Sealed Bids clearly marked with the project name and tender number must be placed in the tender box situated at the offices (**BTO Blue house**) of the MAMUSA LOCAL MUNICIPALITY, 28 Schweizer Street, SCHWEIZER-RENEKE, 2780, on or before the closing date and time at which time the bids will be opened in public.

No late bids will be accepted.

Please note that it is a prerequisite of the Municipality that all service providers are to be registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier database. It must therefore be understood that only bids from suppliers registered on the National treasury central supplier database (CSD) will be considered.

The MAMUSA LOCAL MUNICIPALITY does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any bid and the Municipality reserves the right to accept the whole or part of any bid and further reserves the right to re-advertise if it so wishes to. No reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any bid will be given.

Bids will be adjudicated according to the MAMUSA LOCAL MUNICIPALITY's Supply Chain Management Policy, the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (Act 5 of 2005) and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, as well as the Broad Base Black Economic Empowerment Act (Act 53 of 2003).
