PURPOSE

To appoint a suitable architectural company to develop designs and formulate a bill of quantities for the establishment of a container mall in Flagstaff and Lusikisiki for a period of one month.

BACKGROUND

The municipality through the Planning and Economic Development directorate has a constitutional mandate in terms of Section 152 to promote social and economic development within its jurisdiction. It is therefore against this background that the municipality in pursuit of local economic development trajectory plans to embark on a container mall development for both Flagstaff and Lusikisiki towns. The purpose of this project is to develop designs that will accommodate informal traders which are currently occupying municipal land in an unintended way and create central market spaces which will be developed in an orderly way by clustering informal businesses in one space using marine shipping containers.

The Ingquza Hill Local Municipality intends to express its interest to invest in the Marine Container Centre or Shopping Complex concept. The concept has been implemented already in the other provinces with one in the eastern cape, located in East London. IHLM has earmarked 2 sites Erven 2811, Lusikisiki and 3338, Flagstaff.
