DETAILED SPECIFICATIONS

Maintenance inspections are essential to ensure the correct functionality and reliability of the UPS System. iThemba LABS invites service providers to submit a quotation to carry out preventative maintenance on our static UPSs that will involve checking their electrical installation and operating environment, controlled start-up, and testing as per the following specifications:

1. During this preventative maintenance, the field service engineer will need to carry out the following checks:
 - Check status, function, and visually inspect UPS and batteries for dust, mechanical damages, etc.
 - Visual inspection of screws and cable connections to ensure all terminal connections are tight and sound.
 - Check and inspect UPS overall operation and main components (Inverters, rectifiers, and battery charger) – Perform a simulation of a power outage to prove functionality.
 - Provide a complete operational test of the energy storage system, including a monitored battery-rundown test to determine if any battery strings are near the end of their useful lives, AC ripple current, and interconnecting cable resistance testing.
 - Measure current, voltage, and frequency
 - Measure the battery float charging current
 - Measure the voltage of each cell and battery bank/string
 - Measure and record the current load conditions (Check load sharing between phases)
 - Measure and check inverter, rectifier, and charger's output current and voltage
 - Conduct battery discharge and load test the battery bank to determine its capacity (Record and log measurements to track battery performance)
 - Check transfer of the load from UPS to mains operation via static bypass.
 - Check and review event logs and operations alarms, clear/correct where necessary. Run all UPS system diagnostics, and correct all diagnosed problems
 - Check and calibrate each system. This check includes switchgear and circuit breakers, meters, and alarm levels for frequency, voltage, current, transfer, trip, alarm, etc.
 - Record the AC ripple voltage and current going to the battery and ensure that the rectifier-charger filtering circuits are maintaining a ripple output that meets the battery manufacturers requirements on both a continuous and intermittent (spikes, transients) basis
 - Check the integrity of the battery rack
 - Clean and vacuum UPS equipment enclosures
 - Inspect batteries for signs of leaks (If a battery monitoring system is in place, review their results)

- Check air ventilation and room temperature. Conduct a visual inspection of the UPS room, making sure the overall environment is clean and free of dust and debris
 - Inspect and test the room ventilation system to ensure its proper operation
 - Ensure that air circulation within the UPS enclosure is maintained. After inspection, replace any air filter elements in the UPS enclosure as required.
2. It is preferable that the maintenance is performed by a service engineer from the manufacturer or from an agent certified by the manufacturer (proof must be submitted). Or bidder must demonstrate competency to the delivery of technical support, service, and maintenance of static UPSs and their battery energy storage systems and have rendered similar services (maintenance and service of UPS) for minimum of three (3) different clients within the last 60 months (table on page 7 must be completed)
 3. When UPSs are maintained, the maintenance field service engineer will need to issue the service record book to iThemba LABS as this will be used to record the full-service history of these UPSs.
 4. Notify the iThemba LABS IT head before any UPS switching tests are required to discuss the risks to running equipment loads. The execution of these tests will be at the discretion of iThemba LABS.

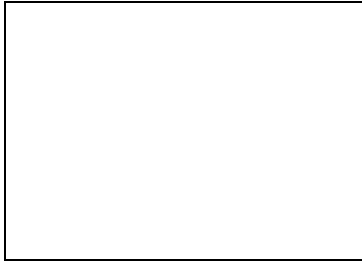
