The 30-year-old Pogba was an unused substitute in the win at Udinese.

Juventus said they had been informed of the provisional suspension and were evaluating the next steps.

If found guilty of doping, Pogba could be suspended for two to four years.

He will now await the results of the B Sample test.

"We are waiting for the results of the counter-analysis and cannot say anything until then," Pogba's agent, Rafaela Pimenta, said in a statement to Italian media.

"The only certain thing is that Paul Pogba never intended to break the rules."
