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1. BACKGROUND

TASEZ is registered in terms of the Companies Act No 71 of 2008 and is an Operator of the Tshwane Automotive Special Economic Zone in terms of the Special Economic Zones Act 16 of 2014. TASEZ promotes, develops, operates and manages a special Economic Zone (SEZ) and has five divisions which are: Corporates Services, Finance, Business development, Infrastructure development and Zone Operations.

2. INIVITATION TO SUBMIT A QUOTATION

2.1. This Request for a Quotation (RFQ) is for the appointment to develop a comprehensive ICT strategy, outlining a clear vision, strategic initiatives, and an implementation plan to support TASEZ mission.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

TASEZ wishes to appoint a competent service provider to develop a comprehensive ICT strategy, outlining a clear vision, strategic initiatives, and an implementation plan to support TASEZ mission.

Conduct a full technology assessment:

Current Architectures – Establishment of a set of architectural products that describe and document the current state of TASEZ from business functions to technology infrastructure and sets the stage for establishing a plan for moving towards and measuring progress against target architecture.

Review and evaluate TASEZ current ICT strategies, policies, and frameworks.

Gap Analysis – Through gap analysis, the service provider must determine the components that need to be changed to achieve the desired end-state.

Produce a comprehensive report:

Deliver a detailed report outlining the current state of TASEZ technology environment

Highlight areas of risk and non-compliance, particularly focusing on technology governance and security weaknesses

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Provide actionable recommendations for improvements that can be implemented over the next three years.

Recommendations must be prioritized, with focus areas identified for early wins (quick fixes) and long-term investments

Cybersecurity Focus:

Given the recent cyberattack, include a thorough review of the cybersecurity infrastructure.

Identify existing vulnerabilities and recommend strategies to mitigate future risks.

Ensure that the report provides a roadmap for strengthening TASEZ cyber defenses and overall ICT resilience.

The service provider is required to:

- Comply with ISO 38500 (IT Governance), ISO 27001 (Information Security)
- Management Systems, COBIT and ITIL best practices.
- Have minimum 10 Years of experience in ICT strategy development and relevant
- academic qualifications in computer science, information Technology,
 cybersecurity or related field.

Have Professional certifications (any of the following):

- Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP)
- Certified Information Systems Auditor (CISA)
- Enterprise Architecture Certification (TOGAF)

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4. CONTACT AND COMMUNICATION

- 4.2. Clarification questions from bidders will be closed two (2) days before date of closure on the RFQ.
- 4.3. Any communication to an official in respect of the RFQ between the closing date and the award of the contract by the Bidders is prohibited.
- 4.4. If a Bidders finds or reasonably believes it has found any discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in this RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ (other than minor clerical matters), the Bidders must promptly notify TASEZ in writing of such discrepancy, ambiguity, error or inconsistency in order to afford TASEZ an opportunity to consider what corrective action is necessary (if any).
- 4.5. Any actual discrepancy, ambiguity, error, or inconsistency in the RFQ or any other information provided by TASEZ will, if possible, be corrected and provided to all Bidders without attribution to the Bidders who provided the written notice.
- 4.6. All people (including Bidders) obtaining or receiving the RFQ and any other information in connection with the RFQ must keep the contents of the RFQ and other such information confidential and not disclose or use the information except as required for the purpose of developing a response to the RFQ.
