as a shift supervisor.

The **total number 8** NKP trained security personnel **excluding relievers**.

The service provider must provide relievers on an as and when required to guarantee the requirements and all relievers must be properly vetted in time.

- **4.1** All security officers should be trained and knowledgeable about SABC procedures, protocol and Standard Operating Procedures (S.O.P). In addition, the graded staff will be responsible for the following.
- 4.1.1 Grade B security officers who will operate as shift supervisors.
- 4.1.2 Grade C security officers as per the NKP Act patrol inside and outside the premises, including the main security control centers, entry and exit points.

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- The NKP owner is responsible for the protection of the site and ensuring that minimum security

- The security services to be provided in line with the following legislation

# Responsibilities

- The security services will provide the following to SABC:
- · Access and Egress control
- Escorting SABC personnel to the OBs when needed. (AD-HOC)
- · Guarding and Patrolling of the premises. 24/7
- Protection of assets, personnel and the premises
- Keys control
- Control room operations
- Monitoring of CCTV Cameras
- · Control room administration duties
- Handling Emergencies in the building. (Alarm systems and fire monitoring systems)
- · Conduct risk and threat assessments around the premises

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• Ensure compliance with the National Key Point Act by participating in shooting activities annually with NKP programme to ensure the safety of the installation and NKP annual refresher training.

#### **Deliverables**

Provide a security management function at the premises, which will include access, parameter control at premises and escorting of personnel and/or members of the public as and when required, and general crime prevention measures as instructed from time to time. This service will include the management of all security systems installed by the Corporation, as well as the execution of the Corporations security policies and procedures.

## **General patrols**

- · Securities officers shall on foot do effective patrols around the SABC premises
- Security officers shall conduct 24-hour thorough building patrols every day from Monday to Fridays and over weekends and public holidays
- · Particular attention should be given to all identified critical areas
- Security personnel shall at all-time be in possession of their identity certificate or permit and equipment to perform their duties as required
- It is a specific requirement that all security personnel used in these patrols be trained in the proper use of handheld two-way radio sets. All officers shall always be capable of conveying relevant details of incidents or reporting such incidents

## General control room duties

Security Officers issue and receive pre-approved SABC vehicles after hours, weekends and Public, Holidays as per Standard Operating Procedures

- Security officers shall operate telephone exchange outside office hours
- Security officers should monitor all alarms systems.
- Dedicated Control Room Operators shall monitor the CCTV monitors and report any irregularities
- Security shall perform all other duties as per Standard Operating Procedures of SABC
- The Bidder shall ensure Control room administration and communicate with internal departmental functionaries and contractors regarding SABC rules and regulations

## General access duties

- Security officers shall man all main entrances leading into the building Per Standard Operating Procedures
- Security should monitor and control all access and egress points of building as per Standard Operating procedures

# **Monthly report**

The Bidder shall provide the Corporation with monthly reports at the end of each month.

## 10.3 ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- Preference points shall be calculated after process has been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices.
- Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

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## 10.4 Objective Criteria

- > The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay The SABC reserves the right not to award this tender to any bidder based on the proven poor record of accomplishment of the bidder in previous projects within the SABC.
- > The SABC will not award contract/s to the bidders who are blacklisted or have committed other acts of fraud and misrepresentation of facts e.g., tax compliance, company financials, etc. will be eliminated from the bid process.
- > The SABC reserve the right not to award this tender to any bidder who fails the financial stability assessment.
- No SABC former employees shall be awarded contracts with the SABC within 12 months after termination of employment with the SABC.
- Should employees resign or retire from the employment of the SABC and become directors of other businesses tendering with the SABC, such tender shall not be considered until the cooling off period of 12 (Twelve) months has expired.
- > Should the employee be dismissed from the SABC employment, such employee shall be prohibited from conducting business with SABC for a period of **5** (**Five**) years from the date of dismissal.
- > Should the employee be found guilty in a court of law due to criminal conduct/act, such employee will not be considered to do/conduct business with SABC, until the criminal record has been legally expunged.
- The SABC shall not procure any goods, services, works or Content from any Board member or Board member owned business, to ensure that suppliers competing for the SABC's business have confidence in the integrity of SABC's selection process.
- Should the SABC's Board members no longer serve on the SABC Board but become directors of other companies, the SABC shall not conduct business with those companies until the cooling off period of 12 (Twelve) months has expired.
- Should the Board member be found guilty in a court of law due to criminal conduct/act, such Board member will not be considered to do/conduct business with SABC, until the criminal record has been legally expunged.

## 11. COMMUNICATION

Respondents are warned that a response will be disqualified should any attempt be made by a tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer(s) or employees of SABC in respect of a tender, between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

All enquiries relating to this RFQ should be emailed three days before the closing date.

## 12. CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED WHEN TENDERING

• The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay any expenses or losses which may be incurred by the Tenderer in the preparation and delivery of his tender. The Corporation reserves the right to accept a separate tender or separate tenders for any one or more of the sections of a specification. The corporation also reserves the right to withdraw the tender at any stage.

- No tender shall be deemed to have been accepted unless or until a formal contract / letter of award is signed by both parties.
- The Corporation reserves the right to:
  - Make a selection solely on the information received in the submissions
  - ➤ Enter into negotiations with any one or more of preferred bidder(s) based on the criteria specified in the evaluation of this tender.
  - Contact any bidder during the evaluation process, in order to clarify any information, without informing any other bidders. During the evaluation process, no change in the content of the RFQ shall be sought, offered or permitted.
  - > Cancel this RFQ or any part thereof at any time.
- Should a bidder(s) be selected for further negotiations, they will be chosen on the basis of the greatest benefit to the Corporation and not necessarily on the basis of the lowest costs, aligned to the BEE & Price.

## 13. Cost of Bidding

The Tenderer shall bear all costs and expenses associated with preparation and submission of its tender or RFQ, and the Corporation shall under any circumstances be responsible or liable for any such costs, regardless of, without limitation, the outcome of the bidding, evaluation, and selection process.

### 14. PAYMENT TERMS

SABC will effect payment sixty (60) days after the service provider has rendered the service and submitted an invoice / statement.

## 1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:

  - the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

# 1.2 To be completed by the organ of state

## 2. DEFINITIONS
