Project Objective/s:	The purpose of this report is to seek authority from the Bid Adjudication Committee to approve the appointment of the service provider under Section 36 (1) (a) & (v) of the SCM regulations.
Scope of Works:	This specification applies to the provision of refuse collection services in KwaMashu B, C, D, G and Siyanda incorporating the following: - On-going collection of refuse from occupied premises in formal areas, including disposal. - On-going collection of refuse and the disposal thereof, from occupied premises and open areas in informal areas. - On-going litter picking in road reserves and clearing out open stormwater channels. - Ad-hoc sundry services including litter picking of selected open areas, removal of rubbish piles, and servicing of refuse drums

3. MOTIVATION FOR APPLICABILITY OF REGULATION 36

BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Cleansing and Solid Waste Unit has been utilizing the services of WS. 6968 major contract to provide street sweeping and refuse removal services in Kwamashu B, C, D, G And Campsite – Wards 40, 41, 108. The approval of the contract award for WS.6968 was made by the Bid Adjudication Committee on **20 December 2018**. A copy of the BAC decision is attached as **Annexure A**. Contract WS. 6968 commenced on 01 July 2019 and the completion date was on 30 June 2022.
- 3.2 An extension of four (4) months (01 July 2022- 31 October 2022), report number (SW2022/032) was granted through the Bid Adjudication Committee in June 2022. A copy of the BAC decision is attached as **Annexure B**.
- 3.3 A Section 36 appointment of six (6) months (01 November 2022 to 30 April 2023), report (SW2022/064) was granted through the Bid Adjudication Committee in October 2022. The BAC decision is attached as **Annexure C**.
- 3.4 Another Section 36 appointment was granted through Bid Adjudication Committee for a period of six (6) months (1 May 2023- 31 October 2023). The BAC decision is attached as **Annexure D**.



- 3.5 A Section 36 appointment was approved by the Bid Adjudication Committee for a period of six (6) months (1 November 2023- 30 April 2024). The BAC decision is attached as **Annexure E**.
- 3.6 The current Section 36 appointment was granted by the Bid Adjudication Committee for a period of six (6) months (1 May 2023- 31 October 2024). The BAC decision is attached as **Annexure F**.

4. STATUS OF THE REPLACEMENT AND ADVERTISED CONTRACTS

- 4.1 The Unit advertised replacements contracts, WS.7496, WS.7497, WS.7498, WS.7499, WS.7500, WS.7501, **WS.7502**, WS.7503, WS.7504, WS.7505, WS.7506 and WS.7563 on 08 July 2022 and closed on 12 August 2022, refer to **Annexure G**. **It must be noted that WS.7502 is a replacement contract for WS.6968.** All twelve (12) replacement contracts were advertised simultaneously. The total number of applications received in respect of these tenders were about **865**.

The evaluation reports for the 12 contracts were initially submitted to SCM on 16 January 2024 for reviewing. Between 23 January 2024 and 29 February 2024, SCM provided feedback highlighting concerns and corrections that required attention from the Unit. From 25 January 2024 to 29 February 2024, the Unit addressed queries as and when they were received. Additionally, several concerns were conveyed to the bidders, who provided responses to SCM department e.g., updated tax clearance pin, recent Annual Financial Statements, valid BBBEE etc.

The evaluation reports for the 12 contracts were tabled at the Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC) and was deferred by the Committee, **refer to Annexure H**. The Unit drafted addendums addressing the concerns raised by the committee and submitted them to the committee.

Unsuccessful letters, dated 08/ 08/ 2024, were issued and emailed to the respective bidders, providing a 14-day appeal period, which expired on 26/ 08/ 2024. However, to date, the Unit continues to receive requests from the Legal Department for reasons behind the elimination, along with objections from bidders regarding the responses.



These objections still need to be referred to the Appeals Authority, and it appears that the process will take additional time due to the large number of appeals received.

- 4.2 Again, the Unit advertised five (5) replacements contracts, WS.7558, WS.7559, WS.7560, WS.7561, and WS.7562 on 16 September 2022 and closed on 21 October 2022, **refer to Annexure I**. All five (05) replacement contracts were advertised simultaneously. The total number of responses received in respect of these tenders were about **549**.

The evaluation reports for the five (5) contracts were tabled at the Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC) and was deferred by the Committee, **refer to Annexure J**.

The addendums were drafted addressing the concerns raised by the committee and submitted. On 21 August 2024 these contracts were approved excluding WS. 7561 which was later approved after submitting an addendum.

Unsuccessful letters for these contracts have been issued to the bidders, each with a 14-day appeal period, and some of these appeals have already been emailed to the Unit for responses regarding the reasons for elimination.

- 4.3 Lastly, the Unit advertised six (6) replacements contracts, WS.7622, WS.7623, WS.7624, WS.7625, WS.7626, and WS.7627 on 06 April 2023 and closed on 12 May 2023, **refer to Annexure K**. All six (6) replacement contracts were advertised simultaneously. The total number of applications received in respect of these tenders were about **531**.

The evaluation reports for the six (6) contracts were tabled at the Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC) on 14 February 2024 and was deferred by the Committee, **refer to Annexure L**. The Unit prepared an addendum for the concerns that were raised by the committee and was submitted.

On 02 May 2024, three (3) contracts (WS. 7622, WS. 7624 and WS. 7625) were deferred while two (2) were approved (WS. 7623 and WS. 7627), **refer to Annexure M**. An addendum for the deferred contracts was prepared and submitted to the committee.



No unsuccessful letters have been issued for these contracts, and the Unit is still awaiting their releases.

5. **REASON FOR DEVIATION**

The reasons for deviation are based on the following factors:

- **The high volume of applications received:** The documents are now available for free download and printing, leading to increased interest from bidders and a rise in bid responses.
- **The number of contracts advertised simultaneously:** The evaluation of 1945 applications are time-consuming and voluminous.
- **The strain on resources due to the need to evaluate these applications comprehensively,** e.g., availability of personnel, equipment's etc.

We are also uncertain about the timeline for the finalization of the appeals.

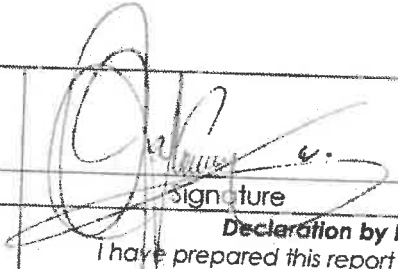

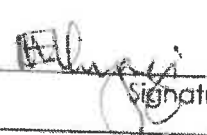

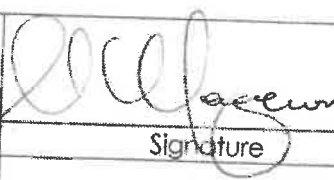


13. RECOMMENDATIONS:
