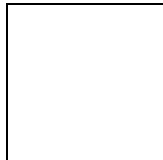

1. BANKSETA BACKGROUND

- 1.1 BANKSETA is a statutory body established through the Skills Development Act of 1998 to enable its stakeholders to advance the national and global position of the banking and micro-finance industry. As guided by its mandate the BANKSETA is an agent of transformation and will promote employment equity and Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment through skills development.
- 1.2 BANKSETA is a schedule 3A public entity with about 92 staff complement. BANKSETA has a head office in Gauteng at 349 Witch-Hazel Avenue, in Eco Park, Centurion, a satellite office in Free State and two regional offices, one in Limpopo and the other in Eastern Cape.

2. THE PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

- 2.1 The BANKSETA would like to appoint one service provider or 2 service providers, one for category A - SCM Tenders and one for Category B - Discretionary Grant funding windows. Bidders may apply for both categories. Bidders are encouraged to bid for both categories if they have expertise and experience for both categories.
- 2.2 The bidder must submit documents covering the requirements of the technical evaluation for Category A and Category B separately and clearly indicate in their proposal which Category they are bidding for, to be scored accordingly.

2.3 Category A – SCM probity/compliance review services

- 2.3.1 BANKSETA as a public entity complies with public sector SCM legislation which includes amongst other
 - i) Section 217 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa Act 108 of 1996
 - ii) The Public Finance Management Act
 - iii) Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 5 of 2000
 - iv) National Treasury SCM Instruction Notes, circulars and guidelines
 - v) State Information Technology Agency Act 88 of 1998
 - vi) Promotion of Access to Information Act 2 of 2000 (PAIA)
 - vii) Promotion of Administrative Justice Act 3 of 2000 (PAJA)
 - viii) Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act 12 of 2004
 - ix) Competition Act 89 of 1998
- 2.3.2 The purpose of the probity/compliance review is to have an independent assessment of BANKSETA's compliance with the applicable legislation, policy and process for each tender transaction before final award.

- 2.3.3 The probity/compliance review should also point out any weaknesses or recommendations for improvements in the tender processes.
- 2.3.4 This should strengthen the control environment, give an independent view of the compliance of the processes used and allow corrections in process or evaluation to be addressed before award.
- 2.3.5 The report will be tabled to the BANKSETA board sub-committee and ultimately to the board before the final award is made.
- 2.3.6 A special request for a probity review can be made as and when requested for the certain parts of the RFB or RFQ evaluation process.
- 2.3.7 All SCM tenders are subjected to a probity/compliance review. The contract will allow for probity review of approximately 20 tenders to be reviewed annually.

2.4 Category B - Discretionary Grants (DG) probity/compliance review services

- 2.4.1 BANKSETA as a SETA uses the SETA Grant Regulations and the Skills Development Levies Act to allocate discretionary grants (DG) and the BANKSETA Discretionary Grant Policy to its sector employers and stakeholders through discretionary grant funding windows. The BANKSETA Discretionary Grant Policy is attached. The legislation is available online.
- 2.4.2 The purpose of the probity/compliance review is to have an independent assessment of BANKSETA's compliance with the applicable legislation, policy and process for each transaction reviewed.
- 2.4.3 It should also point out any weaknesses or recommendations for improvements.
- 2.4.4 This should strengthen the control environment, give an independent view of the compliance of the processes used and allow corrections in process or evaluation to be addressed before award.
- 2.4.5 For transactions above R5 million, the report will be tabled to the BANKSETA board sub-committee and ultimately to the board before the final award is made.
- 2.4.6 A special request for a probity review can be made as and when requested for the certain parts of the evaluation process.
- 2.4.7 In addition, All Discretionary Grant funding windows are subjected to a probity/compliance review. The contract will allow for probity review of approximately 11 funding windows to be reviewed annually.

2.5 OBJECTIVES OF BOTH BANKSETA SCM PROBITY/COMPLIANCE REVIEW AND DISCRETIONARY GRANT (DG) PROBITY REVIEW

The objectives of the review and probity services are to ensure:

- 2.5.1 Compliance with BANKSETA Policies and relevant legislation.

- 2.5.2 Compliance with the Funding Window Guidelines and specific funding criteria and criteria and any other applicable legislation for DG,
- 2.5.3 Administrative compliance with funding window and SCM processes,
- 2.5.4** Compliance with internal controls and governance requirements.

3 SCOPE OF WORK

3.1 SCM PROBITY REVIEW (CATEGORY A)

The scope of work should include, but is not limited to the following:

- 3.1.1 The service provider should check the entire process in line with the SCM policy and relevant legislation.
- 3.1.2 The service provider should check the scoring was done in line with the criteria for a sample of bids/quotes received.
- 3.1.3 The service provider should check accuracy of the reports produced.
- 3.1.4 Samples of the bid scoring and the consolidated scoring sheet must be reviewed.
- 3.1.5 A written report confirming whether the correct processes were utilised, outlining any shortcomings/non-compliance matters were noted and recommendations for corrections and detailing which bids scoring was checked in detail should be produced.

3.1.6 SCM Probity /Compliance Review Services Other Information

- i) Approximately 9% of BANKSETA's expenditure is procured under SCM processed.
- ii) All SCM procurement transactions undergo competitive bidding.
- iii) All transactions above R1 million are processed as tenders /Request for bids (RFBs) in line with legislation. Probity or compliance review services are required for all tender processes before BANKSETA makes the final award.
- iv) All transactions from R2,000 to R1 million are processed as requests for quotation (RFQs) and do not ordinarily undergo probity reviews.
- v) BANKSETA is expecting about 20 tender transactions a year needing this probity/compliance review. The number is dependent of the BANKSETA's needs each year.

3.2 SCOPE OF WORK – DISCRETIONARY GRANT PROBITY REVIEW (CATEGORY B)

The BANKSETA implements discretionary grant (DG) funding and the DG process in line with the applicable public sector legislation that include the following:

- i) Sector Education and Training Authorities (SETAs) Grant Regulations Regarding Monies Received by a SETA and Related Matters (Regulation No. 35940 of 3rd December 2012 as amended and contained in Regulation Gazette No. 9867 (Vol. 570)
- ii) The Skills Development Act, 1998 (No. 97 of 1998) Section 10(1) as amended

iii) The Skills Development Levies Act (No.9 of 1999) (SDLA)

The service provider will be expected to conduct a review of BANKSETA's compliance with the above legislation (thereafter called DG legislation) and the DG process as detailed in the approved funding window guidelines before award of each DG funding window.

Approximately 65% of BANKSETA's expenditure is provisioned under DG funding window process.

The review/probity services will be carried out on the following stages:

3.2.1 Funding Window invitation stage:

3.2.1.1 Confirm the approval of Funding Window Guidelines and specific funding criteria.

3.2.1.2 Review the Invitation Process and alignment to the approved guidelines and specific funding criteria.

3.2.1.3 Have briefings with applicable management and governance structures (where necessary).

3.2.2 Funding Window Application Submission Stage

3.2.2.1 Review the Appointment process of the Evaluation Committee

3.2.2.2 Review the Recording of applications received.

3.2.2.3 Review of Evaluation Tool

3.2.3 DG Funding Window evaluation stage:

3.2.3.1 Review the evaluation process.

3.2.3.2 Review and verify that all mandatory documents have been submitted and completed according to the requirements of the specification.

3.2.3.3 Admin evaluation – review that applicants are correctly declined or approved.

3.2.3.4 Ensure that the evaluation criteria are applied consistently by the Evaluation Committee according to the approved criteria.

3.2.3.5 From the population of the applications evaluated, a sample of the scoring must also be reviewed.

3.2.3.6 Cast and cross cast the scores by Evaluation Committee

3.2.3.7 Review the final Evaluation Committee report.

3.2.4 Reporting

3.2.4.1 Provide a detailed review report, including recommendations at each stage of the funding window process (i.e. the report should include Funding Window invitation, application, evaluation and recommendation stages).

3.2.4.2 Present the report to relevant BANKSETA management and governance structures (when required).

3.3 EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- 3.3.2** To review whether discretionary grant funding windows and SCM tenders are initiated, advertised, evaluated and allocated in the correct manner according to the BANKSETA Discretionary Grant Policy or SCM Policy and relevant legislation.
- 3.3.3** When necessary, the probity reports will be tabled to the BANKSETA governance structure and ultimately to the board before the final award is made to provide an independent view on the compliance of the processes followed.

3.4 EXPECTED OUTPUTS AND DELIVERABLES

- 3.4.2** Provide a detailed review report including recommendations for each stage of the funding window process when needed (i.e. the report should include Funding Window, invitation, application, evaluation and recommendation stages).
- 3.4.3** This should strengthen the control environment, give an independent view of the compliance of the processes used and allow corrections in the process or evaluation to be addressed before award.
- 3.4.4** Present the report to relevant BANKSETA management and governance structures before the final award is made (when required).

4. CATEGORIES.

- 4.1.** This tender has two categories which will be evaluated separately.
- 4.2** A service provider may bid for both categories.
- 4.3** Service providers who wish to bid for both categories must submit proposals with two separate sections each clearly showing the category, and each with information to support the requirements of that particular category.
- 4.4** Service providers bidding for one category must clearly indicate the category they are bidding for and submit information to support the requirements of that category.

5. COMPETENCY AND EXPERTISE REQUIREMENTS

The service provider should provide the requested documents (CVs, resumes/profiles, copy qualifications, copy certificates/membership letters, reference letters etc) to demonstrate that they meet the requirements of the category they are bidding for. The competence, expertise and experience requirements per category are summarised below.

5.1 SCM PROBITY REVIEW (CATEGORY A)

- 5.1.1** Bidder should provide a team of at least 2 persons with experience in auditing SCM work or providing SCM probity/compliance work within the public sector.
The service provider should complete a table showing the names of the staff and the roles they will deliver.

5.1.2 The team provided should include at least one team member with a professional designation in audit or internal audit or finance or accounting, or SCM /procurement field for example.

- Chartered Accountant of South Africa (CA(SA)); or
- Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA); or
- Certified Internal Auditor (CIA); or
- Professional Internal Auditor (PIA);
- Chartered Institute of Procurement and Supply (CIPS) and/or other SCM professional designation, or
- Registered Government Auditor (RGA),

5.1.3 The team leader should possess

- Qualifications at minimum NQF6 level in any of the following fields – SCM or procurement, Internal Audit or Audit, Finance, Accounting, Law, Commerce related fields.
- at least 3 years' experience in auditing SCM within the public sector or providing SCM probity/compliance work in a public entity environment

The Team Leader should be an existing employee or director/partner or owner of the service provider.

5.1.4 The team should include a team member with at least 3 years' experience in auditing SCM within the public sector or providing SCM probity/compliance work within public entity environments.

5.1.5 The bidder should provide formal contactable references letters from clients in the public sector where the service provider has previously provided SCM probity review or audited SCM or Procurement processes. The reference letters should

- Be on the client's letterhead,
- Be signed and dated
- Indicate the type of work done,
- Indicate the period when the probity work was performed and concluded, (please note that the work should have been done not later than three (3) years from the tender closing date)
- Show the client contact details being the name, email address or telephone number.

5.1.6 The bidder must provide the methodology and approach followed in conducting probity review services covering Category A – SCM probity review.

5.2 DISCRETIONARY GRANT PROBITY REVIEW (CATEGORY B)

5.2.1 Bidder should provide a team of at least 3 persons with experience in public sector auditing or internal audit or probity/compliance review services within the public sector.

The service provider should complete a table showing the names of the staff and the roles they will deliver.

5.2.2 The team provided should include at least one team member with a professional designation in audit or internal audit or finance or accounting for example.

- Chartered Accountant of South Africa (CA(SA)); or
- Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA); or
- Certified Internal Auditor (CIA); or
- Professional Internal Auditor (PIA);
- Registered Government Auditor (RGA),

5.2.3 The team leader should possess

- Qualifications at minimum NQF7 level in any of the following fields - audit or finance or accounting or commerce AND
- at least 3 years' experience in public sector auditing or internal audit or probity/compliance review services within the public sector.
- The Team Leader should be an existing employee or director/partner or owner of the service provider

5.2.4 The team should include a team member with at least NFQ 7 qualification in audit or finance or accounting or commerce. AND

at least 3 years' experience in public sector auditing or internal audit or probity/compliance review services within the public sector.

5.2.5 The bidder should provide formal contactable references letters from clients in the public sector where it has previously provided Discretionary Grant probity review/compliance work or audited within the skills development and education sector, (being Sector Educations and Training Authority (SETAs), Institution of Higher Learning, Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET), National Skills Authority (NSA), Quality Council for Trade and Occupations (QCTO), South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) etc.).

The reference letters should

- Be on the client's letterhead,
- Be signed and dated
- Indicate the type of work done,
- Indicate the period when the probity work was performed and concluded, (please note that the work should have been done not later than three (3) years from the tender closing date)
- Show the client contact details being the name, email address or telephone number.

5.2.6 The bidder must provide the methodology and approach they followed in conducting probity review services covering Category B – Discretionary Grant Funding Window probity).

6. DURATION OF THE CONTRACT

The contract will be valid for a period of three (03) years.

7. PRICING STRUCTURE

- ***N.B: The Pricing Schedule must be completed as per the attached annexure A. Bidders who fail to comply with this requirement will be disqualified because it will be impractical to compare across all submissions.***

- ***BANKSETA will allocate estimated hours to the listed activities. The calculated price as per Annexure A will be used for price comparison and evaluation purposes only.***

- 7.1 The quoted prices will remain fixed for the particular year indicated for the duration of the contract.
- 7.2 The attached pricing sheets (Appendix A) should be completed in full.
- 7.3 The BANKSETA will not entertain pricing adjustments after the signing of contract, and it is therefore important that all pricing elements are disclosed.
- 7.4 The pricing sheet should show VAT separately.
- 7.5 The Bidders are therefore required to indicate a total bidding price by completing the pricing schedule provided in full.
- 7.6 Sufficient detail should be included to enable the BANKSETA to fully understand the make-up of the overall pricing.
- 7.7 All pricing assumptions excluded costs and estimated costs should be clearly documented. The BANKSETA assumes that the pricing document as supplied is complete and covers all costs associated with this project.

8. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 8.1 All submissions should be delivered in individual envelopes as per clause 8.4 and 8.5 below.
- 8.2 Respondents should take particular care to ensure that there is no discrepancies between all submissions presented to the BANKSETA.
- 8.3 The BANKSETA reserves the right to reject any submissions if there are discrepancies identified in the submissions thereto.
- 8.4 Document should be submitted as follows:

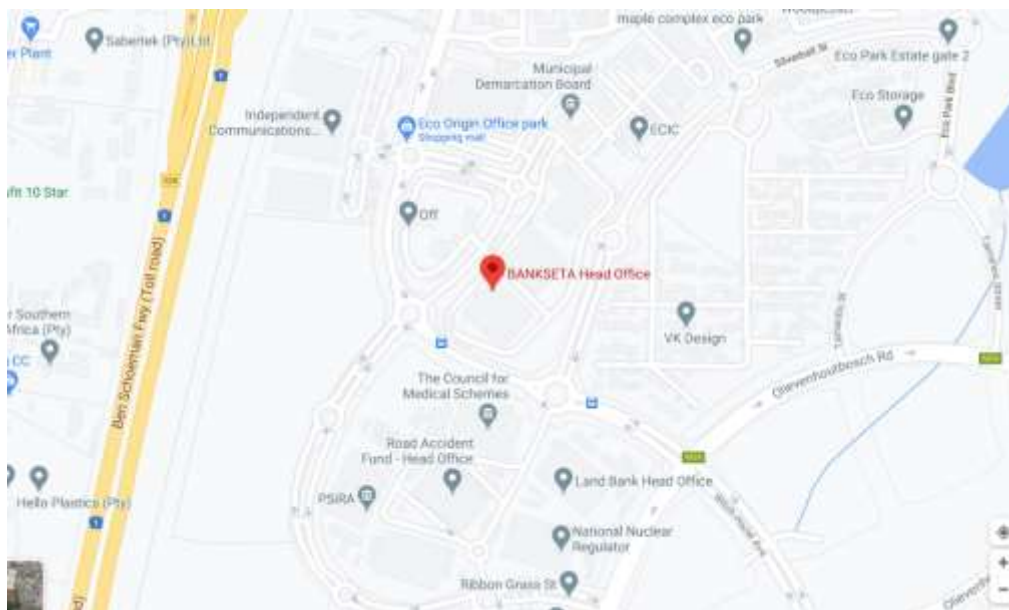

10. TENDER EVALUATION/ADJUDICATION

Bids will be evaluated in three phases:

- 10.1 Compliance/eligibility (Bids that do not pass the compliance eligibility evaluation will be disqualified from participating in the next evaluation stage)

- 10.2 Technical/Functionality (Bids that do not meet the minimum threshold indicated in technical/function evaluation, will not participate in the final evaluation stage)
- 10.3 Price and BANKSETA Preferential Procurement points (Bidder will be appointed on the highest scores).

11 COMPLIANCE STATUS

- 11.1 The service provider must be registered on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) maintained by the National Treasury and accessible on www.treasury.gov.za
- 11.2 The BANKSETA, before making an award, shall check on the central supplier database (CSD) whether;
- (a) the bidder or any of its directors are not listed / indicated as restricted from doing business with the public sector, and person prohibited
 - (b) the bidder's tax status is compliant.
 - (c) the bidders, its directors or management are not employees of the state, or if a director is an employee of the state, the service provider and or directors have permission to do business with the state, as provided for in the legislation.
- 11.3 The BANKSETA will not award any bids to service providers who do not comply with the above.
- 11.4 The BANKSETA will afford bidders a chance to clarify and provide evidence where there is any adverse information on the CSD reports.

12. COMPLIANCE/ELIGIBILITY EVALUATION

Respondents who do not meet the requirements below **will be** immediately disqualified.

The service provider should submit the current valid certificate/s or letter/s for the professional designation for that team member On evaluation the BANKSETA will award points as follows: a) The bidder's submission does not include any proof of professional designation related to auditing = 0 Points b) Submission of a valid certificate or letter to confirm that at least one team member holds a professional designation related to auditing or finance/accounting or SCM for example (CA(SA), ACCA, CIA, PIA, CISA, CIPS, CISSP, RGA)= 5 points	
2. Team leader Qualification and Experience	20
The Team leader should have experience in auditing SCM within the public sector or providing probity/compliance work in relation to SCM within the public sector AND a minimum of NQF Level 6 qualification in any of the following fields – SCM, Internal Audit/Audit, Finance, Accounting, Law or Commerce related fields. The service provider should submit - the professional profile,/resume or CV of the proposed team leader which clearly indicate the relevant experience AND - copies of the relevant qualifications. A CV without qualifications will not be scored NB: The team leader must be an existing employee or director/partner or owner of the bidder in order to be scored. On evaluation the BANKSETA will award points as follows: a) Less than 3 years' experience = 0 Points
