1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

During a recent audit conducted by Group Audit and Risk, a finding was raised regarding the fact that identifying the staff at nature reserves and resorts is problematic. Regarding this finding, it is necessary that key staff members in the Nature Conservation Operations Section and the Resorts Operations Section be issued with uniforms which should include shoulder epaulettes and specified branding.

The purpose of this tender is to advertise for and appoint a service provider for the measurement, supply, and delivery of uniforms for the Nature Conservation Operations Section and the Resorts Operations Section.

2. BACKGROUND

For the purposes of professionalism, visibility and uniformity, key staff members in the Nature Conservation Operations Section and the Resorts Operations Section have always been issued with uniforms. However, since these two sections were regionalised in 2013, but were returned to the Environment and Agriculture Management Department in 2017, this could not be done. In order to issue staff with a complete uniform and to ensure that the full specifications are complied with, the Environment and Agriculture Management Department decided to advertise a tender with the specifications of what is required.

3. PROJECT SCOPE

This request is for quotations to measure, supply and deliver uniforms for nature reserves and resorts. This includes suitable trousers, shirts, belts, boots, socks and epaulets. It is against this background that the Environment and Agriculture

Management Department presents the specifications for the appointment of a service provider.

The scope of work for the measurement, supply and delivery of the following uniform items for nature reserves and resorts is outlined as follows:

4. DELIVERABLES

The City of Tshwane calls for prospective service providers to bid for the supply and delivery of uniform for nature reserve and resort staff according to the specifications and pictures provided. This includes the following:

- Scheduling a size-measuring session for each person at a central point in each region
- Procuring the Uniform items
- Scheduling a fitting session for each person at a central point in each region
- Exchanging any ill-fitting clothing or items

Prospective bidders must have experience in and knowledge of providing uniform and must submit proof that the uniform complies with the set specifications.

5. STAGES OF EVALUATION

Stage 1: Administrative Compliance

Stage 2: Mandatory Requirements

Stage 3: Local Production and Content

Stage 4: Samples Evaluation

Stage 4: Preference Point System

5.1 ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLIANCE

All the bids will be evaluated against the administrative responsiveness requirements as set out in the list of returnable documents.

5.2 MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

The tenderer must include the following documentation with the tender document failure which will result in immediate disqualification:

- (i) Bidders to provide a proof that they have a SABS approved factory facility that can manufacture the required Uniform according to specification where applicable or provide a SABS Manufacturing Capability Report Certificate as proof that they have a SABS approved factory facility that can manufacture the required Uniform according to specification.
- (ii) Bidders to who are Intermediary supplier to provide written consent of manufacturer from the manufacturer to supply the required Uniform according to the specification.

5.3 LOCAL PRODUCTION AND CONTENT

- The City shall only accept locally (within South Africa) manufactured uniform. Should a supplier claim that there is no locally produced material available, the onus shall rest with the supplier to provide sufficient proof of such a claim.

- Bidders that do not meet a stipulated minimum threshold for local production and content will automatically be disqualified.

5.4 Sample Evaluation

Tenderers are required to provide material swatches for shirt and trouser. Material swatches are to be submitted with the quotation document.

5.5 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEM

The 80/20 preferential points system will be used in terms of the 2017 Regulations of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act 5 of 2000).

- 80 points for price
- 20 points for BBBEE status (the service provider must submit a certified copy of the BBBEE level rating certificate)

6. VALIDITY PERIOD

The validity period for the tender after closure is 90 days.

7. PRICING SCHEDULE

Bidders must provide the measurement consultation, delivery and fitting at various sites across all seven regions of Tshwane.

Prices must be exact and fixed as no price increases will be considered over the year.

All items must be bid on, otherwise the bid will not be considered. The bid will be awarded as a whole.

Specifications must be considered and no deviations will be allowed.

8. MARKET ANALYSIS

The city of Tshwane reserves the right to conduct market analysis. Should the city exercise this option, where a tenderer offers a price that is deemed not to be viable to supply goods or services as required, written confirmation will be made with the tenderer if they will be able to deliver on the price, if a tenderer confirm that they cannot, the tenderer will be disqualified on the basis of being non-responsive. If they confirm that they can deliver, a tight contract to mitigate the risk of non-performance will be entered into with the service provider. Further action on failures by the supplier to deliver will be handled in terms of the contract including performance warnings and listing on the database of restricted suppliers.

The city further reserves the right to negotiate a market related price with a tenderer scoring the highest points. If the tenderer does not agree to a market-related price, the city reserves the right to negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the second highest points, if the tenderer scoring the second highest points does not agree to a market-related price, negotiate a market-related price with the tenderer scoring the third highest points. If a market-related price is not agreed, the city reserves the right to cancel the quotation.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION
