1 GENERAL

Submissions to this Request for Proposal (RFP) [hereinafter referred to as a Tender or a Proposal] are requested from persons, companies, close corporations or enterprises [hereinafter referred to as an entity or Tenderer].

1.1 DESCRIPTION of SUB-PROJECT#1

RFP number SFF/2022/NOE/SP#1 is for a technical service provider, referred to as the Tenderer in this tender document, to Carry Out *Sub-Project#1* comprising an Airborne Gravity and Magnetic Survey (AGAMS) Over Licence Block B2 in South Sudan.

1.2 TENDER DEADLINES

Confirm receipt and intention to bid using form in APPENDIX 1 by **13/04/2022**

Deadline for tender queries is **15/04/2022**

All responses to queries will be provided by **22/04/2022**

Amended deadline for proposal submission is **06/05/2022 at 16:00 hrs South African Time**. Tenderers must ensure that tenders are delivered timeously. As a general rule, if a Tender is late or delivered to the incorrect address, it will not be accepted for consideration.

If the attachments exceed 20MB in total file size, the tenderer should submit the proposal in multiple emails clearly marked 1 of 3, 2 of 3, etc.

2 DELIVERY INSTRUCTIONS FOR RFP

2.1 Delivery by hand

If delivered by hand, envelopes must be deposited in the tender box which is located at the PV-SA office in Foyer 3, 1st Floor, The Colosseum, Century Way, Century City, 7447, Cape Town, South Africa. It should also be noted that the above tender box will be accessible to tenderers between office hours 08h00 to 16h00 week days only.

2.2 Dispatch by courier

- 2.2.1. If dispatched by courier, the envelope must be addressed as above and delivered to the above address. Couriered documents must be in the tender box by the closing date and time.
- 2.2.2. If tender responses are not delivered as stipulated herein, such tenders will not be considered.
- 2.2.3. No faxed Submissions will be considered.
- 2.2.4. The tender responses to this RFP will be opened as soon as possible after the closing date and time. SFF or PV-SA shall not, at the opening of Submissions, disclose to any other company any confidential details pertaining to the Proposals / information received, i.e. pricing, delivery, etc. The names and locations of the Tenderers will be divulged to other Tenderers upon request after award of the contract.
- 2.2.5. Envelopes must not contain documents relating to any RFP other than that shown on the envelope.

3 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

SFF Association fully endorses and supports the Government's objective of Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

SFF Association would therefore prefer to do business with enterprises who share these same values and who are prepared to contribute to meaningful B-BBEE initiatives [including, but not limited to subcontracting and Joint Ventures] as part of their tendered Submissions. All procurement transactions will be evaluated accordingly.

3.1 B-BBEE Scorecard and Rating

- **the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50,000,000 (all applicable taxes included) OR**
- **the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50,000,000 (all applicable taxes included)**

When SFF association invites prospective Service Providers to submit Proposals for its various expenditure programmes, it requires Tenderers to have their B-BBEE status verified in compliance

with the Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act No. 53 of 2003.

Tenderers are required to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their B-BBEE Status as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points for their B-BBEE status.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

3.2 B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums

Tenderers who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Tenderers must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by SFF association through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to SFF Association.

Tenderers are to note that for the purpose of evaluation, a JV will be evaluated based on one consolidated B-BBEE score card as per the **Preferential Procurement Regulations 2017** preference point scoring.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and original B-BBEE certificate for the JV or a certified copy thereof at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for B-BBEE.

3.3 Subcontracting

SFF Association fully endorses Government's transformation and empowerment objectives and when contemplating subcontracting. Tenderers are requested to give preference to companies which are Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, EMEs and QSEs.

In terms of sub-regulation 5 of Regulations 6 and 7 of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 respectively, if contemplating subcontracting, a tenderer will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level of contributor if the tender documents indicate that the tenderer intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other person not qualifying for at least the points that the tenderer qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability to execute the subcontract.

In terms of Annexure A of this RFP [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form], Tenderers are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s.

In addition, tenderers are required to attach a letter from the intended sub-contractor in the event of the Tenderer's appointment.

- 4.3 After the closing date of the RFP, a Tenderer may only communicate with the Procurement Unit, specific person for this RFP on any matter relating to its RFP.
- 4.4 Tenderers are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 4.5 Tenderers are warned that a proposal will be liable to disqualification should any attempt be made by a Tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer or employee of SFF in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 4.6 Furthermore, Tenderers found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with SFF in the future.

5 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE RFP

- 5.1. Proposals must be submitted as an original and 1 copy, unless an electronic submission is made.
- 5.2. For hard copy submissions, both sets of documents are to be submitted to the office address specified under point 1.6 above.
- 5.3. All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Part 5] must be returned with your proposal.
- 5.4. Unless otherwise expressly stated, all proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

6 COMPLIANCE

The successful Tenderer shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

7 DISCLAIMERS

Tenderers are hereby advised that SFF is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that SFF reserves the right to:

- 7.1. modify the RFP's Scope of Work and request Tenderers to re-tender on any such changes;
- 7.2. reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and scope of work which are detailed herein;
- 7.3. disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [Closing Date];
- 7.4. not necessarily accept the lowest priced Proposal or an alternative Tender;

- 7.5. validate any information submitted by Tenderers in response to this tender. This would include but not limited to, requesting the Tenderer to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a tender, the Tenderer hereby irrevocable grant the necessary consent to SFF to do so;
- 7.6. request audited financial statement or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;
- 7.7. award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;

8 LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Tenderer will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by SFF Legal Advisor, prior to consideration for an award of business.

9 NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Tenderers are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database ("CSD") which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of the State and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Tenderers must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Tenderer who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

For this purpose, the attached SBD1 form must be completed and submitted as a mandatory returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid (Please see APPENDIX I).

10 TAX COMPLIANCE

Tenderers must be compliant when submitting a proposal to SFF and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this tender that the tax matters of the successful Tenderer be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Tenderer's tax obligations.

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Tenderers who wish to submit tenders.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

11 PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT, NO.4 OF 2013

SFF Association acknowledges that the Tenderer may be required to process the personal information of SFF Association and other relevant data subjects in connection with and for the purposes of this RFP.

The Tenderer shall –

- (a) only process such personal information for the purpose connected with this RFP, except to the extent specifically requested to do otherwise by SFF association in writing or required by the Protection of Personal Information Act, No.4 of 2013 (POPI) or other applicable laws;

PART 2. BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

12 BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF WORK

Scope of Work for the Execution of a Geophysical Service as follows:

As part of its committed Exploration programme, SFF is soliciting the following technical services through its appointed Project Management Company “PV-SA”:

- A. Sub Project #1:** Acquisition of Airborne Gravity Magnetic data in Block B2, South Sudan.
- B. Sub Project #2:** Alignment/fixing of Acquisition parameters, Quality control of acquired data, Data processing, Modelling, Inversion and interpretation of Gravity–Magnetic data in specified area of Block B2, South Sudan.

12.1 DESCRIPTION of SUB-PROJECT#1

RFP number SFF/2022/NOE/SP#1 is for a service provider, referred to as the Tenderer in this tender document, to carry out Sub-Project#1 comprising an airborne gravity and magnetic survey (AGAMS) over licence Block B2 in South Sudan.

The present tender is for Sub Project #1. The Tender for Sub project #2 is being issued separately. Under no circumstances will both sub-projects be awarded to the same company to avoid a “Conflict of interest” and to get the best possible results.

Both sub-projects will run concurrently and in collaboration with each other, input and advice of Expert/Company appointed for Sub project #2 before the commencement of acquisition of GM data in Block B2 for fixing the acquisition parameters and during the acquisition of data are to be considered by Contractor of Project #1 and any data not approved by Contractor of Sub project#2 on technical ground and quality check, will not be accepted by SFF. The Project Management consultants (PV-SA) and the SFF Technical team will have final approval authority in case of any dispute.

Airborne Gravity and Magnetic Survey Over License Block B2, South Sudan ([Sub-Project#1](#))

12.2 Background Information

South Africa’s state-owned Strategic Fuel Fund (“SFF”) signed an Exploration and Production Sharing Agreement (EPSA) with the Ministry of Petroleum, South Sudan government during May 2019. Under this agreement, SFF will carry out E&P activities in Block B2 in partnership with South Sudan’s national oil company, Nile Petroleum Corp (carried partner).

As part of it’s obligations SFF requires the Tenderer to carry out Sub-Project#1 comprising an AGAMS which will include data acquisition, field quality control and initial processing. SFF is seeking a Tenderer that can demonstrate capability and record of accomplishment in conducting AGAMS in the African region in general and preferably within South Sudan.

12.3 Technical Overview

For the fulfilment of the EPSA responsibilities and commitments in licence Block B2 in South

Sudan, SFF plans to understand existing Petroleum system in licence area and develop a Geological model for the risk mitigation. It includes acquisition of new airborne gravity and magnetic data across licence Block B2. This process will assist in scaling down and delineating target areas for the petroleum exploration programme.

The survey area of interest is located in the south-eastern portion of South Sudan and extends over an area estimated at around 37000 sq-km, equivalent to around 26000 Line-km of geophysical data (based upon preferred main line spacing). During this acquisition phase, given the locations of Bor and Juba airports within or close to licence Block B2, it is anticipated that either or both airports may be used as base stations for daily flight departures. This potentially offers the option of simultaneous flights from the two airports to help fast-track survey data acquisition while also shortening survey time.

Design of paras, specifications, and products of this survey will be determined essentially on subsurface depth of geological targets and legacy data in consultation with Experts engaged for Sub Project#2. Legacy data over the area of interest is limited to basic geological mapping, a small vintage 2D seismic interpretation, and vintage gravity coverage and satellite gravity data.

Airborne traverse lines need to be flown in a south west to north east (N 40° E) direction with traverse line spacing of 2000 metres. Tie lines are required to be flown perpendicular to the traverse lines at a spacing of 6000 metres apart.

Data quality control and quality assurance, and preliminary data processing need to be carried out on a daily basis during the acquisition phase of the project by contractor of Sub Project#2.

12.4 Objectives

The AGAMS objective is to obtain comprehensive information regarding basin architecture and structure that will provide a framework for making better informed exploration decisions, and ultimately to provide an effective and relatively cost effective way in this exploration asset in Block B2 in South Sudan by using such high quality potential field (PF) geophysical data.

12.5 Overall Scope of Work

All aspects (project goals, deliverables, etc.) relating to the execution of the AGAMS in Block B2, South Sudan, including but not limited to:

- Airborne survey acquisition design parameters (line spacing, tie line spacing, line orientation, tie line orientation, flight altitude, sampling rate, etc.);
- Airborne survey acquisition using a state-of-the-art fixed wing gravity and magnetic systems with peripheral navigation, GPS, magnetic compensation and altimeter systems on board;
- Execute periodical quality control on field of raw data collected to discard information below standards;
- Execute regular checks to correct equipment mis calibrations;
- Reporting and presentation of outcomes.

12.6 Work Execution Plan

Contractor must submit the proposed Project Execution Plan (PEP), which shall provide details of the specific activities in the project, the resources applied to the project, and the organization of the project. The major elements of a project execution plan are:

- Scope Definition
- Project scheduling
- Timelines as per deliverables (Milestones)
- Quality and technical specifications
- Resource allocation
- Safety and Environmental Management System (refer to Appendix IV for basic guidance)

12.7 AGAMS Description and Specifications

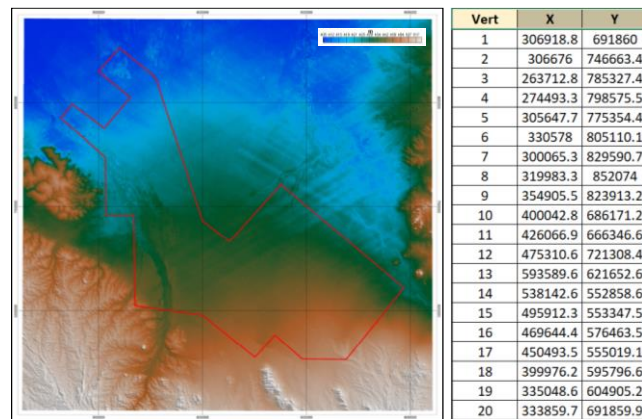
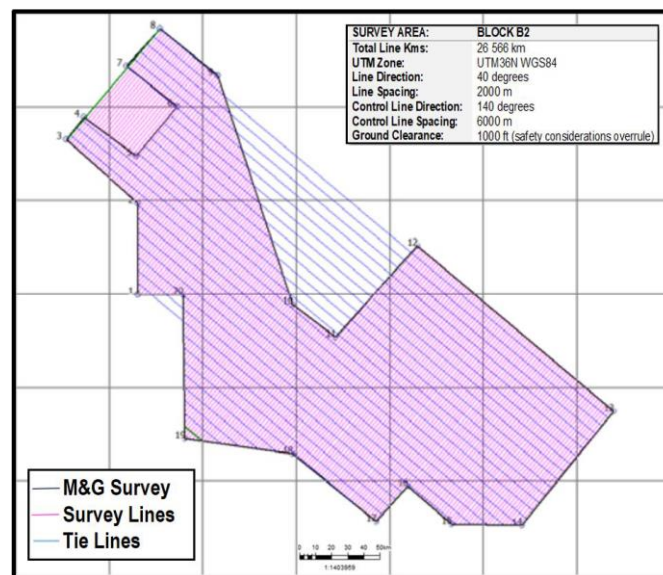


Figure 1: Topography map for the area of interest with tabulated survey boundary co-ordinates to the right.

Location and Terrain: The survey is situated in South Sudan. A locality map is provided below (Figure1). The terrain is moderate and therefore a gentle drape survey is recommended. The survey boundary (red line) is defined in the following table:

Survey Specifications: A summary of the survey line directions and line kilometres is provided in the map and inset table below.



12.8 Equipment's and software Specifications (SoS):

Required Instrumentation and Recording Rates:

- Gravimeter sensor: GT2A or similar
- Magnetometer sensor: Cs vapour
- Magnetometer recording rate: >10Hz
- Fluxgate: 3 axis Bartington or similar
- Fluxgate recording rate: >10Hz
- Laser altimeter operating range: >1000m
- Radar altimeter operating range: >700m
- Base station magnetometer sensor: Cs vapour
- Base station recording rate: >1Hz
- GPS base station: 12 channel, dual carrier L1/L2
- Power supplies and computer equipment

Survey Tolerances:

Re-flights or additional sortie flights will be required in the event that one of the tolerances listed below is not achieved. All re-flights will be carried out at the service provider's expense. Re-flown segments will always cross at least two tie lines.

Flight Lines:

The final survey drape surface will be pre-calculated using available satellite terrain models. A grid of the calculated drape surface and proposed survey height will be provided prior to survey start by The Service Provider. Deviations in excess of +/- 30m of the specified drape elevation for a distance of greater than 2000 metres, with due consideration for the crew and aircraft safety having been made, will result in re-flight at the Service Provider's expense.

Flight speed:

Normal airspeed will be approximately 185 km/hr, but this may vary in areas of rugged terrain and dependent on wind conditions. The nominal airspeed for the survey should adhere to the 185 km/hr specification Or as specified by Subcontractor of Subproject #2 in consultation with contractor of Subproject #1 keeping in view the quality of data and safety aspect. .

Line Spacing Tolerance:

A gap in excess of 110% or less than 90% of the nominal line spacing for a distance of 1000 metres or more, or any gap in excess of 120% or less than 80% of the nominal line spacing will result in a re-flight.

Gravity Data Quality Assessment:

At the start of every production flight, a 30 km repeat line will be flown to monitor the performance of the gravity system. The repeat line results will be used to demonstrate the accuracy-resolution performance of the gravity system. A convenient set of ferry lines may be used as repeat lines to ensure production is not compromised. Green and Lane (2003) or simple RMS methods are to be used to calculate performance of the system, which must demonstrate an overall accuracy of better than 0.7 mGals using a full wavelength filter equivalent to 5.5 km. Individual repeat lines which differ significantly from the mean of combined daily repeats may be used to flag problems on individual sorties.

Gravity Data Re-flights:

- If any of the following channels are not recorded digitally: Time, XYZ accelerations or equivalent gravity signal components, TMI, X, Y and/or Long/Lat, GPS-Z, time synchronised diurnal and GPS ground reference ground stations.
- If the fully processed (100 sec. filter length) Free Air Gravity signal on a particular line has an envelope of high frequency variations that differs from a smoothed surface constructed from adjacent lines (constructed near the completion of the survey) by more than 2 mGal peak to trough amplitude over a 9km length, unless such variations can be explained by localised geology.
- If the RMS difference between all the traverse and tie-line cross-over points for Free Air gravity processed at an equivalent filter length of 5.5 km exceeds 0.7 mGals, additional re-flights will be required until the required survey accuracy is achieved.
- If the RMS difference between traverse and tie-line cross-over points for Free Air gravity processed at an equivalent filter length of 5.5 km exceeds 2 mGals for individual lines, the affected lines will be re-flown.
- If calculated GPS PDOP is greater than 6 or of less than 4 satellites are used a re-flight will be required.

Magnetic Data Re-Flights:

- If the normalised 4th difference of the magnetic data exceeds 0.05 nT peak-to-peak for distances of greater than 1km provided the noise is not due to geological or cultural sources.
- The measured diurnal field varies by more than 10nT per 10 min chord.
- Where the base station has ceased to function for periods of 10 minutes or more., or where data losses exceeds 5% of the readings over a 30 second interval this will require a re-flight

12.9 Data Calibration

Gravity Data Calibration:

1. Prior to commencement of the survey and at reasonable regular intervals during the survey, the service provider will demonstrate the overall accuracy-resolution of the airborne gravity system. For this purpose, a 40km test line will be flown in reciprocal directions 6 times. Gravity data are to be processed to Free Air gravity using a range of downline filters with wavelengths from 60 to 180s. Using methods suggested by Green and Lane (2003) or simple RMS methods, the processed repeat line data must demonstrate an accuracy of better than 0.7 mGals using a full wavelength filter equivalent to 5.5 km. The filter length is to be calculated by multiplying the aircraft velocity by the downline filter time.
2. Prior to every survey flight the gravimeter output will be checked and a gravimeter reference measurement at primary base of at least 15 minutes duration will be recorded. Immediately after landing, the sortie will terminate at the primary base and the gravimeter system will again be checked (gravity reading will be taken after 20 minutes of settled time) and any drift recorded. The total (stationary) gravity meter system drift must not exceed 0.4 mGal/hr with linear drift.

Magnetic Data Calibration:

1. Figure of Merit (FOM). A suitable area of low magnetic gradient will be chosen and a 5km box orientated to the line direction will be designed. This will be flown as high as possible above ground with all equipment operating. The FOM will be calculated by summing the absolute errors of each of the 12 maneuvers and will be less than 2.0 nT. This test will be done before any production flying is done. The test will be repeated following aircraft maintenance.
2. Parallax Test. The Service Provider will perform lag tests to determine the time difference between the magnetometer readings and the operation of the positioning devices. Short test lines will be flown in two (2) directions at survey altitude across a distinct magnetic anomaly. Lag tests will be carried out before commencement of survey operations.

12.10 Navigation Data:

- Static GPS Test. The navigation system will be checked by a static GPS test at the start and end of each day. The test comprised recording the position of the aircraft GPS antenna for approximately five minutes by parking over a fixed (marked) point on the ground. These measurements can be carried out in conjunction with the gravimeter drift test.
- Altimeter Calibration. A series of lines at variable heights will be flown over flat terrain, normally the airstrip, and a regression curve is calculated comparing the GPS height to the laser height.

12.11 Field Data Processing:

Field data are to be supplied to the PV-SA on a daily basis via ftp site for QA/QC purposes. Field databases should be in ASCII format equivalent.

Gravity Data:

The service provider will reduce collected raw field data to Free Air gravity data on a daily basis. Free Air data should be derived using a range of filter lengths including 60s, 80s, 100s, 135, and 180s which are to be applied to raw and final data.

Field gravity databases should include positional data, free air filtered data, channels for VMON (vertical acceleration) to monitor turbulence effects on the system and GPS information including number of satellites, PDOP and HDOP channels.

For field quality control purposes, first-order tie-line levelling may be applied to the 100s Free Air data channel. This data will be for quality control of traverse-tie cross-over errors.

Magnetic Data:

The service provider will apply the following processes to raw magnetic data on a daily basis:

- Aircraft compensation
- Lag and parallax corrections
- Diurnal corrections
- Spike removal

Field magnetic databases should include positional data, raw and corrected magnetic channel data.

12.12 Final Data Processing:

The service provider will deliver data via FTP on a daily basis. Only data that has been QC'd and falls within the required specifications will be delivered. Data that does not fall in with the specification will be re-flown the following day. Weekly and Monthly Progress reports will also be delivered outlining all progress, as well as any problems encountered for that time period.

All maps will show the flight path trace and topographic data; latitude and longitude are also noted on maps. However, should the delay be of a nature that is beyond the control of the Service provider and verified by an independent QA\QC team appointed by SFF, a standby rate **(to be negotiated at the contract stage)** per day will be charged depending on causes of such standby days.

13 STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS (SUB-PROJECT#1)

13.1 Duration

This agreement shall commence and be effective on the date of signature (the Commencement Date) and shall continue unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

13.2 Milestone / Payment Schedule

Disbursements and transactions will be in South African rand (ZAR) in phased manner as per successful completion of pre-agreed milestones and percentage of total cost of Sub-Project#1.

- Milestone #1: On signature of contract (10% payment)
- Milestone #2: On 1st successful flight (20% payment)
- Milestone #3: 50% of successful data collection (30% payment)
- Milestone #4: 90% of successful data collection (20% payment)
- Milestone #5: On delivery of final products (20% payment)

13.3 Prioritised Areas of the Survey

SFF shall within five (5) days of the Commencement Date submit to the Tenderer a comprehensive list and accompanying maps depicting areas, which are to be prioritized for flying of the survey and data acquisition. The Tenderer shall first carry out the services over the prioritized areas before commencing such services over the remainder of the survey area, subject to logistical constraints and unless directed otherwise by SFF's Representative (PV-SA). The priority area needs to comprise a set of contiguous flight lines with a reasonable threshold of coverage for producing maps that can be used to interpret geophysical anomalies.

13.4 Operation Costs Breakdown:

The price quoted by the Tenderer for the airborne project in South Sudan is ALL INCLUSIVE AND PAYABLE IN SOUTH AFRICAN RANDS (ZAR) and includes the following:

- Aircraft mob/demob, including cost and arrangement of all transfers at Juba and other station in South Sudan if applicable
- Aircraft maintenance and upkeep for airworthiness as per aviation rules in South Sudan
- Aircraft and equipments insurances
- Installation, removal and freight of survey equipment
- All survey flights to specification
- Personnel costs incl. salaries, subsistence, travel, food, insurances, transport etc.
- All airport fees; VISA and necessary immunization
- All travel costs of personnel crew during the execution of the project

13.5 **SFF Responsibilities:**

SFF is responsible for the following:

- Assistance in procuring Permitting, including Temporary Air Service Permit, Temporary Import Permit and landowner permissions required for the performance of the project
- Notifying military, local communities and all other required parties
- Office space with electricity and internet for the Tenderer's crew at SFF's compound in Juba
- Assistance in preparation of visas for the Tenderer's crew
- Security for personnel crew, Equipment's at the compound
- Security for the aircraft at the airport

13.6 **Insurance**

- Tenderer shall provide, maintain and pay for the following insurance coverage:
 - General liability insurance for bodily injury, death and damage to property including loss of use thereof, and without restricting the generality of the foregoing, such coverage shall include contractual liability, delictual/tortious liability, contractor's protective liability and products and completed operations liability. Such insurance shall be in the name of the Tenderer and shall extend to and cover all acts of the Tenderer, its officers and employees, including any contractors retained by the Tenderer in terms of this agreement;
 - Aircraft liability insurance covering all aircraft used by the Tenderer in connection with the performance of the Services for appropriate amount hereunder covering public liability, passenger liability and property damage liability; and
 - Employer's liability insurance, which covers each employee (including contract staff of companies contracted by the Tenderer) of the Tenderer engaged in providing the Services hereunder where such employee is not covered by Workers' Compensation.
- Tenderer shall maintain, provide and pay for all risks insurance covering Tenderer's machinery and equipment used by it in the performance of the Services.
- From time to time, any additional insurance which the Tenderer is of the opinion is required for the performance of the Services shall be obtained by the Tenderer at its own cost and expense.
- All insurance required by this clause shall be and remain in full force and effect during the time in which the Tenderer is performing the Services and finally leaving South Sudan .

13.7 **Breach By Either Party**

If either Party breaches any provision of this agreement, then the aggrieved Party shall give the other Party notice of such breach, and should the other Party fail to remedy such breach within seven (7) days of the receipt of notice, then the aggrieved Party shall be entitled at such Party's option to convene a meeting between the Parties upon a further seven (7) days written notice to discuss and attempt to resolve the breach. If such meeting cannot resolve the breach to the satisfaction of the aggrieved Party or if the other Party refuse to attend the meeting despite receipt of written notice thereof, the aggrieved Party may institute arbitration proceedings immediately for enforcement of the terms of this agreement or, alternatively and without further notice, to declare this agreement cancelled, all of which may be done without prejudice to any claim the aggrieved Party may have in law for damages arising from breach of contract or any other cause.

13.8 **Termination By SFF**

SFF may at any time terminate this agreement by giving the Tenderer 60 (Sixty) days written notice of its intention to terminate this agreement. In such a case, the Tenderer shall be entitled to be paid for all the work actually undertaken by it, and to be reimbursed for any expense the Tenderer reasonably incurred by it, up to the date of termination.

13.9 Force Majeure

- No failure by either party to perform in accordance within the provisions of this Agreement shall constitute a breach of this Agreement if the failure arising is from Force Majeure
- "Events of Force Majeure" mean but are not limited to acts of: God, war, insurrection, riot, orders or regulations of any civil, military or governmental authority, civil commotion, strikes, lockouts, labour disputes, fire, weather, theft, explosions, earthquakes, lightning strikes, floods; unforeseen delays in acquiring and/or transporting material, equipment and fuel; actions and requisition by Public Authorities, pandemic, USA government redirection of GPS satellites or laws, sun spot disturbances affecting GPS satellites, and any other causes whether or not similar to the foregoing and beyond the control of the parties, except financial events, which precludes the performance of either Party's obligations pursuant to this agreement for such period of Force Majeure
- In event of Force Majeure occurrence, Tenderer and SFF shall promptly notify each other, giving full particulars thereof, and shall use their best efforts to remedy such failures of fulfilment with all reasonable dispatch. Tenderer and SFF shall continue to keep the other party fully advised of the progress being made in such efforts
- If the Project is terminated because of Force Majeure, the cost of all surveying successfully completed to the satisfaction of the Client, shall be borne by the Client. The Client will not be liable to pay any stand-by charges

13.10 Stand-By cost

SFF will be liable for stand-by fees to be negotiated with the Tenderer per day per standing aircraft under the following circumstances:

- Government community or landowner disputes
- Cancellation, expiry, suspension or delay of operational permit, or other approvals and licenses, including Temporary Air Service Permit & Temporary Import Permit
- Cancellation, expiry, suspension or delay of visas for Tenderer crew or SFF employees
- In the event of the Tenderer's crew, in spite of having the ability of work performance, is inactive and waiting on the SFF instructions
- In the event of security issues, of which SFF is responsible for, preventing the Tenderer's crew from working safely
- Awaiting quality control approval from the consultant of Sub Project #2 after 3 (three) days of providing the data and required clarifications to the Tenderer waiting
- Inclement weather (applicable after pre agreed time)

SFF will not be liable for stand-by fee under the following circumstances:

- In the event of a delay caused by an equipment breakdown
- In the event of a delay caused by an aircraft break down
- In the event of a delay caused by routine maintenance
- In the event of the Tenderer's crew awaiting approval from the Tenderer's internal quality control staff
- In the event of the crew going on strike and stopping work

APPENDIX (IV): SAFETY ARRANGEMENTS AND PROCEDURAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (ACT 85 OF 1993) AND APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

1. General

- 1.1 The Contractor and SFF (hereinafter referred to as “the Client”) are individual employers, each in its own right, with their respective duties and obligations set out in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, Act 85 of 1993 (the Act) and applicable Regulations.
- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by SFF, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 SFF accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 **“competent person”** in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed:
Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 **“contractor”** means principal contractor and **“subcontractor”** means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **“fall protection plan”** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **“health and safety file”** means a file or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;

- 2.7 **“Health and Safety Plan”** means a documented plan which addresses the hazards identified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 **“Risk Assessment”** means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.9 **“the Act”** means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.
3. The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.1 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager.
- 3.2 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.4 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and safety requirements and procedures.
- 4. Special Permits**
- Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hot work, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.
- 5. Health and Safety Programme**
- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
- (i) The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;

- (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
 - (iv) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 5.2 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any **Construction Work** and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
- The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
 - the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
 - a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
 - a monitoring and review plan.
- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
- The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
 - the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
 - the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
 - the site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented;
 - The introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 5.5 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms

of the Act and Regulations. The Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.

- 5.6 The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.7 The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.8 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organization, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.9 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.12 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1 In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent person, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract. The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fall protection plan shall include: -
 - A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - The procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
 - The evaluation of the employees' physical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions;

- The training of employees working from elevated positions; and
- The procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager.
- 8.3 The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager upon completion of the **Works** and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.

HSE philosophy

Inherent safety and protection of the environment is a prerequisite from the beginning of the design process. The HSE philosophy must be included in the design premise document, and should include considerations on waste reduction, minimisation of fugitive emissions, ground water pollution prevention, minimisation of manning levels for hazardous processes, hazardous materials handling, early detection systems and specific measures to reduce risks to ALARP levels.

Risk analysis

The risk analysis at pre-feasibility and feasibility level is expected to be qualitative and progress to a quantitative technique at the FEED level. There may however be some need for quantitative information in the feasibility phase to support the EIA. The analysis of risks includes those risks to human life, environment and material assets. The results of the risk analysis need to be compared to

an agreed risk acceptance criteria and necessary risk reducing measures will be identified and implemented (e.g. detection and early warning systems etc).

Hazard identification study

A systematic evaluation of all hazards shall be performed in the hazard study. The hazard study is the basis for the area classification drawings and may alter the location of for example buildings, process units on the plot plan or may lead to additional preventive measures (firewalls, other material types etc) being required.
