- 1.5. Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6. The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **tender** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **price** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **rand value** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **tender for income-generating contracts** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ

of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and

- (e) **“The Act”** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/documentation stated in the conditions of this tender;
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of –

1. BACKGROUND IZIKO

Iziko Museums of South Africa (Iziko) is a schedule 3A public entity and non-profit organisation, partly subsidised by the National Department of Sport, Arts & Culture (DSAC), bringing together 11 national museums and a Social History Centre situated in the Western Cape under a single governance and leadership structure. Iziko was established in terms of the Cultural Institutions Act, 1998 (Act No. 119 of 1998) and is required to comply with the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA), 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999, as amended) and its concomitant Regulations.

2. SPECIFICATION

The Iziko Museums of South Africa intends to host an exhibition called Materiality from 21st of August 2026 to end of June 2027. The exhibition brings together about 70 artists across South Africa and Africa whose practices foreground the expressive and conceptual possibilities of materials.

Through works made from materials such as soil, cloth, wood, metal and found objects, the exhibition explores how artists use material choices to reflect on identity, memory, land, belonging and lived experience.

Iziko encourages quotations from suitably qualified conservators and conservation practices located anywhere in South Africa. Service providers are not required to be based in the Western Cape. Where travel, accommodation and local transport are required for the performance of the services, bidders must include these costs as separate line items in their quotation and pricing schedule

3. SCOPE OF SERVICE

The appointed service provider, an additional specialised conservator, should be able to assist a team of Iziko conservators to:

- 3.1 Provide Specialised conservation service to the Iziko Materiality 2 exhibition project on an as-and-when needed basis, at times mutually agreed upon by the parties. The service will be undertaken as per the schedule determined in consultation with the Iziko team.
- 3.2. Assessment of approximately 110 artworks across various media, including paintings, textiles and sculptures, and the completion of detailed condition reports for these works. Please note that some artworks will already have condition reports supplied by the lenders, while others will require the completion of condition reports using the Iziko template provided. Due to the scale and diversity of the works involved, an additional conservator is required to assist with the condition assessment process and ensure that all reports are completed to a professional museum standard within the project timeline.

3.3 Assist with any necessary minor conservation interventions and provide overall professional guidance and advice in the event of any concerns arising with the paintings or sculptures, including recommendations for further treatment where required.

3.4 Provide assistance and guidance on best practices for the hanging and installation of artworks, where required

Best value incorporates the expertise, experience and technical proposal of the organisation and individuals who will be providing the service and the organisational capacity supporting the project team.

Iziko is committed to achieving Government's transformation objectives in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act.

6.1. Evaluation of Quotation

The contract shall be awarded at the sole and absolute discretion of Iziko. Iziko hereby represents that it is not obliged to award this quotation to any bidder. Iziko is entitled to **retract** this quotation at any time as from the date of issue or reduce deliverables.

The evaluation of quotations will be conducted as follows:

Stage 1: Administrative Compliance

- Completed SBD 4;
- Completed SBD 6.1;
- Completed RFQ document;
- Pricing Schedule.

Stage 2: Mandatory Technical Requirements

The bidder must submit:

- CV of the proposed conservator to be used for the service;
- Relevant qualification(s), professional training and/or certification;
- Evidence of experience in conservation-related services through a portfolio, project list or similar supporting documentation;
- Two contactable references for similar work.

Quotations that satisfy the above mandatory requirements will be considered responsive and will proceed to **Stage 3**

7. PREFERENTIAL POINTS

Proposals will be evaluated on the 80/20 preference points scoring system: that is, 80% of the points awarded will be based on price, as indicated in the table below; and 20% of the points awarded will be based on specific goals, allocated as indicated in the table below:
