2.2. Terms and Conditions for Bidding

2.2.1. Proprietary Information

2.2.1.1. TASEZ considers this tender and all related information, either written or verbal, which is provided to the respondent, to be proprietary to TASEZ. It shall be kept confidential by the respondent and its officers, employees, agents and representatives. The respondent shall not disclose, publish, or advertise this specification or related information to any third party without the prior written consent of TASEZ.

2.2.2. Enquiries and Communication

- 2.2.2.1. All communication and attempts to solicit information of any kind relative to this tender should be in writing and directed to: Email address: rfgs-rfps@tasez.co.za.
- 2.2.2.2. Clarification questions from Bidder will be closed <u>Five (5) Working</u> <u>Days</u> before the date of closure of the RFP. Note that the last date for request for information pertaining to this tender will be on the 22nd <u>September 2025</u>.
- 2.2.2.3. Bidders may not contact any other TASEZ employee besides contact person mentioned on Paragraph 2.2.2.1 above on any matter pertaining to the bid from the time when bid is advertised to the time the bid is awarded. Any effort by a bidder to influence bid evaluation, bid comparisons or bid award decisions in any manner, may result in rejection of the bid concerned.
- 2.2.2.4. All the documentation submitted in response to this tender must be in English.
- 2.2.2.5. The Bidder should check the numbers of the pages to satisfy themselves that none are missing or duplicated. No liability will be accepted by TASEZ in regard to anything arising from the fact that pages are missing or duplicated.

3. Scope of Work

The service provider shall provide an incident and nonconformity investigation and action management software; the software must have the following capabilities:

3.1. Logging of SHEQ issues

- 3.1.1. Allow for logging of SHEQ issues by providing limitless access to all TASEZ affected stakeholder using a desktop icon.
- 3.1.2. Allow the user to have options to report by select the following:
 - 3.1.2.1. Defect
 - 3.1.2.2. Incident
 - 3.1.2.3. Non-compliance
 - 3.1.2.4. Non-conformity
 - 3.1.2.5. Improvement action
- 3.1.3. Allow the user to describe the event and produce a Flash Report, the Flash report shall consist of the following information:
 - 3.1.3.1. The date and time of the incident
 - 3.1.3.2. The location of where the incident occurred
 - 3.1.3.3. The Division that incident fall under
 - 3.1.3.4. Pictures related to the incident
 - 3.1.3.5. The names of the affected person/s or people involved in the incident
 - 3.1.3.6. The equipment/substance involved
 - 3.1.3.7. The description of the incident
 - 3.1.3.8. The immediate actions that were taken to contain the incident
- 3.1.4. Send an email notification to the relevant supervisor to respond to the issue

3.2. Responding to SHEQ issues:

- 3.2.1. Allow the affected supervisor to classify the issue in accordance with the TASEZ SHE Matrix
- 3.2.2. Send an email notification of the Flash Report to the CEO and Executive Managers if the incident is classified as category A or B according to the TASEZ SHE Risk Matrix.
- 3.2.3. Allow the supervisor to assign an investigator within the system.

3.3. Investigation of SHEQ issues:

Allow the investigator to record the investigation as follows:

3.3.1. Capturing the investigation team members

- 3.3.2. Using the fishbone analysis to define the problem statement
- 3.3.3. Using the 5 WHY Cause Analysis identify and record the:
 - 3.3.3.1. Immediate Causes and
 - 3.3.3.2. Contributing Factors
- 3.3.4. Using the Root Cause Analysis Tool to identify the root-cause and the actions required to address the root cause of the issue.
- 3.3.5. Allow the Assignment of each action to a responsible person
- 3.3.6. Send an email notification to the assigned person of the action immediately after the action has been captured with the target date for closing the action
- 3.3.7. Send an email reminder to the assigned person seven (7) days prior to the target date for closing the action
- 3.3.8. Escalate the action to the supervisor if the target date for closing the action was not met via email
- 3.3.9. Allow the investigator to extend the target action date if there are substantial reasons provided by the supervisor to extend the date
- 3.3.10. Allow the action owners to upload documents/records that serve as evidence that the action has been implemented
- 3.3.11. Allow the investigator to close the incident once all actions have been completed.

3.4. Improvement actions

- 3.4.1. The system must allow for improvement actions to be directly entered into the system.
- 3.4.2. In capturing the action, the user must be able to stipulate the source of the action as follows:
 - 3.4.2.1. Audits
 - 3.4.2.1.1. Health and Safety Compliance Audits
 - 3.4.2.1.2. Environmental Compliance Audits
 - 3.4.2.2. Integrated Management System Audits (ISO 9001, 45001 & 14001)
 - 3.4.2.2.1. Internal Audits
 - 3.4.2.2.2. Certification Audits
 - 3.4.2.2.3. Surveillance Audits
 - 3.4.2.3. Inspections
 - 3.4.2.3.1. Health and Safety Inspections
 - 3.4.2.3.2. Environmental Inspections

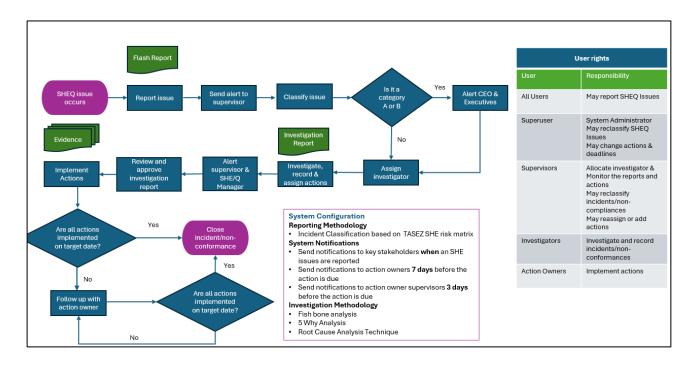
