15.1 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

In an endeavor to address the question of skills shortage, unemployment and professionalization of services of funded NPOs in the entire North West Province. The Department of Social Development intends to implement a comprehensive skills development programme to enhance the quality of services provided in NPOs and the employability of targeted workers through the provision of accredited training on Child and Youth Care Workers.

15.2 PROJECT SCOPE

Provide training to 118 CYCW learners in Dr. Ruth Segomotsi Mompati district. Learners are recruited from the NPOs implementing Child and Youth Care work services within the community based care centers.

5 DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

5.1 Accounting

- 5.1.1 Provide all completed accounting records consisting of official invoice on a monthly basis.
- 5.1.2 Provide correctly completed and certified invoices to the department for payment
- 5.1.3 Utilize/spend allocated funds by the department in accordance with approved business plan and terms of reference.

5.2 Management

- 5.2.1 Provide Management Services in respect of quantity and quality, control and supervision of the preparation of training by all staff concerned. If a service provider training Manager is available on the staff establishment of the institution the role of supervision of the training will be his/her responsibility.
- 5.2.2 Provide staff for all training sessions.
- 5.2.3 Assign the project to a training manager (Project Manager)
- 5.2.4 Manage and provide attendance register of all recruited learners

5.3 Purchase and supply of training materials

- 5.3.1 Purchase and acquire all training and other materials necessary for the proper fulfillment of training and management functions.
- 5.3.2 Arrange for the supply and delivery of all the materials necessary for the proper preparation and implementation of the training programme.
- 5.3.3 Ensure that all training materials supplied to the Department are of good quality.
- 5.3.4 Ensure that the amount claimed from the Department in respect of training, is restricted to the amount tendered for in line with the payment schedule.
- 5.3.5 Provide daily programme plan reflecting the training schedule of all allocated staff members and management.
- 5.3.6 Submit the following documents within 14(fourteen) days after awarding of the tender:
 - 5.3.7 Training schedule for theoretical / classroom learning

- 5.3.8 Simulation / on site practical schedule where learners will be integrating theory into practice.
- 5.3.9 Mentoring and coaching schedule detailing the start and completion dates.

5.4 Training facilities

- 5.4.1 The Service provider shall have full access to all training areas and the supervision thereof to render training services in terms of these conditions. In this regard the service provider shall have custody and control of all keys that allow access to the training areas and keys to the lockable furniture, equipment, fixture and fittings. However access will be limited to those areas and any surrounding buildings and facilities necessary for the rendering of the training services.
- 5.4.2 The Service Provider shall not use (or allow to be used) the designated training localities or premises for any purpose other than the training services in terms of these conditions, nor will he/she be allowed to prepare for training on premises other than the designated premises.
- 5.4.3 The Service Provider shall not remove any property of the Department from the premises or locality where the Department kept it nor use any Department equipment for private use.
- 5.4.4 No structural changes will be made by the service provider to the existing premises. Any proposed change in a structure should be submitted to the Department in writing for consideration and the Department's decision as to the necessity of it will be final.

5.5 Training Materials and Stationery.

- 5.5.1 Provide appropriate SETA approved training manuals and materials for training purposes.
- 5.5.2 Provide appropriate materials that are S.A.B.S approved for training purposes.
- 5.5.3 Ensure the safe storage of training material.
- 5.5.4 Conform to the requirements of the Health and Safety Act 85/93

5.6 Hygiene and cleanliness

- 5.6.1 Keep all stores including windows, floors, walls, training equipment and all materials to be used in healthy and safe conditions.

- .. 5.6.2 Conform to the requirements of the Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993).

5.7 Security

Conform to all Security regulations and provide security services to safe-guard equipment, site, material and learners.

5.8 Use of Resources

Use resources in an economical, efficient and transparent manner

5.9 Training

- 5.9.1 Responsible for the training of all learners provided by the Department to ensure the successful implementation and completion of the training programme.
- 5.9.2 Submit monthly report on the progress of training to the Department on the last working day of each month.

5.10 Ownership and Storage

- 5.10.1** Maintain stock of training materials on the premises or training site.
- 5.10.2** Retain ownership of all accounting and control documentation used by the service provider in the performance of its contractual obligations.

5.11 Riot, Unrest and Stock Loss

- 5.11.1 During any period of unrest or riot, the Department shall not be liable for any damage to the service provider's property and equipment.
- 5.11.2 The Service Provider will inform the Department in cases of riots/ or unrests which affect the training and submit a catch up plan which will not attract additional costs.

6 Timeframe

The programme should be completed within a maximum of twelve (12) months from the date of awarding of the contract.

7 COSTING STRUCTURE

7.1 Theoretical Training

Costing should be inclusive of the following items:

- Tuition fee per learner;
- Establishment and maintenance of worksite;
- Training materials;
- Administration costs;
- Learner and material meal allowance during the training session;
- Security personnel;
- Water and Lights and
- VAT where applicable

7.2 Mentorship

Mentors are qualified and experienced CYCWs who provide guidance and support to community based centres trainees to ensure that CYCWs are properly supervised, that implementing partners are being implemented in line with the community based centres Service Standards and Practice Guidelines and that the professional development of CYCWs is nurtured. Mentors will have received and completed training from accredited service providers which will enhance the individual's knowledge, skills, values and attitudes.

7.3 Payment Schedule

The first claim will be paid upon completion of worksite establishment i.e. provision of learner tools and equipment, provision of PPE, toilets, tools, safety signs, first aid kit, sick bay, fire extinguishers, labour related posters, evacuation plan, assembly point properly sign posted, training schedule.

- Tuition fees will be paid over a project period.
- Remaining payments to be paid in accordance with verifiable project milestones and deliverables as outlined in the approved project plan.
- The last 10% will be paid upon receipt of learner certificates and SETA statement of results.

8. DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT

- 8.1 Recruitment and placement of 95 learners in structured skills programme in Dr Ruth Segomotsi Mompati District.
- 8.2 Providing programme management support to the training service provider
- 8.3 Payment of service provider in line with the signed service level agreement,
- 8.4 Setting up of the Provincial and District Project Steering Committee,
- 8.5 Facilitate identification of Departmental and NPO run facilities to be used as part of mentorship.
- 8.6 Budget management
- 8.7 Contract administration and management,
- 8.8 Identification of Project Coordinator in District Office,
- 8.9 Identification of Project Leaders at participating Service Points,-name of service points.
- 8.10 The Department will be responsible for the provision of transport to and from the training venues.
- 8.11 Monitoring and evaluation reports should be attached to the payment voucher. Project manager should submit minutes, attendance register and reports of the monitoring and evaluation of the project to Head office Supply Chain Management, Contract Management section.

9. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 9.1 The conditions contained in the General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and the attached bid forms, as well as any other condition accompanying this invitation, are applicable.
- 9.2 The work procedure, the bidder proposes must be clearly outlined, specified and their terms must not conflict with those contained in the General Conditions of Contract.
- 9.3 All the Documents accompanying this invitation must be completed and signed in ink where applicable by a duly authorized official, be sealed in an envelope or suitable cover and be deposited in the bid box before the closing time and date. The bid box is situated at Provident House Building, Supply Chain Management Directorate, 1st Floor, University drive, Mmabatho.
- 9.4 Faxed, emailed bids will not be considered, only hand delivered bid will be accepted.

- 9.5 Department of Social Development reserves the right to award any bid and does not bind itself to accept the lowest bid price.
- 9.6 This bid is issued under the condition that the bidder should at any stage be subjected to inspection by the representative of the Department.
- 9.7 The shortlisted companies may be required to give presentations prior to the awarding of the Tender on previous work done.
- 9.8 In case of emergencies or disasters, service providers must be able to respond to the authorization by the designated official for the provision of food parcels within 24hrs.
- 9.9 The declaration certificate for local production and content (SBD6.2) together with the Annexure C (Local content declaration: summary schedule) must be completed, duly signed and submitted by the bidder at the closing and time of the bid.
- 9.10 Contractors must not be allowed to sub-contract in such a manner that the local production and content of the overall value of the contract is reduced to below the stipulated minimum threshold.
- 9.11 The Department of Social Development reserves the right to award the contract to one service provider and does not bind itself to accept the lowest bid or any bid.
- 9.12 No adjustment will be made on cost of the project.
- 9.13 No adjustment will be made on the project timeframe.
- 9.14 The bid will be awarded subject to the parties signing a service level agreement (SLA).
- 9.14 Some of the learners have previously been trained in some of the unit standards of the FETC Child and Youth care qualification ID 60209 therefore the service provider must exclude the price for this module when submitting proposals (Please refer to Annexure A for a list of completed modules per learner).

10 BID REQUIREMENTS

10.1 SUBMISSION OF BIDS

Bidders must submit the bid in hard copy format (paper document) to: University Drive, Provident House, 1st Floor Supply Chain Management division, North Entrance, Mmabatho before the closing date and time.

The hard copy of the bid response will serve as the legal bid document.

10.2 LATE BIDS

Bids received after the closing date and time, at the address indicated above will not be accepted for consideration. Please note that bids are late if they are

received at the address given in the bid document after the bid closing date and time.

10.3 BID VALIDITY PERIOD

Bids will be valid for a period of 120 days.

10.4 DURATION OF CONTRACT

The contract will be awarded for a period of twelve (12) months.

10.5 VALUE ADDED VAT

All bid prices must be quoted in South African currency and must be VAT inclusive where applicable. All bidding vendors must have a VALID bank account.

10.6 TAX CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

Tax Clearance Certificate and pin issued by South African Revenue Services (SARS) certifying that bidder's taxes are in order must be submitted on closing date and time.

10.7 B-BBEE

Bidders are required to complete the preference claim form (SBD 6.1), and submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate/ sworn affidavit or a certified copy thereof in order to claim the B-BBEE status level points. The points scored by a bidder in respect of the level of B-BBEE contribution will be added to the points scored for price.

The State may, before a bid is adjudicated or at any time, require a bidder to substantiate claims it has made with regard to preference.

In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the contract will be awarded to the bidder scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

10.8 COMPANY REGISTRATION

A certified copy of company registration certificate, where applicable, indicating names and percentages of shareholders and shareholding (equity) respectively, must be attached.

10.9 IDENTITY DOCUMENT(S)

Certified copies of Identity Documents for all shareholders must be included.

10.10 JOINT VENTURE

In the event of a joint venture both entities must submit valid Tax Clearance Certificate, company registration where applicable and certified copies of Identity Documents. A joint venture agreement endorsed by both parties and attested by the Commissioner of Oath must also be attached. Bidders are required to submit a consolidated B-BBEE status level verification certificate in the joint venture name. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in the joint venture not being scored for B-BBEE status level.

16.2 Price and Preferential Points.

In terms of the regulation 6 of the Preferential Procurement Regulation pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act 5 of 2000), responsive bids will be adjudicated by the state on the 80/20 preference points system in terms of which points are awarded to bidders on the basis of:

- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
 - a. disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors have abused the institution's supply chain management system and or committed fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such system.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

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General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
 - 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
 - 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
 - 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
 - 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
 - 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
 - 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
 - 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
 - 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
 - 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
 - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
 - 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable.

Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
- (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

**8. Inspections,
tests and
analyses**

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with

supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

- 11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

- 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
- (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.

15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.

15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

- 16. Payment**
- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.
- 17. Prices**
- 17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.
- 18. Contract amendments**
- 18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.
- 19. Assignment**
- 19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.
- 20. Subcontracts**
- 20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.
- 21. Delays in the supplier's performance**
- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.

21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
- (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard

the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.

23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
- (iii) the period of restriction; and
- (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security,

damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

- 25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

**26. Termination
for insolvency**

- 26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

**27. Settlement of
Disputes**

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.
- 27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

**28. Limitation of
liability**

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
- (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

- (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.
- 29. Governing language** 29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.
- 30. Applicable law** 30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.
- 31. Notices** 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.
- 32. Taxes and duties** 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.
- 33. National Industrial Participation Programme (NIP)** 33.1 The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.
