DETAILED TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

1. BACKGROUND

The South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC) office in Bloemfontein, Free State (FS) broadcast centre house among others Lesedi FM. Bloemfontein is also the capital city of Free State and administration hub for the province. Among other offices, Bloemfontein houses Free state Legislature.

The current data server room in Bloemfontein was developed in the nineties. It was turned into a data server room accommodating small volume of servers and more were added with more employees that went together with the expansion of the office without any upgrade to the facility. Since then, several other servers were added to the room. This server room is providing services to broadcasting studios, Airtime sales, Newsroom, and administration offices.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

The project will require the appointment of a contractor to execute the building work. This work will include the lowering of the total floor area to accommodate a raised floor to ensure enough space above the equipment racks for the ducting of the air conditioners and cabling trace.

The new server room require a separate fire suppression unit, UPS, air conditioner unit and improved security systems.

Requirements:

- Building works
- Raised floor
- Electrical works
- Server racks (3 new racks)
- Air-conditioning (ducting split unit as backup)
- Access control system- Biometric
- CCTV cameras – need separate NVR (in the security control room)
- UPS supply (20 KVA for the data room – dual system)
- Network cabling
- Fire suppression
- Relocating of current servers

2.1 In order to fulfil the above-mentioned upgrade, the SABC seeks to secure the services of a registered architect to do the design work and where necessary obtain approval from the local authority. The architectural service to be rendered will include the following:

2.1.1 Professional Architectural work and Mechanical Engineering designs.

2.1.2 Provide the following scope of services:

- Stage 1: Inception
- Stage 2: Concept and viability (concept design)
- Stage 3: Design development
- Stage 4: Documentation and procurement
 - Prepare documentation sufficient to local authority submission.
 - Complete construction documentation and proceed to call for tenders.
- Stage 5: Administration of JBCC contract
- Stage 6: Close out

2.1.3 Concept design and ensure sign off by the client.

2.1.4 Obtain approval from all relevant statutory bodies (e.g., Council).

2.1.5 Quality specifications, assessment, and control of all building works, fire suppression, access control CCTV and Air conditioning Systems.

2.1.6 Act as principal agent in the execution of the building works, fire Suppression, access control, CCTV and Air conditioning Systems.

2.1.7 Draft specifications to assist on the selection of the following Contractors: building works, fire suppression, access control, CCTV and Air conditioning Systems.

2.1.8 Compile a bill of material for all works required with quantities.

2.1.9 Architect must be able to attend meetings and conduct site inspections for the duration of the project.

2.1.10 Supervise and administrate the JBCC building contract.

2.1.11 Allow for the services as indicated in the scope of service.

2.2. **Associated Costs**

The architect is expected to provide estimated cost of all works required including professional fees.

3. **CONTRACT DOCUMENTATION**

The contract will be executed in terms of the South African Institute of Architects (SAIA): **CLIENT-ARCHITECT AGREEMENT with amendments as determined by SABC Legal Department.**

Duration of the Contract- The duration of the contract is Twenty-four **(24)** months based on a fixed price.

Costing - The quotation must reflect a detailed cost breakdown, and include any indirect costs associated with the delivery of the service as per current SACAP tariff as published in the Government Gazette.

4. LOCATION

The Contract site is at **SABC Bloemfontein, Freestate**

5. WORKMEN AND SUPERVISION ON SITE

The Contractor shall be held responsible for the conduct of all contractors on site for the full duration of the Contract Works.

6. HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT

The work will be strictly executed in accordance with OHS ACT requirements, H&S regulations applicable to the Construction Industry and SABC H&S requirements and specification.

The contractor shall be appointed in terms of the **SABC H&S** requirements, and the contractor will be responsible for the enforcement of the H&S provisions.

Sign the SABC Health and Safety Indemnity form and all workers to attend SABC H&S induction course of 1 hour prior to handing over of site.

7. RFQ Response Information

Effective Date of Bid

Vendors should state in writing in its quotation to the SABC that all furnished information, including price, will remain valid and applicable for 90 days from the date the vendor quotation is received by the SABC.

8. EVALUATION CRITERIA

8.1. BBBEE and Price

- The RFQ responses will be evaluated on the **80/20**-point system.

8.2. Technical Evaluation

- **The tender submission will be technically evaluated out of a maximum of 80.**
- A threshold of **55** out of the **80** has been set.

- All bidders achieving less than the set threshold will be declared non-responsive.

8.3. Objective Criteria

- SABC further reserve the right not to award this RFQ to any bidder based on the proven poor record of accomplishment of the bidder in previous projects within the SABC.

9. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- a. The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract unless objective criteria justify the award to another bidder.
- b. Preference points shall be calculated after process has been brought to a comparative basis considering all factors of non-firm prices.
- c. In the event that two or more bids have scored equal points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- d. However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- e. Should two or more bids be equal in all respect, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

10. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

The **80/20** preference point system

- f. Bidders who qualify as EME's in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by a verification Agency accredited by SANAS for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates or DTI Affidavit.

- g. Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status levels verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a verification agency accredited by SANAS.
- h. A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- i. A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- j. Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- k. A tenderer will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended Sub-contractor is an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.
- l. A tenderer awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capacity and the ability to execute the sub-contract.

11. COMMUNICATION

Respondents are warned that a response will be disqualified should any attempt be made by a tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer(s) or employees of SABC in respect of a tender, between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.

All enquiries relating to this RFQ should be emailed three days before the closing date.

12. CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED WHEN TENDERING

- 12.1 The Corporation does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender, nor shall it be responsible for or pay any expenses or losses which may be incurred by the Tenderer in the

preparation and delivery of his tender. The Corporation reserves the right to accept a separate tender or separate tenders for any one or more of the sections of a specification. The corporation also reserves the right to withdraw the tender at any stage.

- a. No tender shall be deemed to have been accepted unless and until a formal contract / letter of intent is prepared and executed.
- b. The Corporation reserves the right to:

Not evaluate and award submissions that do not comply with his RFQ document.

Make a selection solely on the information received in the submissions and

- i. Enter into negotiations with any one or more of preferred bidder(s) based on the criteria specified in the evaluation of this tender.
- ii. Contact any bidder during the evaluation process, in order to clarify any information, without informing any other bidders. During the evaluation process, no change in the content of the RFQ shall be sought, offered, or permitted.
- iii. Award a contract to one or more bidder(s).
- iv. Accept any tender in part or full at its own discretion.
- v. Cancel this RFQ or any part thereof at any time.
- vi. Should a bidder(s) be selected for further negotiations, they will be chosen on the basis of the greatest benefit to the Corporation and not necessarily on the basis of the lowest costs, aligned to the BBEE & Preference Point system.

13. Cost of Bidding

The Tenderer shall bear all costs and expenses associated with preparation and submission of its tender or RFQ, and the Corporation shall under no circumstances be responsible or liable for any such costs, regardless of, without limitation, the conduct or outcome of the bidding, evaluation, and selection process.

2 SUB-CONTRACTING

- 2.1 A person awarded a contract may only enter into a subcontracting arrangement with the approval of the organ of state.
- 2.2 A person awarded a contract in relation to a designated sector, may not subcontract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold.

ANNEXURE "D"

SBD 9 CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
