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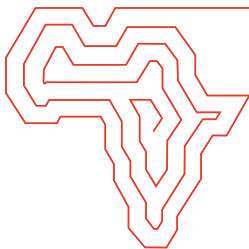

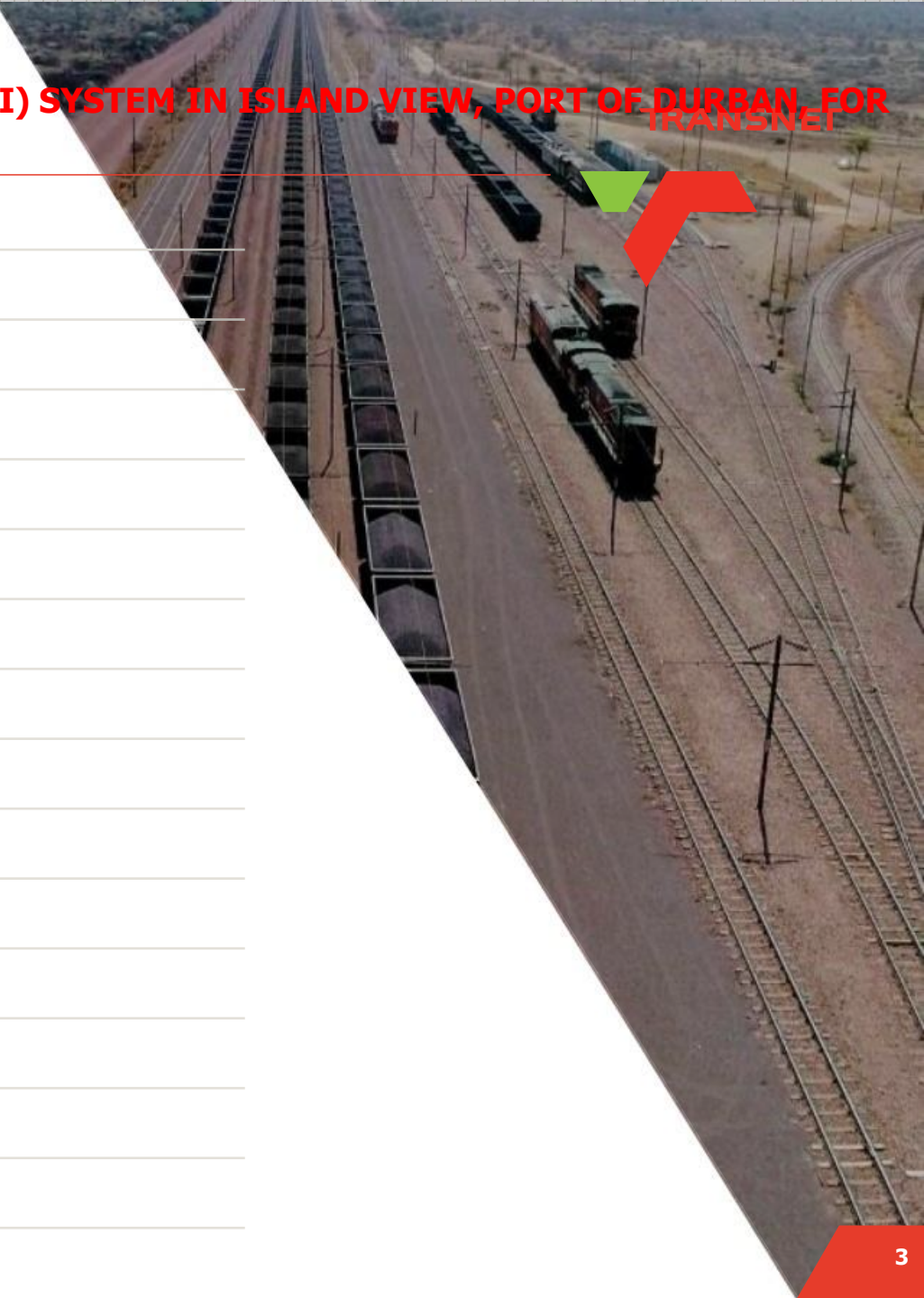

Project Overview & Background

- The Island View Precinct is equipped with a Central Foam Injection (CFI) system, a fire fighting system designed to protect the Petro-chemicals sites in the complex.
- The CFI system was installed approximately 40 years ago and is currently maintained and managed by TNPA.
- The CFI system installation complies with International Fire Safety standards such as the Fire Protection Act (NFPA) and the International Safety Guide for Oil Tankers and Terminals (ISGOTT).
- The services required for this contract are maintenance, service, and repairs to various components of the CFI system located in Island View and Berth 9, i.e.,
 - Steel pipeline and flanges,
 - Main isolation, hydrant, and air valves,
 - Berth fire monitors

- Indicate total revenue for the year under review and whether it is based on audited financial statements or management account.

- Empowering supplier status must be indicated. For QSEs, the deponent must select the basis for the empowering supplier status.

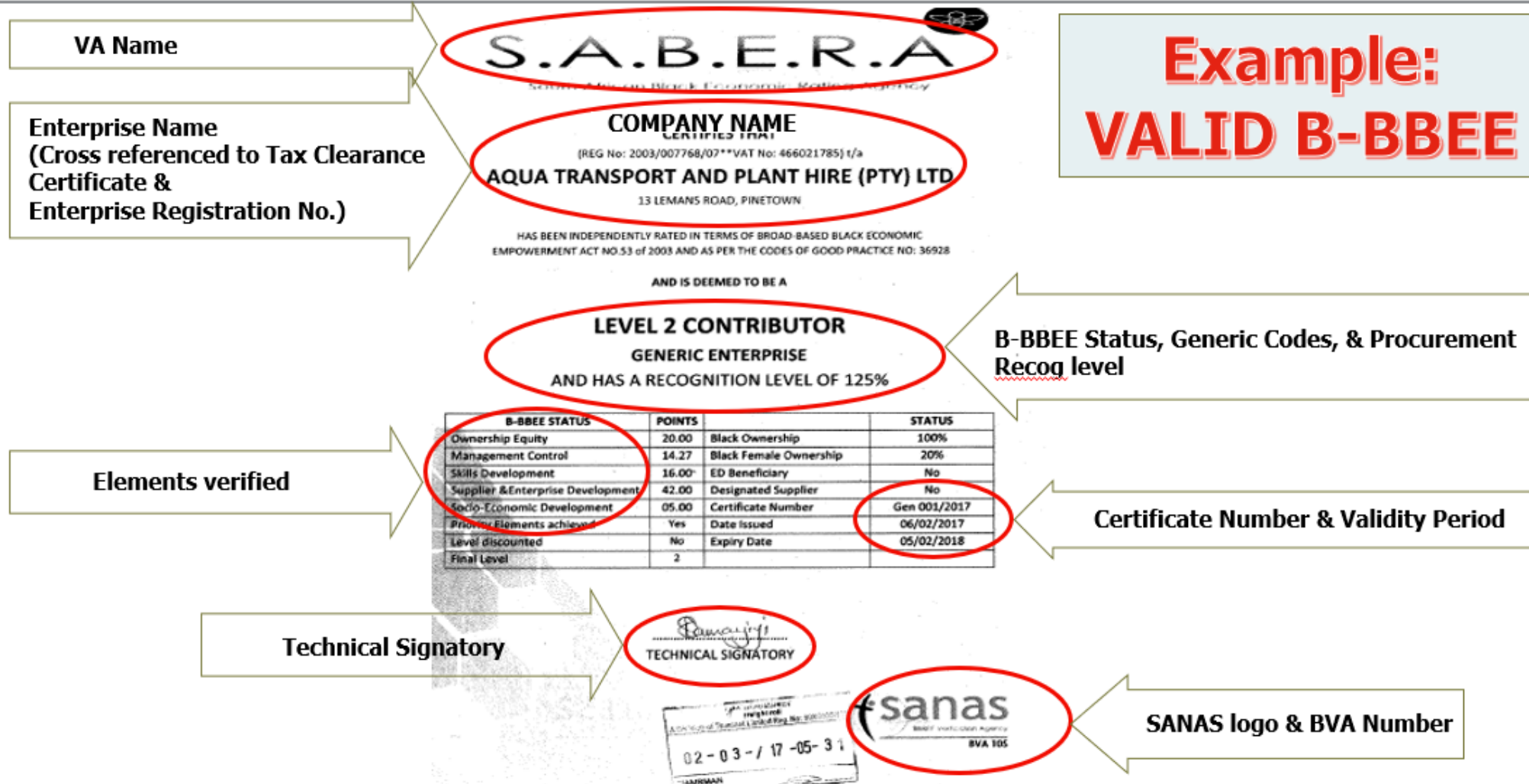
