TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) is a public entity listed in Schedule 3A of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA). It is mandated by the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) Act, 67 of 2008, to oversee the further development and implementation of the NQF, advance the objectives of the NQF and coordinate its three Sub-Frameworks.
- 1.2 SAQA is seeking the services of an experienced and reputable service provider to conduct training on the Asset Management for 5 delegates.

2. OBJECTIVES

2.1 This training aims to empower staff with practical knowledge of the Asset Management.

3. PURPOSE

3.1 The purpose of this Request for Quotation is to appoint a suitably qualified service provider to deliver training on the Asset Management to 5 delegates.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

- 4.1 The training should include but not be limited to the following training outcomes:
- 4.1.1 Understanding of asset management principles and best practices.
- 4.1.2 Ability to develop and implement asset management plans.
- 4.1.3 Knowledge of asset management systems and software.
- 4.1.4 Ability to identify and manage risks associated with asset management.
- 4.1.5 Knowledge of asset management regulations and standards.
- 4.1.6 Ability to develop and implement asset management policies and procedures.
- 4.1.7 Understanding of asset life cycle management.
- 4.1.8 Knowledge of asset management reporting and analytics.
- 4.1.9 Asset Inventory management entailing a comprehensive register of all assets including location, condition and performance data.
- 4.1.10 Best practices and controls over the physical asset and inventory count.

5. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND DELIVERABLES

- 5.1 The quotation presented to SAQA must include all costs and disbursements inclusive of VAT to train 5 delegates.
- 5.2 Bidders are required to submit a brochure or information on the Asset Management training, indicating the duration, training modules/ training outcomes and other information applicable to the training.

6. METHODOLOGY

6.1 The training must be delivered online on Microsoft Teams.

7. TIMELINES

7.1 The duration of the training is two days.

The bid will be evaluated in two (2) stages:

- a) Stage 1: Screening of mandatory documents.
- b) Stage 2: Price and Preference goals.

9.1 STAGE 1: MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

9.2 STAGE 2: PRICE AND PREFERENCE POINTS EVALUATION

All bidders that have passed the mandatory requirements will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 system prescribed by SAQA in line with PPR 2022 as follows:

- a) 80 Points for pricing.
- b) 15 Preference Points for the company that has at least 51% black ownership.
- c) **5** Preference Points for the company that has at least 30% black woman ownership.

- 11.1 Bidders must submit the recent National Treasury (CSD) Central Supplier Database's report.

- 11.5 In Instances, where brand names are mentioned, SAQA will accept equivalent items that have similar specifications.
- 11.6 The National Treasury's General Conditions of Contract (GCC) will apply and is enforceable on this RFQ.
- 11.7 The RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA).

- 1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:
 - the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
 - the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

DEFINITIONS

- (a) **"tender"** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **"price"** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) "tender for income-generating contracts" means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of incomegenerating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) "the Act" means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3.2. FORMULAE FOR DISPOSAL OR LEASING OF STATE ASSETS AND INCOME GENERATING PROCUREMENT

3.2.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
 - (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system, then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.

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- 4.6.  - iv) If the specific goals have been claimed or obtained on a fraudulent basis or any of the conditions of contract have not been fulfilled, the organ of state may, in addition to any other remedy it may have
 - (a) disqualify the person from the tendering process;
 - (b) recover costs, losses or damages it has incurred or suffered as a result of that person's conduct;
 - (c) cancel the contract and claim any damages which it has suffered as a result of having to make less favourable arrangements due to such cancellation;
 - (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
