1 INTRODUCTION TO SANPARKS

SANParks was initially established in terms of the now repealed National Parks Act, 57 of 1976 and continue to exist in terms of the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 57 of 2003; with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: 25 public entity.

Our vision is to have a world class system of sustainable National Parks reconnecting and inspiring society.

Our mandate is to deliver of Conservation Mandate by Excelling in the Management of a National Park System

Our mission is to develop, expand, manage and promote a system of sustainable national parks that represents biodiversity and heritage assets, through innovation and best practice for the just and equitable benefit of current and future generations.

3 BUSINESS UNIT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BID

In KNP, Conservation and Area Integrity Management unit will be responsible for this BID, as the end users all report to this department. A key deliverable for Conservation and Area Integrity Management is Fire Management for ecological, fire safety and compliance deliverable.

4 CONTEXT OF THIS PROCUREMENT

As part of the Savanna biome, Kruger National Park (KNP) is dependent on fires to maintain a healthy ecosystem. Veldfires are a natural and common phenomenon in KNP and the park uses fire as a land management tool to reduce the fire risk and improve the veld. Proactive use of fire in a fire-driven landscape such as KNP is important in order to limit the risk of large, unwanted wildfires later in the dry season as well as controlling and extinguishing fires that may threaten life and infrastructure. In compliance with the Greater Kruger FPA and the National Veld and Forest Act, in order to undertake safe and effective veld fire management our rangers must be provided with appropriate tools (equipment and PPE) to manage fires.

5 CONTRACT PERIOD

- Five (5) Years

6 SPECIAL CONDITIONS

6.1 Fire Trailer and Fire Bakkie Sakkie

- Delivery to Skukuza, in Kruger National Park.
- The quality of all equipment must have a SABS Approved Certification.
- Proof of Microdot installed on the trailer.
- 2 - year warranty for all components of the unit
- Trailer must be supplied with a roadworthy certificate.
- Operating systems such as the engine, pumps, hoses, nozzles and valves, must be the same or interchangeable for the trailer and bakkie sakkie.

SANParks appends Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) providing specific information relevant to a GCC clause that requires the addition of Special Conditions and Special Conditions specific to this bid contract is not part of the General Conditions of Contract. No clause in this document shall be in conflict with another clause. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions of the Special Conditions of Contract shall prevail.

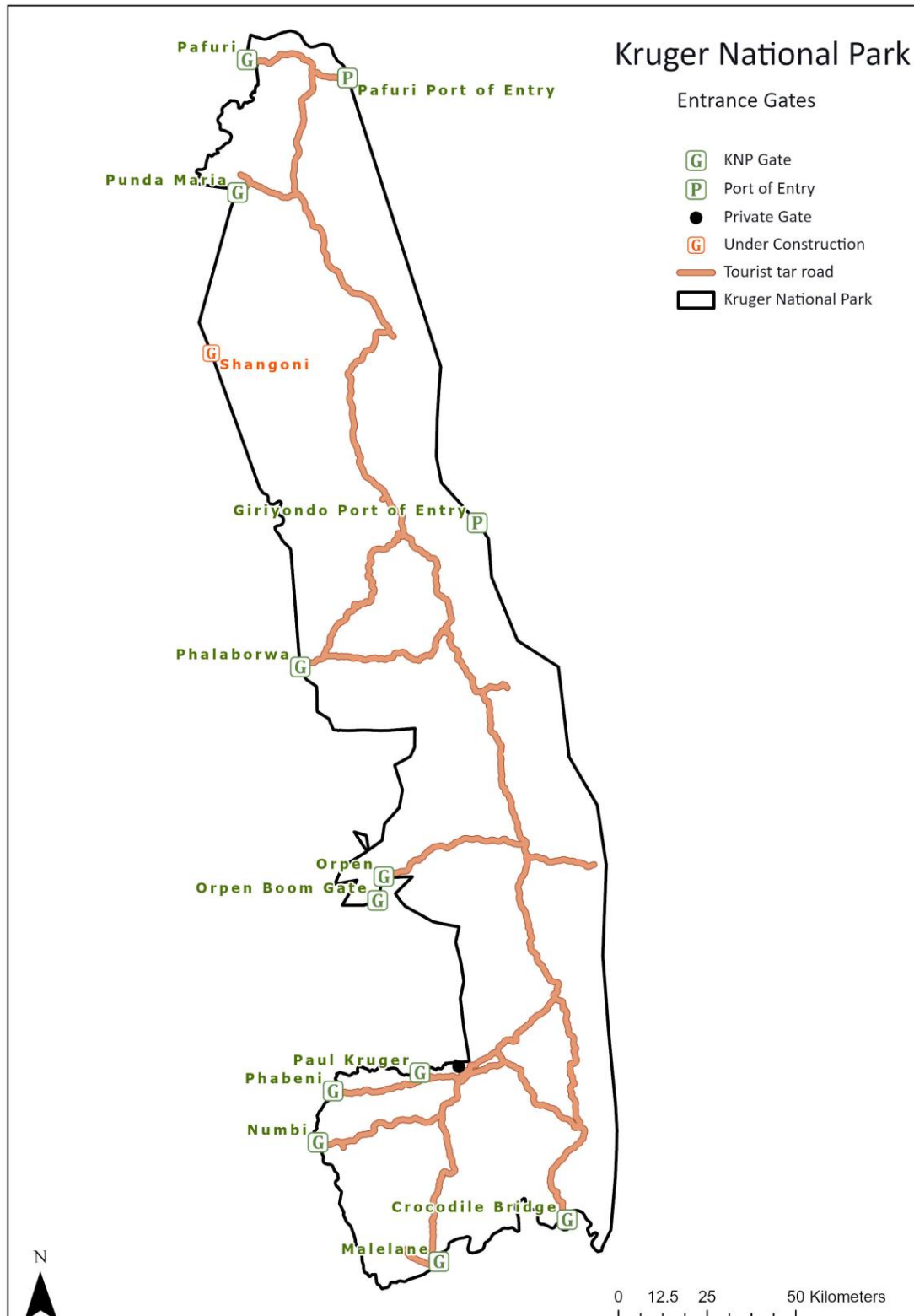
ANNEXURE C: MINIMUM SERVICING REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL EQUIPMENT

2. Change the

 - b. Oil filter
 - c. Air filter
3. Checks the following:

 - b. The seals where necessary and replace is required
 - c. The valve handles and replace if necessary
4. Final check that the equipment is running and sprayer is in working order (spraying at maximum pressure)
5. Any other part and service required

1. Before the annual service, an itemised service and repairs required for all equipment will be stipulated
2. All parts replaced to be left with the unit
