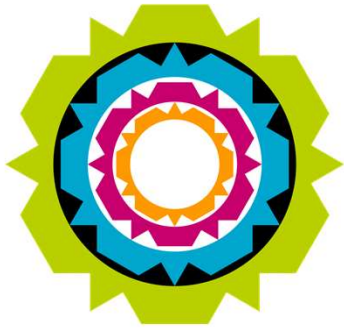

For the purposes of scoring the financial offer, the Employer will create an evaluation assignment which will be representative of the work assignments that will be typically undertaken by the Employer during the contract period. The Employer will assign quantities to the work items in the price schedule necessary for the execution of the evaluation assignment. The assigned quantity shall be multiplied by the tendered rate submitted by the tenderer to constitute the amounts that will be totalled to provide a financial offer for each tenderer. The financial offer amount shall be used in the price formula to score the financial offer.

Pricing Instructions:

- 5.1 State the rates and prices in Rand unless instructed otherwise in the tender conditions.
- 5.2 Include in the rates, prices, and the tendered total of the prices (if any) all duties, taxes (except Value Added Tax (VAT), and other levies payable by the successful tenderer, such duties, taxes and levies being those applicable 14 days before the closing time stated in the General Tender Information.
- 5.3 All prices tendered must include all expenses, disbursements and costs (e.g. transport, accommodation etc.) that may be required for the execution of the tenderer's obligations in terms of the contract, water, electricity, sewage, inoculations, safety clothing and equipment, **HEALTH AND SAFETY**, metered standpipe for potable water, metered standpipe for final effluent, traffic accommodation and shall cover the cost of all general risks, liabilities and obligations set forth or implied in the Contract as well as overhead charges and profit (in the event that the tender is successful). All prices tendered will be final and binding. The service provider will be deemed to have allowed within his unit rates for all costs associated with the hiring of a combination unit and any other mechanical plant and equipment on a monthly/daily/hourly basis, including traffic accommodation, working within high risk designated areas (provision of security), decanting at Borchers Quarry and the compliance testing of all equipment (as an when requested by the district manager or his representative).
- 5.4 All prices shall be tendered in accordance with the units specified in this schedule.
- 5.5 Where a value is given in the Quantity column, a Rate and Price (the product of the Quantity and Rate) is required to be inserted in the relevant columns.
- 5.6 The successful tenderer is required to perform all tasks listed against each item. The tenderer must therefore tender prices/rates on all items as per the section in the Price Schedule. An item against which no rate is/are entered, or if anything other than a rate or a nil rate (for example, a zero, a dash or the word "included" or abbreviations thereof) is entered against an item, it will also be regarded as a nil rate having been entered against that item, i.e. that there is no charge for that item. The Tenderer may be requested to clarify nil rates, or items regarded as having nil rates; and the Employer may also perform a risk analysis with regard to the reasonableness of such rates.
- 5.7 Where fractions of a cent occur in calculations of prices and amounts, they shall be rounded up/down to the nearest whole cent.
- 5.8 Tenderers are not required to provide a rate for items 1.10 & 1.11 in the Pricing Schedule: Dumping of special waste material at Vissershok Management Facility (Pty) Ltd, which applies to all pricing schedules (Areas 1 to 9)

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Schedule 8: Contract Price Adjustment

8.6 **Price Adjustment Mechanism:**

8.6.1 **Year 1:**

The Contract Price as per GCC shall remain Firm for the first 12 months (from date of commencement) and **no claims** for contract price adjustment will be considered for the first 12 months.

8.6.2 Subject to 8.6.1 above, contract price adjustment will be applicable as from commencement of the 13th month. Tenderers shall be entitled to claim contract price adjustment as follows:

90% of the tendered rate will be subject to adjustment annually based on the average Consumer Price Index (CPI) as follows:

Year 2:

From start of the 13th month to end of the 24th month: Subject to contract price adjustment in accordance with the Consumer Price Index (P0141-Table B). Base month for the price adjustment shall be two (2) calendar months prior to the date of commencement. The end month shall be two (2) calendar months prior to the 12th month.

Year 3:

From start of 25th month to end of contract: Subject to the contract price adjustment in accordance with the Consumer Price Index (P0141 – Table B). Base month for the price adjustment shall be two (2) calendar months prior to the 13th month. The end month shall be two (2) calendar months prior to the 24th month.

The average CPI calculated, the base month to end month (both include) divided by the number of months.

The claim will be based on the average between the “base month” and the “end month” e.g.: $7+6+9+6 = 28$ ($28/4$) = 7 therefore the claim will be 7%.

8.6.3 10% of the rate will remain fixed.

8.6.4 **Disposal of Waste:**

8.6.4.1 **Vissershok Waste Management Facility (Pty) Ltd**

The disposal tariff will be increased annually based on the Vissershok Waste Management Facility (Pty) Ltd tariffs and is subject to adjustment once per year effective on 1st July of each year, which is applicable for Items 1.10 & 1.11 in the pricing schedule (Areas 1 to 9).

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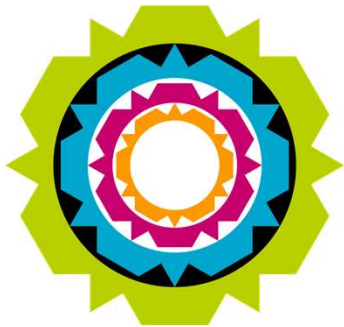
