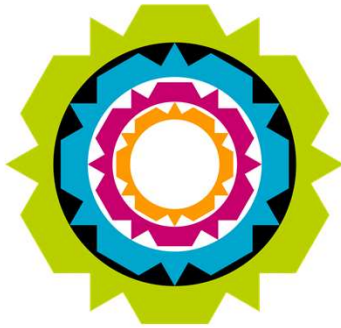

Tenderer's obligations

- Eligibility Criteria
 - Tenderers are obligated to submit a tender offer that complies in all aspects to the conditions as detailed in this tender document and the Conditions of Tender. An “acceptable” tender must “COMPLY IN ALL” aspects with the tender, Conditions of Tender, all Specifications (i.e., item C.5 below, hereinafter the “Specifications”), pricing instructions herein and the Contract including its conditions.

2.2.1.1.3 Responsive criteria as per specification

C1	Tenderer must have a minimum of 2 years' experience in the hazardous waste management environment. Schedule F.13: Information to Be Provided With the Tender and submit in alignment with the relevant Experience the associated permits, authorisations and certificates for the final management of hazardous waste (Regulations in terms of NEMA Waste Act (2008) Section 24 and 25 and the National Road Traffic Act) pertaining to the registration as waste remover, waste transporter and disposer of waste, waste remover drivers training as well as any other applicable statutory permits not included in this specification
C2	All hazardous waste be managed at a licensed hazardous waste landfill sites or incineration plants or recycling/recovery facilities as prescribed in the specifications (see Specifications Section C,C12). Copies of Previous agreements obtained by the Bidder, existing permits still in the possession of the Bidder, or a written undertaking from a Disposal Site/Contractor for any future “In principle agreements” with the appropriate landfill sites, incineration plants and/or recycling/recovery facility operator must be submitted with tender offer

Tenderer's obligations (cont.)

General Legal Compliance (as a minimum but not restricted to):

- Occupational Health & Safety Act No. 85 of 1993 as amended with Regulations and SANS code 0228 of practice
- Hazardous Substances Act 15 of 1973
- National Environmental Management Waste Act (NEMWA) Act 59 of 2008 (specifically the Waste Classification & Management Regulations, and Norms & Standards for Assessment and Disposal of Waste to Landfill – GN R.634, 635 & 636, 23 August 2013)
- National Road Traffic Act 93 of 1996.
- Compensation for Occupational and Disease Act 130 of 1993
- All other laws or regulations promulgated in terms of the abovementioned legislation.

Tenderer's obligations (cont.)

- COIDA Compliance
 - A valid letter of Good Standing issued by the Department of Labour in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Disease Act 130 of 1993.
 - (It is a condition of this tender that the successful Tenderer shall submit a valid Letter of Good Standing as well as to ensure to submit a certificate to cover the duration of this contract).
- Transporters of hazardous waste

Shall comply with the requirements of the National Road Traffic Act 93 of 1996
- Health and Safety Plan (Refer to Specification C19)
- Environmental Plan (Refer to Specification C19)

The Tenderer shall be deemed to have read and fully understood the requirements of the above Acts, applicable Standards and Regulations and to have allowed for all costs in compliance therewith.

5.6	The successful tenderer is required to perform all tasks listed against each item. The tenderer must therefore tender prices/rates on all items as per the section in the Price Schedule. An item against which no rate is/are entered, or if anything other than a rate or a nil rate (for example, a zero, a dash or the word “included” or abbreviations thereof) is entered against an item, it will also be regarded as a nil rate having been entered against that item, i.e. that there is no charge for that item. The Tenderer may be requested to clarify nil rates, or items regarded as having nil rates; and the CCT may also perform a risk analysis with regard to the reasonableness of such rates.
5.7	Provide fixed rates and prices per year for the duration of the contract that are not subject to price adjustment
5.8	Tenderers must submit a price for Year 1, 2 and 3 for all of the items and sub-items listed in the pricing table

General (Cont.)

- Evaluation of tender offers
 - The preference point system applicable to this tender is the 80/20 preference point system.
 - 80 Points for Price and 20 Points for B-BBEE Contribution
- Penalties
 - The penalty for this contract shall be 10% of the purchase order value if disposal certificates and weighbridge slips are not provided with the final invoices (Specifications clause C14).
