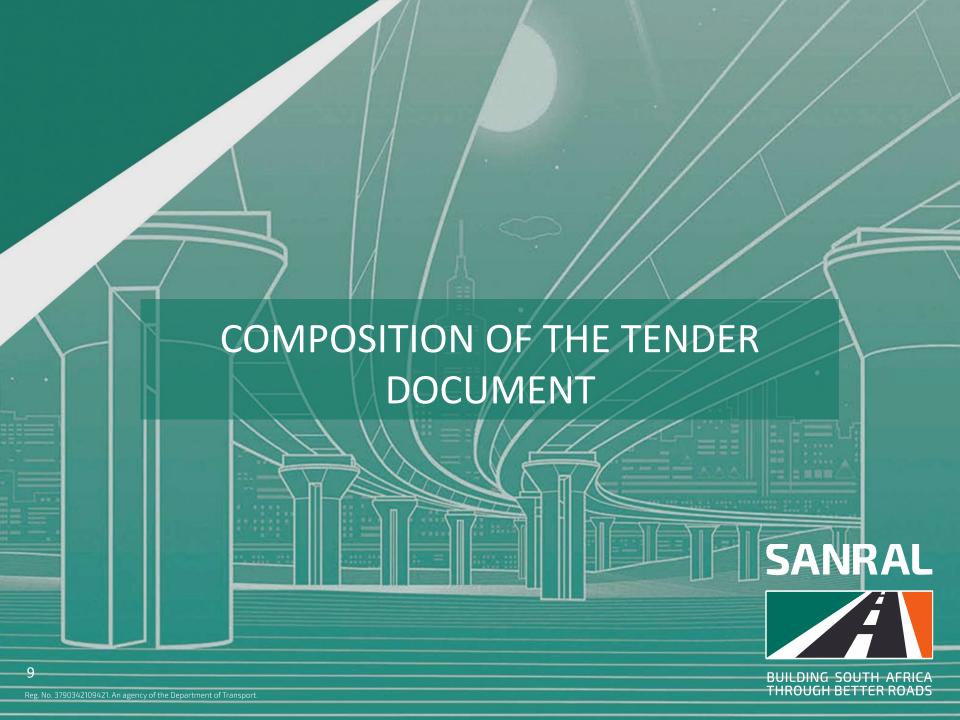

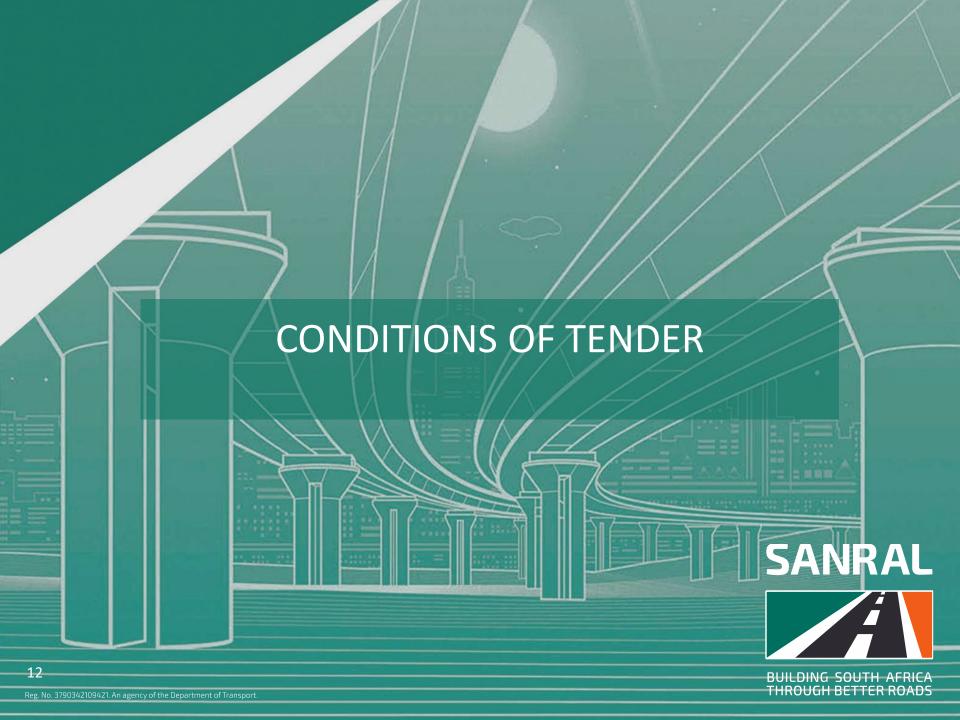

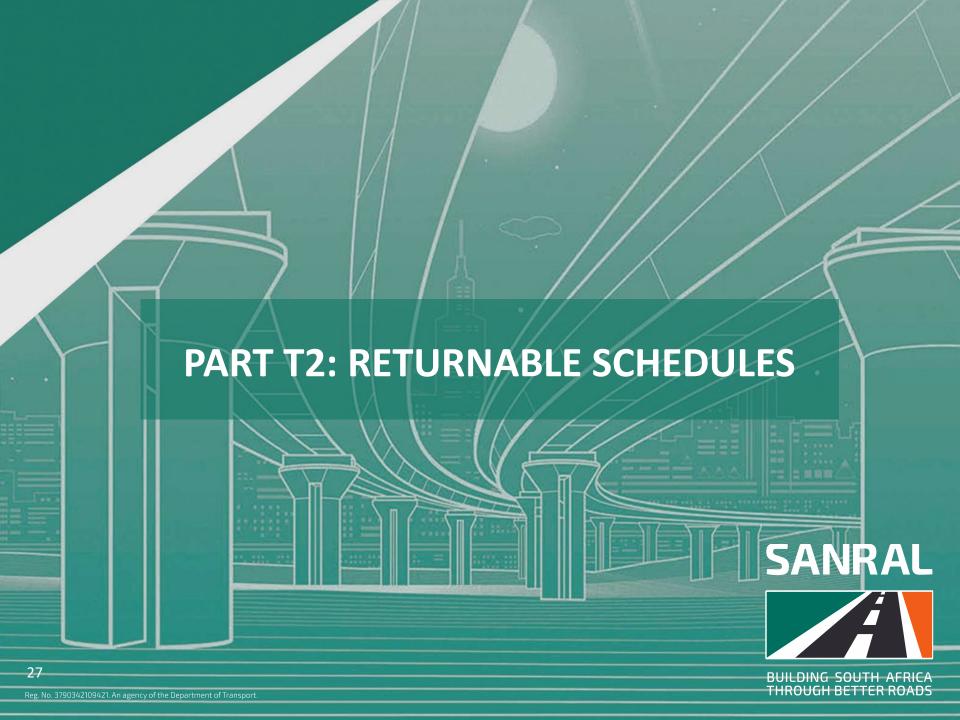

- a. the Employer shall inform the tenderer and give the tenderer an opportunity to make representations within 14 days as to why the tender submitted should not be disqualified and as to why the tenderer should not be restricted by the National Treasury from conducting any business with any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years;
- b. if the Employer has already entered into a contract with the Tenderer, the Employer has the discretionary right under FIDIC Particular Condition 15.2(g) to terminate the contract.

- a) detrimentally affect the scope, quality, or performance of the works, services or supply identified in the Scope of Work,
- b) significantly change the Employer's or the tenderer's risks and responsibilities under the contract, or
- c) affect the competitive position of other tenderers presenting responsive tenders, if it were to be rectified. Reject a non-responsive tender offer, and not allow it to be subsequently made responsive by correction or withdrawal of the non-conforming deviation or reservation.

The evaluation process will be based on functionality criteria. The criteria will be as follows:

Points allocated for Functionality shall be evaluated in accordance with the criteria as listed below. Total Quality points allocated shall be 100. Tenderer must score minimum score per each sub-criterion and an overall minimum threshold of 75 points out of 100 is required to be achieved for the tender to be eligible for further evaluation.
