1. PURPOSE

The KZNGFA invites quotations from suitably qualified service providers to provide KZNGFA with corporate clothing for KZNGFA staff.

2. BACKGROUND

Kwazulu-Natal Growth Fund Agency (KZNGFA) is an Agency, established and capitalised by the Provincial Government to provide debt and equity. The main objective of the KZNGFA is to provide support for creating and enabling environment for activities that create jobs and accelerate the economic development of KZN whilst promoting Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE).

2.1 Procurement Philosophy

It is the policy of KZNGFA, when purchasing goods and obtaining services to follow a course of optimum value and efficiency by adopting best purchasing practices in supply chain management, ensuring that open and fair competition has prevailed, with due regard being given to the importance of:

- a) The promotion, development and support of businesses from disadvantaged communities (small, medium, micro enterprises, as well as established businesses within those communities) in terms of its BEE Policy;
- b) The promotion of national and regional local service providers and agents before considering overseas service providers and;
- c) The development, promotion and support for the moral values that underpin the above, in terms of KZNGFA Business Ethics and Guidelines which requires that all commercial conduct be based on ethical and moral values and sound business practice. This value system governs all commercial behaviour within KZNGFA.

The KZNGFA wishes to engage with service providers who are equally committed to maintain high quality services and better pricing.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUIRED

KZNGFA requires a uniform supplier based in KZN to design and tailor the KZN Growth Fund Agency uniform. The primary colours are Navy (Pantone) Red (Pantone) and White.

We require the service provider to share a minimum of 3 options for proposed designs and once appointed, they will be expected to come through to our offices to measure staff for an accurate fit. We have a staff complement of 35 made up of 15 males and 20 females. **Staff Compliment will change with additions of New Staff Members.**

The provision of the garment for this purpose will be to the below specifications:

- Colours for the above garments must be aligned with Pantone colours.
- Designs suitable for both men's and ladies' cuts
- The KZNGFA logo is to be embroidered on the left breast in contrasting colour (white/navy)
- Product Specification:
 - The bidder is to accommodate all size requirements including those larger than a 4 x Extra Large
 - Each item is to be packed in a transparent plastic bag before being packed for delivery.
 - Delivery costs are to be included in the pricing.
 - A sample of the previously produced garments must be provided by the bidder with the tender response.

Security:

- The bidder is to have adequate security measures in place to safeguard the items prior to delivery to the KZNGFA.
- The KZNGFA must be able to inspect/visit the premises where the items are manufactured as and when they require.

- Should any damage or theft befall the items while in the care of the bidder and prior to the KZNGFA taking receipt of the items the bidder is to manufacture replacement items within 6 weeks from the date of the incident.
- The bidder is to have adequate insurance to cover KZNGFA items while in their possession and prior to delivery to the KZNGFA.
- Security and insurance of the items remains the responsibility of the bidder until KZNGFA has taken receipt of the items.

Samples:

- Samples must be provided for all items listed in the tender request.
- Failure to provide the requested samples will lead to immediate disqualification.
- Samples submitted with the tender response do not need to be branded.

Final Approval:

- Following appointment of the successful bidder and prior to the confirmation of the order, a sample of each item, in each size, is to be submitted by the successful bidder to the KZNGFA for approval prior production.
- This is to include a sample of men's and ladies' cuts where applicable. These samples must be branded.
- The KZNGFA is to approve the sample of each item before the order is processed.

Sizes:

- The successful bidder is to ensure that the items are correctly labelled with the correct size and men's/ladies cut.
- The successful bidder is to ensure that sizes are in line with commonly accepted sizing standards in South Africa.
- The successful bidder will be required to provide a sample of each item in all size options in order for the KZNGFA to approve the sizing standards used.
- We require the service provider to come through to our offices to measure staff for an accurate fit.

The chosen company will share 3 options of the design, and we will then decide.

4. CONTRACT DURATION

Contract duration must be completed in 3 months.

5. AWARD OF THE RFQ

KZNGFA is not obliged to accept and award this RFQ to the lowest bidder or any other bidder.

Scores will be tabulated to 100 points. Respondents must score 70 points and over to be assessed on their material sample.

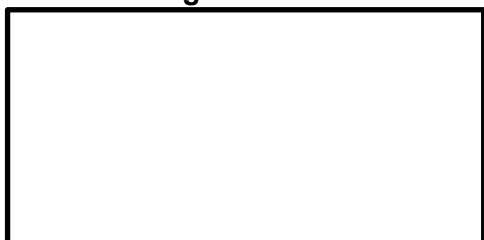

- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) **“the Act”** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

$$P_s = 80 \left(1 - \frac{P_t - P_{min}}{P_{min}} \right) \text{ or } P_s = 90 \left(1 - \frac{P_t - P_{min}}{P_{min}} \right)$$

Where

- P_s = Points scored for price of tender under consideration
- P_t = Price of tender under consideration
- P_{min} = Price of lowest acceptable tender

3.2. FORMULAE FOR DISPOSAL OR LEASING OF STATE ASSETS AND INCOME GENERATING PROCUREMENT

3.2.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

$$P_s = 80 \left(1 + \frac{P_t - P_{max}}{P_{max}} \right) \text{ or } P_s = 90 \left(1 + \frac{P_t - P_{max}}{P_{max}} \right)$$

Where

- P_s = Points scored for price of tender under consideration
- P_t = Price of tender under consideration
- P_{max} = Price of highest acceptable tender

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of

this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:

4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

(a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or

(b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.

Table 1: Specific goals for the tender and points claimed are indicated per the table below.
