1. BACKGROUND

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is a public entity in terms of the Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the Commission can be divided into two categories, namely “regulation of the National Lottery and other Lotteries” and “administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)”.

Chapter eight (8) of the Minimum Information Security Standards (MISS), 1996, requires of the National Lotteries Commission as a public entity to implement measures to control the access to the National Lotteries Commission premises.

The NLC invites suitably qualified and experienced bidders to submit proposals for provision of a security services, in line with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) No. 1 of 1999, as amended and Treasury Regulations.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of the terms of reference (TOR) is to appoint a suitably qualified and experienced service provider located in Limpopo Province to provide security services for the National Lotteries Commission Limpopo Office in Polokwane for a period of three (3) years.

3. OBJECTIVES

The primary objective is to ensure that the National Lotteries Commission Limpopo Office in Polokwane has twenty-four (24) hour security services.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work entails the following:

4.1 Duties:

- Enforcement of Section two (2) of the Control of Access to Public Premises and Vehicles Act, 1985 (Act 53 of 1985);
- Responsible for access control, guarding of premises, patrolling of premises;
- Escorting of visitors;
- Protection of personnel, property, visitors, personal belongings, NLC assets;
- To record details of all individuals entering and exiting NLC premises including personal electronic devices;
- Record all incidents in an occurrence register and report such incidents to Provincial Manager and Facilities under Supply Chain Management;
- Enforce NLC security policy, systems and procedures; and
- Execution of other ancillary security functions.

4.2 Security measures for conformance to provision of MISS:

- Access Control: Manning the physical security systems.
- The furnishing of identification; the declarations concerning hazardous objects, firearms contents of any suitcase, briefcase, handbag, bag, etc.; electronic examination; and
- The handing over of any object for examination or custody that may be required as a prerequisite for effective access control.

4.3 Security Services Requirements:

4.3.1 Day Shifts and Night Shifts: Monday – Sunday

The NLC requires the services of one (1) security officer for the day shift as follows:

4.5 Uniform

- 4.5.1 Security officers must always be clad in their corporate uniform i.e., formal shirt and pants; skirts; tie and/or blazer; appropriate shoes; and
- 4.5.2 Combat clothing will be accepted, as and when required.

5. Essential requirements

In addition to other requirements in this document, the following will also be required:

- 5.1 The bidder must meet all the requirements of the (Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority Act (PSIRA), Act 56 of 2001. PSIRA compliance audit on the bidder shall be conducted at least once in twelve (12) months by PSIRA Inspectors. It is the bidder's obligation to invite PSIRA for such inspections and submit audit reports to the NLC.
- 5.2 Security officers must be in possession of valid PSIRA certificates. A certified copy of the PSIRA certificates must be included in the bid submission. Security Officers must display valid PSIRA cards when on duty at the NLC.
- 5.3 Security officers must practice professionalism when on duty at the NLC and adhere to the NLC Security Policy, Systems and Procedures.
- 5.4 The bidder and security officers must always respect the Rules, Laws, Regulations and Constitution of South Africa.
- 5.5 Security officers assigned to work with the CCTV system must have the relevant skills, knowledge, and expertise to monitor and analyze the CCTV Surveillance System. Proof of training will be requested.
- 5.6 All Grade C security officers must be capable to operate and analyze X-RAY scanner machines. Proof of training will be requested.
- 5.7 The bidder to provide a health and safety plan and bidder code of conduct for all security officers.

- 5.8 The bidder must provide a backup communication system to be used during emergencies for direct contact with the base station (in the form of cell phones, radios etc.).
- 5.9 Criminal records check, and security screening will be done on both the bidder director(s) and security officers deployed at the NLC at least twice in a year. If found to be involved in criminal activities, such directors/officers will not be allowed to work at the NLC.

6. DELIVERABLES

Deliverables for the service is to provide a twenty-four (24) hour, seven days a week security service at NLC Limpopo Office in Polokwane. The appointed service provider is expected to provide incident reports and day to day security operational reports.

7. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The successful service provider will report to the Limpopo Provincial Office.

8. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The expected duration of the project is three (3) years after the signing of a Service Level Agreement (SLA).

9. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The NLC will evaluate all proposals in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2017 and Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act. No. 5 of 2000 (P-PPFA). three (3) phase evaluation criteria will be followed to evaluate proposals, being:

9.1 Phase 1: Pre - Qualification Criteria (Mandatory Requirements)

Bidders must submit all the below mentioned requirements. The following mandatory requirements must be met to qualify for this bid:

- Bidders must have a minimum B-BBEE status level contributor of 1 and an EME or QSE in terms of the BBEEE code of good practice.
- Proof of full accreditation with the Private Security Industry Regulator Authority (PSIRA). Please submit a valid letter of good standing with PSIRA.
- A valid letter of good standing from the Compensation Commissioner (COIDA)
- A valid letter of good standing from the Unemployment Insurance Fund.
- A valid public liability cover of a minimum of R 2 million rand.
- Signed consent form in terms of the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 (POPIA).

Any bidder that fails to meet the above mentioned pre-qualifying criteria will be deemed unacceptable.

9.2 Phase 2: Functional/Technical Evaluation

Only bidders that have met the pre-qualification criteria will be evaluated for functional evaluation. In this phase the evaluation will be based on the bidders' responses in respect of the bid proposal (evaluated on the minimum functional specifications). Prospective bidders who score a minimum of 70% points or more will be considered for the next phase 3 (Price and B-BBEE status level contributor).

2. Capacity and ability to deliver the security services	
The bidder must provide a profile that contains the entity's organizational structure, a staff organogram indicating PSIRA Grades, as well as a profile of core staff, their experience, and achievements. Please attach copies of the PSIRA. Total points = 10% What is the bidders' complaints handling procedure and its benefit to the NLC Total points = 5% Describe how emergencies/incidents, strikes, requests, changes and staff leave/absenteeism will be handled and also include how value add services will be communicated to the NLC. Bidders must have satellite office with control room within the Municipality where our provincial office is located. Proof of Residency or lease agreement should be attached. Total points = 30%	45%
3. Project plan/ Methodology	
The service provider is required to provide a detailed plan depicting how the	

services will be delivered to the NLC. Attention should be given to the following: • How the work will be managed; • Process and work flows within the firm; • How the firm will deal with crisis management; • Reporting lines between the bidder and NLC in terms of contractual obligations. The maximum points for Project Plan/Methodology = 20%	20%
4. Site Inspection	
Site inspection to be conducted. 10. GENERAL GUIDELINES

10.1. Submission Instruction

10.1.1 Only electronically submission will be accepted as follows:

- universal serial bus (USB) or compact disc (CD). (1 copy)

10.1.2 Bidders are encouraged to use on of the above-mentioned submission options.

10.1.5 Due to COVID-19 pandemic, strictly **no** hand delivery of documents will be accepted. Only electronic submissions (USB/CD) will be accepted.

10.1.6 The following reference number must be used:

Take note of the following:

- No costs have been prescribed for the Bidding Document;
- All proposals **must** be costed in South African Rand, inclusive of VAT;
- If the bid does not include all the information required, or is incomplete, this will mean non-compliance and therefore invalidate the bid;
- Any submission received after the deadline will not be considered; and
- The costing must remain valid and open for evaluation for a period of at least six (6) months from the time of submission.

10.2 Late bids

Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived one second after 11:00 am or any time thereafter.

10.3 Costs to be borne by bidders

All costs and expenses incurred by the bidders in any way associated with the development, preparation and submission of responses and providing any additional information required by the NLC, will be borne entirely and exclusively by the bidders.

10.4 No legal relationship

No binding legal relationship will exist between any of the bidders and the NLC until the execution of a signed contractual SLA. The TOR document will not form part of any such contract or arrangement.

10.5 Evaluation of offers

Each bidder acknowledges and accepts that the NLC may, at its absolute discretion, apply selection criteria specified in this document for the evaluation of proposals for short listing/ selecting the eligible bidder(s).

10.6 Format of your proposal

The proposal should be presented in two sections i.e., technical proposal and financial proposal.

11. STANDARD REQUIREMENT OF THE BID

11.1 Disclosures

The bidder must disclose:

- a) If they are or have been the subject of any proceedings or other arrangements relating to bankruptcy/ insolvency.

- b) If they have been convicted of, or are the subject of any proceedings, relating to:
- A criminal offence or other offence, involving the activities of a criminal nature in its organisation or found by any regulator or professional body to have committed professional misconduct;
 - Corruption, including the offer or receipt of any inducement of any kind in relation to obtaining any contract with any contracting authority; and
 - Failure to fulfil any obligation in any jurisdiction relating to the payment of taxes and other legal obligations.
- c) If a bidder or related bidder or any individual discloses details of any previous misconduct or complaint, the NLC will seek an explanation and background details from them. At the sole discretion of the NLC, an assessment as to whether the bidder will be allowed to continue to the next phase of the evaluation phase will then be made.
- d) Disclosure extends to any bidder in the same group of the bidder, including but not limited to parent, subsidiary and sister companies, companies with common shareholders (whether direct or indirect) and parties with whom the bidder is associated in respect of this tender.

11.2 Disclaimer

11.2.1 The NLC reserves the right not to appoint a bidder.

11.2.2 The NLC may appoint more than one bidder.

11.2.3 The NLC also reserves the right to:

- a) Award the contract or any part thereof to one or more bidders;
- b) Reject all bids;
- c) Decline to consider any bids that do not conform to any aspect of the bidding requirements;
- d) Request further information from any bidder after the closing date for clarity purposes;

- e) Cancel this tender or any part thereof at any time; and
- f) Should any of the above occur, it will be communicated in writing to the bidders.

11.3 Confidentiality

- a) Bids submitted will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding;
- b) All information pertaining to the NLC obtained by the bidder as a result of participation in this RFP is confidential and must not be disclosed without written authorisation from the NLC; and
- c) The successful bidder will be expected to sign the SLA with the NLC.

11.4 Use of Personal Information:

The NLC is committed to protecting the bidder's privacy and recognises that it needs to comply with statutory requirements in collecting, processing and distributing of personal information. The Constitution of the Republic of South Africa provides that everyone has the right to privacy and the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 ("POPI") includes the right to protection against unlawful collection, retention, dissemination and use of personal information. In terms of section 18 of POPI, if personal information is collected, the NLC, as responsible party, must take reasonably practical steps to ensure that the data subject is made aware of the information being collected.

11.5 Disqualification

- a) Any form of canvassing/lobbying/influence regarding the short listing will result in disqualification;
- b) Any non-disclosure of any other information pertaining to this bid will result in disqualification;
- c) Non-compliance with the bid requirements will invalidate the bid; and

d) Non-compliance with all the applicable Acts, Regulations and by-laws will result in the disqualification of the bid.

11.6 Prices

- a) All services' pricing should be inclusive of all taxes etc. and payment shall be made in South African Rand.
- b) Bidders to provide with the monthly security rate for all human resources that will be providing services to NLC. Bidders are required to provide the prices according to the pricing schedule available as '*Annexure A*' of the bid document.

11.7 Prices adjustments

Prices submitted for this bid will be regarded as non-firm subject to the following price adjustments:

- a) Annual price adjustment;
- b) Application for price adjustments must be accompanied by documentary evidence in support of any adjustment on annual basis; and
- c) The Pricing Schedule, referred to as '*Annexure A*' made provision of annual price adjustments and bidders must comply with the pricing schedule.

11.7 Payment terms

- a) The NLC undertakes to pay valid tax invoices in full within thirty (30) days from statement date for services rendered;
- b) All supporting documents for services rendered should be submitted together with the tax invoices by the twentieth (20th) of every month;

- c) Valid Tax Invoices for all services rendered are to be submitted to the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) at the NLC's Finance Division at the address on page 2 above or may be sent through an email to the following email address:

11.8 Validity

- a) A proposal shall remain valid for hundred and twenty (120) days after the closing date of the submission for proposals. A proposal which is valid for a shorter period may be rejected by the NLC for non-responsiveness.
- b) In exceptional circumstances, the NLC may solicit the bidder's consent to an extension of the period of the validity of the bid. The request and responses thereto shall be made in writing. A bidder that has been granted the request will neither be required nor permitted to modify the proposal.

11.9 Signatories

All responses to this RFP should be signed off by the authorised signatories of the bidder.

12. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a) The NLC reserves the right to accept or reject any submission in full or in part, and to suspend this process and reject all proposals or part thereof, at any time prior to the awarding of the contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidders;
- b) This bid and the contract will be subject to the General Conditions of Contract issued in accordance with Treasury Regulation 16A published in

terms of the PFMA. The special terms and conditions of contract are supplementary to that of the general conditions of the contract;

- c) Where, however, the special conditions of contract are in conflict with the general conditions of contract, the general conditions of contract will prevail.
- d) The NLC is the sole adjudicator of the suitability of the venue for the purpose for which it is required. Therefore, the NLC's decision in this regard will be final.
- e) Only electronic bids sent by email or deposited into the tender box will be accepted.
- g)
- h) The annexures are part of the bid documentation and must be signed by the bidder and attach to the bid document.
- i) The bid forms must not be retyped or redrafted, but copies may be used.
- j) Failure to comply with the above-mentioned conditions will invalidate the bid.

13. OTHER CONDITIONS:

- i. Only bidders who obtain at least 70% and above under Functional/Technical Evaluation will be evaluated further on price and B-BBEE.
- ii. Bidders are further requested to provide separate financial and technical proposals.
- iii. Bidders are requested to provide a clear agreement regarding joint venture/consortia. The percentage involvement of each company in the joint venture agreement should be indicated on the agreement. A trust, consortium or joint venture must submit a consolidated B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificate for every separate bid.

- iv. Bidders are required to submit original and valid B-BBEE Status Level Verification Certificates or certified copies thereof together with their bids, to substantiate their B-BBEE rating claims. Current and valid original or certified B-BBEE Certificate or Affidavit for Exempted Micro Enterprise (EME)/Qualifying Small Business Enterprise (QSE) must be submitted. (Failure to submit a certificate will result in scoring 0 for B-BBEE.);
- v. A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- vi. A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- vii. Fraudulent practices shall result in immediate disqualification.
- viii. NLC is under no obligation to accept any bid and reserves its right not to proceed with the appointment of any service provider that responded to the invitation to submit proposals, for whatever reasons it may consider appropriate.
- ix. The service provider/s to be appointed must display an unquestionable track record and experience with positive feedback from their existing and previous clients.
- x. The service provider must comply with all the laws and regulations of the Republic of South Africa.
- xi. Central Supplier Database (CSD) Summarized Report. Please submit the current CSD Report.
- xii. The bidder and its directors will be subjected to the NLC Security Screening Process prior to awarding the bid.
