Chawane leads Proteas to historic series win

Victory over England a confidence booster, captain says

SA skipper Proteas captain Khanyisa Chawane has described their historic 2-1 series victory over England's Vitality Roses as an amazing feeling and a confidence booster after the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, Scotland, later this month.

The Proteas powered to a commanding 65-59 win over England in their final match of the series at the Ellis Park Arena on Sunday to clinch the series.

The Test series was part of their preparation for the Commonwealth Games from July 23 to August 2, where the two nations were competing in the same group alongside Australia.

In the three-match series, they won the first game 52-48, before England hit back with a 61-49 victory in the second fixture.

The hosts then held their nerve to win the series decider, and Chawane was pleased with her side's performance.

"We always get England in the final of the Nations Cup or series, and they always beat us," said Chawane.

"I am so happy with our team that it's at its best of the year," Chawane said.

"Finally beat England at home is an amazing feeling. We have a bright future."

"We are going to meet them in the group stages of the Commonwealth Games, and this gives us a lot of confidence."

Chawane explained how they

"We jumped for almost everything to make sure we kept ourselves in a good position to take the lead."

"When we took the lead, we looked at each other, and we are not letting them come back again, and we kept our lead."

"You could see how we were structured in attack. We didn't give them chances to go out for our balls like they did before."

"We made sure we were well planned." — Sowetan

Springbok Sevens head coach Philip Snyman expressed frustration and disappointment in his team's fourth-place finish at the Springbok Sevens in Singapore on Sunday.

The Blitzboks dropped both matches to the National Stadium on Sunday, the first against France in the semis and to New Zealand in the play-off for third place.

"It was certainly not our best performance in a while," Snyman said about Sunday's matches.

"There was no lack of effort out there, but our execution and decision-making were not up to standard, and we paid the price."

"SA dropped from the top of the standings to third on the log of 46 points, but the Blitzboks in the final, Fiji, won their first tournament of the 2026 World Series to move to the top of the table (52 points), with New Zealand now in second place (48 points)."

Snyman pointed to a number of areas where they did not meet their usual high standards but remained

fused to blame the lack of experience in the squad.

"There was a risk in bringing a couple of players with very little, if any, tournament experience under their belt, but we are working towards getting depth as well."

"I am happy with how we have performed this year, and we will revisit that to remind ourselves what we stand for and what our standards are as the Springbok Sevens team."

Alcaraz's immediate focus will be on getting a tattoo to mark his Melbourne Park triumph.

He has commemorated previous major wins with body art — a strawberry for Wimbledon, the Eiffel Tower for the French Open, the date of his first US Open title, and after his success in New York, the Statue of Liberty and the Brooklyn Bridge.

"I've said it's going to be a kangaroo, for sure," the seven-time Grand Slam champion said.

"It's going to be a leg, I don't know the right, the left one. I have to choose a good spot, but it's going to be close to the French Open or Wimbledon." — Reuters

Alcaraz tempers expectations on clean sweep

Australian Open champion Carlos Alcaraz said capturing all four Grand Slam titles at 22 had not diminished his desire, and while a lot remains on his to-do list, he will not pile pressure on himself to chase a clean sweep of the major titles this year.

Alcaraz celebrated becoming the grand slam to complete the Grand Slam by ousting Novak Djokovic 6-2 6-3 7-5 at a floodlit Rod Laver Arena on Sunday and will look to return to the finals of the other majors this year.

The Spaniard beat Jannik Sinner in an epic French Open final last year to defend his title, before surrendering his Wimbledon crown to the Italian and capping their victory of major meetings by unseating him at the US Open for a sixth Grand Slam title.

"It's going to be a big challenge," Alcaraz told reporters when asked about gunning for all four Grand Slam titles in the same year.

"Those are big words. I want it to be one at a time. Right now, the next one is the French Open and



coach Juan Carlos Ferrero.
