2. PREQUALIFICATION / ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

2.1 Only those Respondents who satisfy the following pre-qualification or eligibility criteria are eligible to submit quotations as per section 3.

3 COMMUNICATION

Respondent/s are warned that a response will be liable for disqualification should any attempt be made either directly or indirectly to canvass any SCM Officer(s) or AMAZWI MUSEUM employee in respect of this RFQ between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

4 LEGAL COMPLIANCE

The successful Respondent shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable national and local laws and regulations.

5 CHANGES TO QUOTATIONS

Changes by the Respondent to its submission will not be considered after the closing date and time.

6 PRICING

All prices must be quoted in South African Rand on a fixed price basis, including VAT.

7 BINDING OFFER

Any Quotation furnished pursuant to this Request shall be deemed to be an offer. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

11 PROTECTION OF PERSONAL DATA

In responding to this bid, AMAZWI MUSEUM acknowledges that it may obtain and have access to personal data of the Respondents. AMAZWI MUSEUM agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by Respondents in their response to this bid for the purpose of evaluating and subsequent award of business and in accordance with any applicable law.

Furthermore, AMAZWI MUSEUM will not otherwise modify, amend or alter any personal data submitted by Respondents or disclose or permit the disclosure of any personal data to any Third Party without the prior written consent from the Respondents. Similarly, AMAZWI MUSEUM requires Respondents to process any personal information disclosed by AMAZWI MUSEUM in the bidding process in the same manner.

17 PURPOSE

The purpose of this Request for Quotation (RFQ) is to invite professional service providers to submit a quotation for the provision of market related property valuation for the Schreiner House property situated at 9 Cross Street in Nxuba (Cradock) and Eastern Star property situated at 4 Anglo-African Street in Makhanda.

18 BACKGROUND

Amazwi South African Museum of Literature (AMAZWI MUSEUM) is a schedule 3A public entity, established in terms of the Cultural Institutions Act, Act No. 119 of 1998, under the control of a Council appointed by the Minister of Sport, Arts and Culture. As a public entity, AMAZWI MUSEUM is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: public entities.

As a PFMA listed institution, AMAZWI MUSEUM is required to comply with section 55(1)(b) which requires that the accounting authority for a public entity must prepare financial statements for each financial year in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice (GRAP) standards issued by the Accounting Standards Board.

The heritage property on erf 3654 in Cradock, Schreiner House, is legally the property of Amazwi. The museum is a joint operation of Amazwi and Inxuba Yethemba Municipality. The local municipality contributed to the restoration of the building. The municipality contributes 50% of the curator's salary and a municipal staff member is assigned to Schreiner House in a support capacity. The municipality further contributes through the remission of rates and municipal services. Amazwi does not charge an entrance fee at Schreiner House so there is no direct revenue generated at the property.

Based on an interpretation and implementation of the GRAP 103 standard on Heritage Assets by Inxuba Yethemba Municipality, the municipality shares control of Schreiner House with Amazwi and should carry a *portion* on their heritage asset register. The portion of the erf on which the house museum stands, with a value of R800 000.00 (eight hundred thousand Rand) was accordingly apportioned to the municipality in 2020/21 for carrying on their asset register and the hall and adjacent property on erf 2701 is accordingly apportioned to Amazwi for carrying on their asset register. The displays and literary artefacts in the museum, including movables, are not affected.

From a control perspective, neither the South African Heritage Resources Agency nor the Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Authority have any control over the operations and maintenance of the property.

19 SCOPE OF WORK

The purpose of this specification is to provide guidance in terms of the minimum compliance requirements that shall be guaranteed and adhered to for the provision of market related property valuation for the Schreiner House property situated at 9 Cross Street in Nxuba (Cradock) and Eastern Star property situated at 4 Anglo-African Street in Makhanda.

The services and/or products supplied must comply to requirements as outlined herewith:

The valuation work includes but not limited to the following:

Preparation phase



- Data collection from difference sources and authorities (e.g., asset list, Maps, Title Deeds, Municipal valuation, etc.)
- Visit to local Authority for data verification (e.g. municipal values, zoning, etc.)
- Inspection of property
 - Technical inspection of the property and visual inspection of the surrounding areas
 - Photographs
- Market research
 - Provide property agent details, where possible
 - Sources of information should be acknowledged in the report
- Compilation of Valuation Report
 - Reports to display understanding of subject property and to include:
 - Current owner's details
 - Correct legal description of the property, Stand size
 - Details of the property asset being valued such as size, construction, condition, etc.
 - A valuation of the property based on the most suitable valuation method
- A Valuation Report/Valuation Commentary/Conclusion Report must be delivered to AMAZWI MUSEUM
 within ONE month of the award with all the information listed above. All relevant annexures and
 supporting documentation must be provided with the valuation report. One professionally packaged
 hard copy and one electronic copy (with all annexures and supporting documents included) of the
 valuation report must be submitted to AMAZWI MUSEUM.
- The properties are located in Nxuba (Cradock) and Makhanda in the Eastern Cape Province of South Africa. Drawings for the properties will be made available.
- If the report is not completed to the satisfaction of AMAZWI MUSEUM, the successful bidder will not be paid until all the information (hard and electronic copy) is provided by the successful bidder.
- Only registered Valuers can provide market valuations which have legal standing, therefore all Valuers involved in the project should:
 - Have broad experience gained over the years in the property industry as well as heritage assets, coupled with access to the most up to date property data bases in the country.

General

AMAZWI MUSEUM and the Supplier enter into an order/contract on these conditions to supply the items (goods/services/works) as described in the order/contract.

Conditions

These conditions form the basis of the contract between AMAZWI MUSEUM and the Supplier. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any document issued or sent by the Supplier, these conditions apply except as expressly agreed in writing by AMAZWI MUSEUM.

No servant or agent of AMAZWI MUSEUM has authority to vary these conditions orally. These general conditions of purchase are subject to such further special conditions as may be prescribed in writing by AMAZWI MUSEUM in the order/contract.

Price and payment

The Supplier will be paid in South African Rand only. Preferably, the matter of foreign currency transactions will not be entertained. Payment will be as quotation in South African Rand. AMAZWI MUSEUM pays for the item within 30 days of receipt of the Suppliers correct tax invoice.

Delivery and documents

The Supplier's obligation is to deliver the items on or before the date stated in the order/contract. Late deliveries or late completion of the items may be subject to a penalty if this is imposed in the order/contract. No payment is made if the Supplier does not provide the item as stated in order/contract.

Where items are to be delivered the Supplier:

Clearly marks the outside of each consignment or package with the Supplier's name and full details of the destination in accordance with the order and includes a packing note stating the contents thereof; On dispatch of each consignment, sends to AMAZWI MUSEUM at the address for delivery of the items, an advice note specifying the means of transport, weight, number of volume as appropriate and the point and date of dispatch; Sends to AMAZWI MUSEUM a detailed priced invoice as soon as is reasonably practical after dispatch of the items, and states on all communications in respect of the order the order number and code number (if any).
