2. BACKGROUND

2.1 IDT AS AN ENTITY

The Independent Development Trust (*hereinafter referred to as IDT*) is a Schedule 2 Public Entity governed by applicable legislative frameworks and a Deed of Trust. The organization is accountable to Parliament through the Minister of Public Works who is the Executive Authority.

The mandate of the IDT is to support and add value to the developmental agenda of government as indicated in the mission statement; “The IDT manages and delivers Integrated Social Infrastructure Programs on behalf of Government”.

In pursuit of this mandate, the IDT primarily operates as a strategic partner in the management, integration and implementation of certain government development programs.

The IDT has representation in all the provinces and is organized on the basis of regional offices. These offices have the authority to call for bids, conduct evaluation of bids and make recommendations to the Management Bid Adjudication Committee (MBAC) for award of bids.

3. PURPOSE OF EXPRESSION OF INTEREST / BID

The IDT as a custodian of implanting social infrastructure projects on behalf of Government has an obligation to adhere and full comply with the Framework for Infrastructure Delivery and Procurement Management (*hereinafter referred to as FIPDM*) in all stages of projects which require qualified and experienced Professional Service Providers (*hereinafter referred to as PSP / PSPs*). These PSPs are appointed through competitive bidding in line with the Supply Chain Management (SCM) Policy and SCM National Treasury regulation. The Limpopo Department of Sport, Arts and Culture (DSAC) intends to establish a world-class Sport High Performance Centre in Limpopo Province to provide elite athlete development, sports science, coaching excellence, rehabilitation services, research, education and talent identification programmes.

The proposed facility will contribute towards improving sporting excellence within the province while supporting national objectives of developing high performance athletes capable of competing internationally.

The Department therefore seeks to appoint a suitably qualified multidisciplinary professional service provider to undertake a comprehensive feasibility study that will determine the viability, affordability and sustainability of establishing the Limpopo Sport High Performance Centre.

The purpose of this expression of interest is to pre-qualify relevant and capable PSPs from identified disciplines listed in this document in order to conduct a comprehensive feasibility study that will provide sufficient technical, financial, economic and operational information to enable the Department to make an informed investment decision and proceed to detailed planning and design.

4. SCOPE OVERVIEW

4.1 Objective of this document

This document calls for PSP accredited in the built environment listed below to submit their bid proposal in order to conduct a comprehensive feasibility study from the date of approval of this bid:

The appointed service provider shall:

- Assess the need for a High-Performance Centre within Limpopo Province.
- Determine the most suitable location.
- Identify the most appropriate facility model.
- Determine affordability and sustainability.
- Recommend implementation options.
- Develop a preferred concept design.
- Produce a bankable feasibility report.
- Value for money for the department not revenue generation

4.3 Ethical Consideration

At the core of all PSPs in the Built Environment and allied professions, there is a government gazette which is based on a corresponding Act of Parliament. The gazette outlines the tasks and responsibilities typical of each profession at every construction stage, the fee structures, and the typical deliverables of each profession. Each PSP is expected to abide by any of the Professional Services Contracts available on the market which the IDT may choose to use for specific projects. These include, but are not limited to the Professional Services Agreement (PROCSA), and the CIDB Standard Professional Services Contract and their variations or adaptations that may be tailored to suit the IDT.

The obligations and responsibilities for each part are outlined in these contracts, as well as

dispute resolution processes.

Ethical issues such as conflict of interest and corruption, confidentiality and copyright, are covered in the Professional Services Agreements that the IDT may choose to use for particular contracts.

5. SCOPE DESCRIPTION

5.1 Built Environment Professions

As outlined in (4.3) above, each built environment profession will be guided by a government gazette that outlines the scope of services. Other allied professions which are outside the built environment also have their scope of services, but for purposes of this document, scope of work for the built environment professions only is outlined as follows: -

- (i) For Engineering Professionals (civil, structural, mechanical, electrical, etc.) the scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazetted rates and services as contained in the Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA) under section 34(2) of Engineering Professions Act, 2000 (Act No. 46 of 2000) as published in (Gazette No. 44333, Board Notice 669 of 2021).
- (ii) For the Quantity Surveying Profession, the scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazette rates and services as contained in the South African Council for the Quantity Surveying Profession under Section 34(2) of the Quantity Surveying Profession Act 2000 (Act 49 of 2000) as published in (Gazette No. 52152, Board Notice 741 of 2025).
- (iii) For the Occupational Health and Safety Profession, the scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazette rates and services as contained in the tariff of professional fees in terms of the Standard Scope of Services for Construction Health and Safety Agencies Act 2000 (Act 48 of 2000) as published in (Gazette No. 42697, Board Notice 167 of 2019).
- (iv) For the Architectural Profession, scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazette rates and services as contained in The South African Council for the Architectural Profession (SACAP) under Section 34(2) of the Architectural Profession Act 2000 (Act 44 of 2000) as published in (Gazette No. 43591, Board Notice 662 of 2020).
- (v) For Social Facilitators the scope of service shall be in terms of DPWI Cabinet-approved Social Facilitation Framework which considers the three core principles, namely: Organic, Co-creation, and Ownership for community empowerment in the delivery of infrastructure in the country. Social facilitation services in projects or programs are designed, initiated, and implemented from beginning to the end with full participation of all affected and interested key stakeholders. The idea is to ensure that interventions are organic and locally owned and that desired outcomes are planned and achieved in a sustainable manner. Social facilitation is thus not only, or even primarily, about assuring that the community is consulted about infrastructural

development, but rather about establishing processes through which the community or stakeholders can create meaningful, ongoing change, with the assistance and collaboration of the IDT. Social facilitation is a powerful process of uniting and influencing communities and stakeholders, government, and other interested parties leading to the creation of viable strategies for the fulfilment of local needs and aspirations.

- (vi) For Geo Hydrological Engineers the scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazette rates and services as contained in the relevant government gazette for Registered Professional Engineer with ECSA or SACNASP (South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions)
- (vii) For Land Surveyor the scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazette rates (where applicable) and services as contained in the South African Geomatics Council (SAGC)
- (viii) For Professional Environmental Specialist the scope of services and applicable rates will be in terms of the gazette rates (where applicable) and services as contained in the South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions (SACNASP) and the Environmental Assessment Practitioner Association of South Africa (EAPASA)

5.2 Scope of Allied Professions to the Built Environment Professions

Section 3 recognizes that, increasingly, the organization may from time to time need to use PSPs which may not necessarily fall under the Built Environment, but which may be critical for successful implementation of various projects, be it on once-off or on continuous basis. Such services, but not limited to disciplines contained in Section (4) of this document.
