EVALUATION CRITERIA

The bids will be evaluated and adjudicated in terms of the **80/20** Preference Point System prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act No. 5 of 2000, pertaining to Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022, as well as the Joe Gqabi District Municipality's Supply Chain Management Policy – 80 points will account for price and 20 points relating to specific goals. Additionally to bid document completeness check and compliance with any tender conditions, bids will be subjected to functionality criteria and bids that scores less than 45 out of 60 points will be considered non-responsive.



BIDDERS SHALL TAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING BID CONDITIONS:

1. JGDM shall not do business with any person in the service of the state.
2. Bidders must be registered on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD).
3. The Joe Gqabi District Municipality Supply Chain Management Policy will apply.
4. The Joe Gqabi District Municipality does not bind itself to accept the lowest bid or any other bid and reserves the right to accept the whole or part of the bid and to award to more than one bidder.
5. The Joe Gqabi District Municipality reserves the right to appoint more than one service provider.
6. Bids which are late, incomplete, unsigned or submitted by facsimile or electronically, will not be accepted.
7. All pages must be signed where necessary.
8. The completed and signed bid document must be submitted as original.
9. Additional annexure(s) is / are accepted only if cross referencing has been done and the page signed.
10. Bids submitted are to hold good for a period of 90 days.
11. Maximum points of 20 points will be awarded to tender for specific goals for the Tenderer. Points scored on specific goals will be added to the points scored for price.
12. SARS pin and Tax Reference Number to be declared in the bid (cover page of the bid document). In the case of a Trust, Joint Venture, or Consortium each party to a Trust / Joint Venture/Consortium should submit a separate Tax Clearance Certificate
13. Bid documents must remain intact
14. TERMS OF REFERENCE / SPECIFICATIONS

1. **PROJECT BRIEF**

Financial proposals are invited from potential service providers with proven municipal financial expertise in the field of asset management to assist the Joe Gqabi District Municipality (JGDM) in updating and maintaining the existing Fixed Asset Register (FAR) compliant to GRAP 17 and the valuation of newly acquired assets as per is Directive 7 issued by the ASB, for a period of 3 (three) financial years commencing on the date of appointment.

The purpose of the appointment is to carry out the wide range of asset management related tasks (as set out in the Scope of Work below) for the financial years 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26. The municipality's final audit report is released by the Auditor General (AG) usually towards the end of November each year. For this reason, this contract will run to the end of November 2026 (irrespective of the starting date) to provide for sufficient time in the event the appointed service provider must assist the JGDM with any queries from the AG.

2. **BACKGROUND**

The JGDM has received the following audit outcomes for the last five years:

- 2017/18 - Un-qualified with no audit findings (Clean)
- 2018/19 – Un-qualified with non-compliance findings
- 2019/20 - Un-qualified with non-compliance findings
- 2020/21 - Un-qualified with no audit findings (Clean)
- 2021/22 - Un-qualified with no audit findings (Clean)

With regards to the GRAP 17 compliant Fixed Asset Register, the JGDM received the following audit outcomes for the last five years:

- 2017/18 – Un-qualified with no audit findings
- 2018/19 – Un-qualified with no audit findings
- 2019/20 - Un-qualified with no audit findings
- 2020/21 - Un-qualified with no audit findings
- 2021/22 - Un-qualified with no audit findings

As evidenced by the audit outcomes above, the JGDM is fully committed to good governance. The JGDM is therefore looking to partner with a suitably experienced, committed and competent service provider to ensure that the fixed asset management component of the municipality is maintained in good order.

3. **EXISTING FIXED ASSET REGISTER (FAR)**

The existing FAR is in the format of an MS EXCEL Spreadsheet and consists of assets related to Water Services (water and sanitation). The JGDM had more than 44 000 assets recorded on the fixed asset register (FAR) at the end of the 2021/22 financial year. The reported net book value (NBV) of these assets is in excess of R1,120 billion.

These assets are located in all areas where the municipality has a footprint. It includes the rural areas of Senqu and Elundini local municipalities, as well as the towns of:

- Mt. Fletcher
- Maclear
- Ugie
- Barkly East
- Rossouw
- Rhodes
- Lady Grey
- Sterkspruit

- Aliwal North
- Jamestown
- Burgerdorp
- Steynsburg
- Venterstad; and
- Oviston

Whenever required, throughout the contract period, JGDM will provide the service provider with:

- all relevant day-to-day maintenance information and documentation,
- all financial information required to perform asset management tasks as detailed in the Scope of Work,
- all information and documentation to support and strengthen the work of the service provider.

All bidders will be provided with an electronic copy of the Fixed Asset Register (FAR) as at end June 2022, as audited by the Auditor General.

4. WATER LOSS REPORT

The tasks of the service provider will include water loss investigations on all existing water systems as well as the compilation of an annual report on water losses and costs related thereto, which results will be included in the Annual Financial Statements of the municipality.

All bidders will be provided with an electronic copy of the Water Loss Report as at end June 2022, as audited by the Auditor General.

5. EXPERTISE OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

The service provider should possess the expertise in the fields required to perform the necessary tasks related asset management tasks (as detailed in the scope of work below) such as accountancy and engineering in the built environment.

The JGDM has set the minimum pre-qualification for potential bidders to be as follows:

Management of the FAR at an institution where the following was achieved:

- ***At least two unqualified audit opinions where there were no findings of a material nature on infrastructure assets***
- ***Assets worth at least R0,5 billion rand***
- ***GRAP compliant***
- ***Where the audit results were achieved at a Water Services Institution***

Bidders, who provide proof and comply with this minimum pre-qualification condition, need not submit any further supporting documents such as staff structure, CV's of staff, etc. The compliance with the minimum pre-qualification criteria will provide sufficient proof to the municipality that the tenderer, as an institution/company/business, possesses the necessary capacity, skills and experience.

6. REPORTING FORMAT

The service provider will provide the FAR and the Water Loss Assessment Reports in the existing format which has been tried and tested and which formats have been found to be acceptable to JGDM and by the Auditor General for audit purposes. However, the municipality is open to format changes suggested by the successful bidder, dependant on such new proposed formats meeting the desired compliance standards.

7. PROJECT PROGRAMME

Upon accepting appointment, within 30 days, the service provider will submit to JGDM, for approval, a detailed programme showing the relevant scope of work to be completed for the 2023/24 Annual Financial Statements.

Within 60 days after accepting the appointment, the service provider will submit to JGDM, for approval, a detailed programme for the tasks to be performed over the duration of the contract of 3 years.

8. SKILLS TRANSFER

The service provider will ensure that asset management officials are trained on the job and skills are transferred to officials during the period of the contract.

The service provider will provide to the JGDM, for approval, within 60 days of accepting appointment, a long term skills transfer programme for the 3 years. It will be required that the service provider submit progress reports and as well as proof of skills transferred during the contract period, for audit purposes.

9. PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Performance of the service provider will be assessed on meeting of the following targets:

- Provide final updated FAR for inclusion in the Annual Financial Statements by mid- August (between the 15th and 20th) each year for the duration of the contract,
- Provide final updated Water Loss Report for inclusion in the Annual Financial Statements by mid-August (between 15th and 20th) each year for the duration of the contract,
- Provide responses to the Auditor General within the specified time period as given to the service provider for each audit query/request for information received.

These performance targets are critical for maintaining the municipality's good audit status, and therefore the JGDM will reserve the right to terminate the contract should the service provider fail to meet these performance targets.

10. PROJECT PROGRESS MEETINGS AND REPORTING

The service provider will arrange regular progress meetings and ad-hoc meetings requested by JGDM, and produce formal minutes of meetings within 14 days of the meeting.

The service provider will submit at least monthly, progress reports to the municipality by the 10th of each month. The municipality may request ad-hoc progress reports from the service provider at any time.

SCOPE OF WORK : INFRASTRUCTURE ASSETS AND WATER LOSS ASSESSMENT

1. Water loss assessment:

- Prepare annual report on water losses to compliment the information to be included in the Annual Financial statements.
- Provide a high level analysis to determine the current water loss situation within the JGDM, focussing on:
 - ✓ Assessing the current level of service
 - ✓ Determining the water losses across the entire system
 - ✓ Using "Best Practice" guidelines to assess the system
 - ✓ Determine the cost of services for the district as well as per local municipal area
 - ✓ Provide suitable reasons to explain different cost
 - ✓ Assisting the JGDM in conforming with the DWS requirements on evaluating losses
 - ✓ Outlining of a WCDMP that will help in improving the system
 - ✓ Recommending improvements to JGDM's current water infrastructure to advance water use monitoring
- The above mentioned must be in accordance with the Integrated Development Plan and conform to current applicable regulation.

2. Fixed asset register: Assets under construction/work in progress (WIP):

(All WIP expenditure information will be provided by the JGDM after closing of financial system)

- Update the WIP register and componentise each project to ensure compliance to the amended GRAP 17 and determine their completion status to date
- Physical verification of all the assets on projects that are still under construction
- Review current useful life of each asset
- Determine conditions and residual values of assets
- Update and link the GIS database to the WIP register Fixed Assets to ensure that assets recorded in the WIP register are easily traceable on the GIS
- Submit shape files with spatial data for assets on the register and maps to assist locating assets
- Total value of payments on the project be reconciled with payment vouchers
- Unbundling of work in progress in line with GRAP 17, suitable for audit purposes

3. Existing infrastructure fixed assets register (FAR):

- Verify all the infrastructure assets and accurately record their locations and conditions to ensure existence of the assets and completeness of the FAR
- The verification process will include a number of assets that are situated in various areas of the Joe Gqabi District Municipality. It will cover the following areas:
 - ✓ Walter Sisulu Local area
 - ✓ Senqu Local area
 - ✓ Elundini Local area
- Where assets do not have historical costs, fair values are to be determined
- Review current useful life of each asset and ensure that changes are affected on the fixed asset register in line with GRAP 17
- Determine conditions and residual values of assets
- Update and link the GIS database to the WIP register Fixed Assets to ensure that assets recorded in the WIP register are easily traceable on the GIS
- Submit shape files with spatial data for assets on the register and maps to assist locating assets.
- Facilitate the bar coding of fixed assets, JGDM will provide the necessary bar coding equipment such as plates and readers, etc.
- Develop, review and update the Fixed Asset Register Policy.
- Develop, review and update the Asset Management Strategy (AMS).
- Develop, review and update the Asset Management Plan (AMP).

4. Unbundling of new assets

- Identify and reconcile all completed projects to the payment certificates and unbundle all completed projects from for each financial year. Ensure that all assets acquired after the start of the financial year (1 July) and at the end of the financial year (30 June) are properly valued.
- Liaise with all relevant Consultants where projects have been completed to obtain all relevant information and documentation in order to unbundle those projects and componentize new assets.

5. Impairment and depreciation:

- Assess all the assets for indicators of impairment and compute their recoverable amounts
- Identify and record impairments and write-offs
- Review assets that have reached and RUL of 2 years and physically verify those assets in order to assess their conditions
- Keep a record the work performed in assessment (audit file)

6. Assist with all audit queries relating to the infrastructure assets:

- Assist in responding to AG queries, findings and submission of information
- Clear all prior year audit findings if applicable

The draft Asset register must be submitted by 31 July and the final by asset register by mid-August annually.

7. Progress monitoring and reporting:

The appointed service provider will be expected to:

- Prepare progress reports
- Arrange and facilitate progress meetings
- Prepare methodology statements for audit purposes
- Prepare a detailed project plan

8. Skills transfer:

The successful bidder will be required to transfer skills on the unbundling of capital projects and updating of the infrastructure asset register. A skills transfer plan must be compiled and progress reported thereon.

PRICING INSTRUCTION

PRE-AMBLE OF THE PRICING SCHEDULE

- a. Bidders shall calculate their prices for the various stages of 'Services' as detailed in Pricing Schedule below.

All rates and prices quoted in the 'Pricing Schedule' shall be in South African Rands and whole cents. Fractions of a cent shall be discarded.

b. DISBURSEMENTS:

Disbursements will be capped to the following:

- **Accommodation will be allowed to a maximum of R1000 per person per night when it is required to sleep over, inclusive of meals (Proof of actual expenditures to be attached to claims).**
- **Travel cost will be in accordance with Department of Transport rates as revised monthly.**

The service provider will obtain written approval from the designated Head of Department prior to making any travel and accommodation arrangements throughout the contract period.

- c. Bidders must complete the tables for YEAR 1, YEAR 2 and YEAR 3. The sub-total for each year must then be carried over to the SUMMARY table in order to obtain the TOTAL BID PRICE (exclusive of contingencies and VAT).
- d. Once calculated, add 10% contingencies to the TOTAL BID PRICE (exclusive of VAT).
- e. Finally, add 15% VAT in order to calculate the FINAL TOTAL BID PRICE. This price will constitute the tender offer (inclusive of 10% contingencies and 15% VAT).

LUMP SUM & HOURLY RATES

There will be a combination of Lump Sum items and Hourly Rates (time & cost) items in the Pricing Schedule. These items are explained in the Terms of Reference as well as the Scope of Work.

The Lump Sum items, as described in the Scope of Work, are specific tasks with defined deliverables. Payment will be made for completed tasks in accordance with the approved programme as submitted by the service provider and approved by the municipality.

Tasks in the Pricing Schedule with Hourly Rates, are those tasks which are deemed to be ongoing throughout the full 3 year period and for which the PSP will be entitled to progress payments.

HOURLY RATES

For the "hourly rate" items, the rate in most cases will be for the different team members providing the service.

As stated in the Terms of Reference (under the heading PROJECT PROGRAMME), on acceptance of appointment, the PSP will develop a detailed programme. The programme should contain all the milestones envisaged as per the Scope of Work. It is expected that the bidder will rely on knowledge and experience of the tasks where "hourly rates" are required, calculate the total cost of the team members, calculate the time required to complete such tasks and should therefore be able to develop an hourly rate for inclusion in the Pricing Schedule.

The service provider will also be required to submit a monthly progress report to the Municipality on completed tasks as well as tasks in progress (those with hourly rates). It is expected that monthly payment claims will relate to actual work completed during the month, supported by documented evidence.

The hours shown in the Pricing Schedule are estimated time frames for the purpose of comparing tender amounts. These hours may decrease or increase depending on the need or budget constraints of the Municipality.

SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT POLICY PREREQUISITES

The Joe Gqabi District Municipality [JGDM] has identified a general set of prerequisites for procurement. Bids will not be considered should the prerequisites not be met.

1.1 GENERAL PREREQUISITES

Introduction

This Section covers a general set of prerequisites that have been identified for supply chain management by the JGDM. All Bidders must submit the information requested below.

Pro-forma data sheets can be found in the Annexures. Bidders will not be considered should the prerequisites not be met.

Criteria

- a) Proof of company registration and/or any other form of legal standing must be submitted by all bidders and the company composition form must be completed. See **Annexure "C"**.
- b) The Declaration of Interest form must be completed.
- c) The bid document must be completed in all respects in black ink.
- d) Bids must be submitted on original bid documents.
- e) Bid documents must remain intact and no portion may be detached.

Joint Ventures

- f) A joint venture that is awarded a contract with JGDM must be registered as a separate company with the Registrar of Businesses.
- g) The joint venture must be registered with South African Revenue Services.
- h) A separate bank account must be in place for the joint venture.

Clauses (f) and (h) will only be applicable after the awarding of the contract to the successful bidder.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

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GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1** “**Closing time**” means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2** “**Contract**” means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the provider, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3** “**Contract price**” means the price payable to the provider under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4** “**Corrupt practice**” means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of the value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5** “**Countervailing duties**” are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6** “**Country of origin**” means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7** “**Day**” means calendar day.
- 1.8** “**Delivery**” means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9** “**Delivery ex stock**” means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10** “**Delivery into consignees store or to his site**” means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the provider bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11** “**Dumping**” occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12** “**Force majeure**” means an event beyond the control of the provider and not involving the provider’s fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13** “**Fraudulent practice**” means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14** “**GCC**” means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15** “**Goods**” means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the provider is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16** “**Imported content**” means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the provider or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as land costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where

the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.

- 1.17 **“Local content”** means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 **“Manufacture”** means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 **“Order”** means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 **“Project site,”** where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 **“Purchaser”** means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 **“Republic”** means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 **“SCC”** means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 **“Services”** means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the provider covered under the contract.
- 1.25 **“Written”** or **“in writing”** means hand-written in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services (excluding professional services related to the building and construction industry), sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 Invitations to bid are usually published in locally distributed news media and in the institution's website.

4. Standards

- 4.1 **The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.**

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection

- 1. **The provider shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the provider in the performance of the contract.**

Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

2. The provider shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the provider's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
4. The provider shall permit the purchaser to inspect the provider's records relating to the performance of the provider and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1 The provider shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

1. When a provider developed documentation/projects for the municipality or municipal entity, the intellectual, copy and patent rights or ownership or such documents or projects will vest in the municipality or municipal entity.

7. Performance Security

7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.

7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the provider's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.

7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:

- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
- (b) a cashier's or certified cheque.

7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the provider not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the provider's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the purchaser or an organization acting on behalf of the purchaser.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clause 8.2 & 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.

- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the provider.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the provider who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do not comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the providers cost and risk. Should the provider fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the provider further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the provider.
- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packaging

- 9.1 The provider shall provide such packaging of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packaging shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packaging, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the good's final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packaging, marking and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- .1 Delivery of the goods and arrangements for shipping and clearance obligations shall be made by the provider in accordance with the terms specified in the contract.

11. Insurance

- .1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified.

12. Transportation

- 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

13. Incidental services

1. The provider may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any:
 - performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the provider of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
 - training of the purchaser's personnel, at the provider's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

2. Prices charged by the provider for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the provider for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- .1 As specified, the provider may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the provider:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the provider, provided that this election shall not relieve the provider of any warranty obligations under the contract, and
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) Following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The provider warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models and that, they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The provider further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the provider, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for thirty six (36) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the provider in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the provider shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the provider, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the provider's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the provider under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the provider under this contract shall be specified
- 16.2 The provider shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of a valid tax invoice or claim by the provider.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

17. Prices

- 1. Prices charged by the provider for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the provider in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Increase/decrease of quantities

- 18.1 In cases where the estimated value of the envisaged changes in purchase does not exceed 15% of the total value of the original contract, the contractor may be instructed to deliver the revised quantities. The contractor may be approached to reduce the unit price, and such offers may be accepted provided that there is no escalation in price.

19. Contract amendments

No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

20. Assignment

20.1 The provider shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

21. Subcontracts

21.1 The provider shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the provider from any liability or obligation under the contract.

22. Delays in the provider's performance

22.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the provider in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.

22.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the provider or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the provider shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the provider's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the provider's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

22.3 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if any emergency arises, the provider's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the provider's services are not readily available.

22.4 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the provider in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the provider liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.

22.5 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the provider's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the provider.

23. Penalties

23.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the provider fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed good or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

24. Termination for Default

24.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the provider, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

- (a) if the provider fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
- (b) if the provider fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the provider, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

24.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the provider shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the provider shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

25. Anti-Dumping and Counter-Vailing Duties and Rights

25.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the provider to the purchaser or the purchaser may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the provider in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

26. Force Majeure

26.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the provider shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

26.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the provider shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the provider shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

27. Termination for Insolvency

27.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the provider if the provider becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the provider, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

28. Settlement of Disputes

28.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the provider in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

28.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the provider may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

28.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

28.4 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and / or court proceedings herein,

- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the purchaser shall pay the provider any monies due to the provider for goods delivered and / or services rendered according to the prescripts of the contract.

29. Limitation of Liability

29.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or wilful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

- (a) the provider shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the provider to pay penalties and / or damages to the purchaser; and
- (b) the aggregate liability of the provider to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

30. Governing Language

30.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

31. Applicable Law

31.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

32. Notices

32.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the provider concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.

32.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

33. Taxes and Duties

33.1 A foreign provider shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

33.2 A local provider shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc, incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.

33.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid SARS must

have certified that the tax matters of the preferred bidder are in order.

34. Transfer of Contracts

34.1 The contractor shall not abandon, transfer, assign or sublet a contract or part thereof without the written permission of the purchaser.

35. Amendment of Contracts

35.1 No agreement to amend or vary a contract or order or the conditions, stipulations or provisions thereof shall be valid and of any force unless such agreement to amend or vary is entered into in writing and signed by the contracting parties.
