SECTION A: GENERAL

1. ITEM

Sulphuric acid, H2SO4 and Oleum.

2. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The material shall consist of chemically pure Sulphuric acid free from sediment, suspended matter and separated materials. Colour: Not more than the following Lovibond units when packed: Red: 0,5; Yellow: 2,0; Blue: 0,4

5.2 A certificate of analysis stating all the results of the tests conducted by the supplier during manufacture and final acceptance.

The supplier's delivery note shall clearly state PMP's order number as well as PMP's code number.

PACKING

- 6.1 The Sulphuric acid must be supplied in sound, dry air tight containers of approved pattern, complying to statutory requirements.
- 6.2 The method of packing and the quantity to be supplied in each separate container shall be negotiated between the supplier and the purchaser.
- When placing the order the purchaser shall stipulate the exact method of packing required. Any deviation from this method of packing as well as the inclusion of any foreign matter or impurities in any of the containers shall render the whole consignment liable to rejection.

NOTE: Normally it is preferable that the acid be delivered in bulk and transferred to a storage tank and in this case the container identifications may be ignored.

SECTION B: QUALITY ASSURANCE

1. QUALITY ASSURANCE PROVISIONS

1.1 Responsibilities

- 1.1.1 The purchaser or his representative reserves the right of inspection of Laboratory Certificates as well as Production Quality Control Certificates of raw materials and components used for the manufacture of the applicable consignment of Sulphuric acid.
- 1.1.2 The supplier shall be responsible for making available to the purchaser all gauges and facilities necessary, if required, for the inspection of the Sulphuric acid.
- 1.1.3 The purchaser reserves the right at all times to audit the supplier's production facilities to ascertain whether quality requirements are being met.
- 1.1.4 The supplier will be responsible for the implimentation of the applicable quality management systems according to SABS 0157 to assure the appropriate quality of the product.

1.2 Identification

All containers are to be legibly and durably marked with the following details:

1.3 Lot identification

- 1.3.1 The material shall be supplied in lots, where a lot is defined as the identifiable quantity of material produced by one manufacturer in one unchanged process, using the same materials and methods in accordance with the same specification.
- 1.3.2 The supplier shall ensure that all deliveries to the end user are fully traceable by lot number and that identification records be supplied to the end user to match lot number with inspection records.

1.4 Sample Procedures

- 1.4.1 The supplier must provide on delivery of the whole consignment or earlier a homogeneous sample, which shall be representative of each lot supplied, of not less than 1000ml free of charge. The total size of the manufacturing lot from which this sample was taken must also be indicated on the sample container.
