3 **PROPOSAL SUBMISSION**

Transnet has implemented a new electronic tender submission system, the e-Tender Submission Portal, in line with the overall Transnet digitalization strategy where suppliers can view advertised tenders, register their information, log their intent to respond to bids and upload their bid proposals/responses on to the system.

- a) The Transnet e-Tender Submission Portal can be accessed as follows:
 - a) Log the Transnet eTenders **Portal** management platform website/ (transnetetenders.azurewebsites.net)
 - b) Click on "ADVERTISED TENDERS" to view advertised tenders;
 - c) Click on "SIGN IN/REGISTER -to register new bidder information and ensure that all mandatory information is completed) OR;
 - d) to sign in if already registered;
 - e) Toggle (click to switch) the "Log an Intent" button to submit a bid;
 - Submit bid documents by uploading them into the system against each tender selected.

- g) Respondents are to submit bid documents by uploading them onto the Transnet system against each tender selected. A Bidder can upload 30mb per upload and multiple uploads are permitted.

In other words, each bidder must register the intent to bid and submit its bid through its own profile under the same company name that will eventually bid for the tender. No company shall submit a bid on behalf of another company regardless of the company being a subsidiary or holding company.
- I) In case of a Joint Venture, any of the parties/companies to the Joint Venture may use its registered profile to submit a bid on behalf of the Joint Venture.

4 RFP INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.1 Please sign documents [sign, stamp and date the bottom of each page] before uploading them on the system. The person or persons signing the submission must be legally authorised by the respondent to do so.
- 4.2 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Section 5] must be returned with proposals.
- 4.3 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.
- 4.4 Any additional conditions must be embodied in an accompanying letter. Subject only to clause 15 [Alterations made by the Respondent to Bid Prices] of the General Bid Conditions, paragraph 12 below (Legal Review) and Section 6 of the RFP, alterations, additions or deletions must not be made by the Respondent to the actual RFP documents.

5 JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

Respondents who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Respondents must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If at the time of the bid submission such a JV or consortium agreement has not been concluded, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by Transnet through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to Transnet.

Respondent's Signature

Respondents are to note that for the purpose of Evaluation, a JV will be evaluated based on one consolidated B-BBEE score card (a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level verification certificate) Preference points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the specific goals requirements in accordance with the table indicated in Section 4.1 of the specific goals Claim Form.

6 COMMUNICATION (CLARIFICATIONS AND COMPLAINTS)

Once the complaint has been submitted, the Transnet SCM Complaints office will acknowledge your complaint and send you a complaint form for completion.

- 6.4 Respondents are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 6.5 It is prohibited for Respondents to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of Transnet in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 6.6 Respondents found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.
- 6.7 Transnet will publish the outcome of this RFP in the National Treasury e-tender portal and Transnet website with 10 days after the award has been finalised. Respondents are required to check the National Treasury e-tender Portal and Transnet website for the results of the tender process. All unsuccessful bidders have a right to request Transnet to furnish reasons for their bid not being successful. This requested must be directed to the contact person stated in the SBD 1 form

7 CONFIDENTIALITY

All information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Respondents are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any information related to this RFP or the subsequent contract, written approval must be obtained from Transnet.

8 COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent [hereinafter referred to as the [**Supplier/Service provider**] shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

9 EMPLOYMENT EQUITY ACT

Respondents must comply with the requirements of the Employment Equity Act 55 of 1998 applicable to it including (but not limited to) Section 53 of the Employment Equity Act.

10 DISCLAIMERS

Respondents are hereby advised that Transnet is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that Transnet reserves the right to:

- 10.1 modify the RFP's Goods/Services;
- 10.2 award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 10.3 award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- 10.4 split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service provider, as may be explicitly articulated in the conditions or objective criteria to this RFP;
- 10.5 cancel the bid process;
- 10.6 validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Transnet to do so;
- 10.7 request audited financial statements or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;
- 10.8 not accept any changes or purported changes by the Respondent to the bid rates after the closing date and/or after the award of the business, unless the contract specifically provided for it;
- 10.9 to cancel the contract and/request that National Treasury place the Respondent on its Database of Restricted Suppliers for a period not exceeding 10 years, on the basis that a contract was awarded on the strength of incorrect information furnished by the Respondent or on any other basis recognised in law;
- 10.10 to award the business to the next ranked bidder, provided that he/she is still prepared to provide the required Goods at the quoted price, should the preferred bidder fail to sign or commence with the contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so. - 10.11 Request a bidder to furnish further information relating to its Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) standing at any stage of the procurement or contracting process. This information may not be used for purposes of evaluation and/or disqualify bidder, but may be use for purpose of record and analysis of ESG compliance.

SECTION 3: BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1 BACKGROUND




Figure 1: Rail Network Classification and Operational Corridors

Transnet Rail Infrastructure Manager (TRIM), a Division of Transnet, is the owner of the rail network in South Africa. Its operations spans across approximately 20 000 km of lines with varying axle loading, electrification and train authorisation systems. The network is classified into the core network and branch line network (including closed and lifted lines) informed by the network profile and traffic density highlighted in **Figure 1**.

- **1.1** The rail infrastructure is a system comprising three basic components:
 - The capacity of the network: expressed in usable train paths (slots) during a defined time period, determined by the network configuration.
 - The substance of the network: referring to the average remaining lifetime of the individual network components. A high substance for example means that a component is new.
 - The quality of infrastructure: expressed as network availability and reliability.
- 1.2 The rail infrastructure system in South Africa is vulnerable and is characterised by a lengthy period of under investment which has generally resulted in aged assets of varying condition and reliability leading to a systematic decrease in throughput.
- 1.3 At present large areas of the rail infrastructure are either aging or underperforming and there is a need for a targeted technical assessment to validate the existing maintenance plans (Copex and sustainable capital) and costings. The result of this independent technical assessment may also form a base for funding applications and potential private-sector participation (PSP) exercises.

1.4 Northeast Corridor

The Northeast corridor is strategically located to connect SADC regions such as Eswatini, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Zambia, and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Commodities are transported through various border posts or entry gates, including Komatipoort, Golela, Beitbridge, Livingstone, and Sakania. Commodities railed on the Northeast Corridor include magnetite, chrome, coal, rock-phosphate, fuel, ferrochrome, and citrus.

The North-East corridor stretches from the Limpopo River in Beitbridge, Limpopo province, through Komatipoort, and down to Richards Bay on the East coast. Operations include the transportation of high-yielding freight on three prominent linear flows (Pit to Port), which are defined as follows:

- Phalaborwa to Maputo and Richards Bay, mainly transporting Magnetite and Rock Phosphate for export markets
- Witbank to Maputo, mainly transporting Chrome and Coal for export markets
- Witbank to Richards Bay, transporting coal and chrome for export markets.

1.5 Central Corridor

The CentralCor is located in the heart of the Freight Rail network, connecting to four other corridors. Geographically, it covers three provinces: Gauteng, Free State, and the Northwest. The corridor, which connects Mafikeng to Krugersdorp and Vryburg via rail lines, is critical to the north-south interface in landlocked Botswana, promoting regional integration.

Rail Traffic traverse the Central Corridor to the ports of Maputo, Richards Bay, Durban, Ggeberha, and Cape Town, with an 18-ton-per-axle branch line network serving the Northwest Province's maize triangle (Klerksdorp, Lichtenburg, Coligny, and Vryburg). It also supports the manufacturing industry, particularly the automotive sector, by providing rail connections and services to the automotive hub and container terminal in Rosslyn, Pretoria. This corridor enable the transportation of commodities such as chrome, coal, iron ore, manganese, and time-sensitive container and vehicle traffic.

1.6 **Cape Corridor**

- The Cape Corridor stretches from Warrenton in the Northern Cape to Cape Town in the South. Railway lines from the key mining area surrounding Hotazel in the Northern Cape also connect to the ports of Ggeberha and Nggura in the South-East, providing the primary export channel for South Africa's manganese exports. In addition to its core commodity, Cape Corridor has a broad focus on general freight and agriculture commodities. Domestic iron ore, cement, nonferrous metals, containers, titanium, lime, malt, barley, grain, fertilizer, zirconium, automobiles, wheat, and maize are among the commodities hauled. Rail corridor links between mines and the Central Corridor also enable the transportation of manganese and iron ore for domestic markets.
- 1.6.2 The route includes sections of the Vereeniging-Bloemfontein-East London and Gqeberha routes, as well as branch lines such as Bellville-Bitterfontein and De Aar-Upington. It also includes a rail line linking the Port of Cape Town to the Reef.
- 1.6.3 The corridor presents opportunities for economic growth and is focused on enabling initiatives to grow automotive, containerized fruit, manganese, and cement volumes, amongst others. Growth opportunities also lie in cross-border traffic to Namibia for mining commodities, as well as opportunities for container trade from agricultural industries. The Cape Corridor operates mostly with a 20-ton axle

load. Currently 104-wagon manganese trains operate between the Northern Cape mines and the Ggeberha ports.

2 EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Whereas Transnet is seeking a partner(s) to provide solutions for conducting desktop study for rail infrastructure asset condition assessment and cost validation of the copex and sustainable capex scope for Transnet Rail Infrastructure Manager (TRIM) in the northeast, central and cape corridors for a period of three (03) months it also seeks to improve its current processes for providing these Goods/Services to its end user community throughout its locations.

The selected Service provider must share in the mission and business objectives of Transnet. These mutual goals will be met by meeting contractual requirements and new challenges in an environment of teamwork, joint participation, flexibility, innovation and open communications. In this spirit of partnership, Transnet and its Service provider(s) will study the current ways they do business to enhance current practices and support processes and systems. Such a partnership will allow Transnet to reach higher levels of quality, service and profitability.

Specifically, Transnet seeks to benefit from this partnership in the following ways:

- 2.1 Transnet must receive reduced cost of acquisition and improved service benefits resulting from the Supplier/Service provider's economies of scale and streamlined service processes.
- 2.2 Transnet must achieve appropriate availability that meets user needs while reducing costs for both Transnet and the chosen Supplier/Service provider(s).
- 2.3 Transnet must receive proactive improvements from the Supplier/Service provider with respect to supply/provision of Goods/Services and related processes.
- 2.4 Transnet's overall competitive advantage must be strengthened by the chosen Supplier/Service provider's leading edge technology and service delivery systems.
- 2.5 Transnet end users must be able to rely on the chosen Supplier/Service provider's personnel for service enquiries, recommendations and substitutions.
- 2.6 Transnet must reduce costs by streamlining its acquisition of Goods/Services, including managed service processes on a Group basis.

3 SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

The work packages for the identified corridors were based on asset condition assessment results. The detailed findings on defects and deterioration of asset condition were used to determine the scope of works to restore the network to its nameplate capacity. The assessment results were evaluated against the Transnet Asset Maintenance Principles and Procedures (AMPP) rating guide. AMPP defines refurbishment procedures for various asset types while also aligning asset life cycle management, risk mitigation, and cost effectiveness. This process ensures that the asset's condition and identified issues comply with Transnet's maintenance standards and priorities.

The service provider will be required to:

- 3.1 Conduct random field inspections to validate the rail infrastructure asset condition assessment measurement data.
- 3.2 Validate the current infrastructure Copex and Sustainable Capex scope; derived from the existing condition assessment data.
- 3.3 Validate the costing done by TRIM on the Copex and Sustainable Capex scope.
- 3.4 Development of a desktop implementation plan for completing the required refurbishments, targeted maintenance or upgrades.
- 3.5 In summary, the outcome of the desktop study should inform the acceptability of the current condition assessment data and validate the existing scope and costings.

4 RAIL INFRASTRUCTURE

4.1 Mainline

- 4.1.1 South Africa's railway mainlines consist of heavy haul lines and general freight lines. A typical railway infrastructure includes the following subsystems: telecommunications, electrical (OHTE and substations), train authorization systems, condition assessment systems, civil structures (bridges, culverts, and tunnels), and permanent way (perway), also known as track, as well as some off-track assets.
- 4.1.2 The rise in theft and vandalism has left the network in a poor state. Increased theft and vandalism of rail infrastructure equipment are the primary causes of section failures and unreliable train operations, particularly on general freight lines. Large-scale theft of OHTE and traction substation equipment has caused a significant impact on train service, with systemic volume losses. Rampant signalling theft causes a fall-back to manual train operations, with increased risk of collisions. It also causes longer transit times (and increased wagon turnaround time) and the loss of train slots capacity, directly reducing volumes. Theft of perway components can cause derailments. The repairs of these items took away maintenance resources, that has in part led to under-maintenance of assets as well as much increased transit times. Derailments and collisions disrupt services and result in significant financial losses for TRIM. Rail is an important part of South Africa's national transportation infrastructure, connecting the majority of the country's cities and outlying manufacturing areas. South Africa's railway network is critical to economic growth and development. South Africa's railway network is critical for economic growth and development.
- 4.1.3 TRIM's mandate to the industry is to improve rail infrastructure resilience by increasing its ability to withstand potential threats as well as the system's ability to recover quickly from disruptive events.

Corridor approach

4.1.4 Transnet's rail strategy uses a corridor approach to improve efficiency, increase freight volumes, and enable private sector participation (PSP). Each corridor focuses on specific high-volume commodities and markets. This approach aims to maximise the movement of core commodities for export, domestic, and regional markets. The overview of each corridor is detailed below:

4.2 Northeast Corridor




Figure 2: North-East Corridor rail infrastructure

4.2.1 The North-East Corridor is responsible for maintaining more than 2000 single track kilometres of rail infrastructure. Figure 2 shows the layout of the North-East Corridor rail infrastructure. The business currently runs 50 wagon train length on section between Witbank to Kaapmuiden and 80 wagon train length on the section from Phalaborwa to Komatipoort. The section between Witbank and Komatipoort operates on both diesel and electric locomotives as is it the only section which is energised which 3kV DC overhead.

4.3 Central Corridor




Figure 3: Central Corridor rail infrastructure

- 4.3.1 Rail Traffic traverse the Central Corridor to the ports of Maputo, Richards Bay, Durban, Gqeberha, and Cape Town, with an 18-ton-per-axle branch line network serving the Northwest Province's maize triangle (Klerksdorp, Lichtenburg, Coligny, and Vryburg). It also supports the manufacturing industry, particularly the automotive sector, by providing rail connections and services to the automotive hub and container terminal in Rosslyn, Pretoria. This corridor transports commodities such as chrome, coal, iron ore, manganese, and time-sensitive container and vehicle traffic.
- 4.3.2 This promotes regional integration while also providing a critical North-South connection through Botswana via the Krugersdorp and Mahikeng diesel lines. It operates a network with branch line infrastructure that serves the maize-triangle region, including Lichtenburg, Coligny, and Vryburg. Sentrarand, Isando, Klerksdorp, and Potchefstroom serve as through traffic and enabling areas. Its forwarding traffic comes from Mafikeng, Lichtenburg, Vereeniging, Botswana, Pretoria, and Krugersdorp. **Table 1** summarizes Central Corridors railway infrastructure.

4.4 Cape Corridor




Figure 4: Cape Corridor rail infrastructure

- 4.4.1 The Cape Corridor consists of approximately 5 579 kilometres of track and is one of the country's most crucial railway lines. The manganese 'backbone' from Hotazel to Gqeberha via Kimberley De Aar section stretches over 1 091 km of route distance; and is responsible for 70% of the volumes transported on the Cape Corridor. Figure 4 outlines the location of the routes on the Cape Corridor and highlights the Manganese Export Line section (a key strategic manganese export enabler). The Cape Corridor operates on mostly a 20-ton axle load. Currently 104-wagon trains are operated and the port, with other volumes mostly running as 40-wagon to 50-wagon trains.
- 4.4.2 The Cape Corridor's electrified sections are at 3kV direct current (DC) or 25kV alternating current (AC), with most of the lower-volume lines being unelectrified.


