Project	Avalon Cemetery Customer Centre indoor exhibit
Project champion	Letta Madlala
Interpretation facility (name the facility and its functional uses)	Avalon Customer Centre Avalon is a burial site situated in Soweto where the residents of Soweto and struggle heroes are laid to rest. Recently a customer care centre was built in the cemetery to enable those who have their loved ones buried in Avalon to make enquiries and to book for second and third burials and exhumation. In the past, these enquirers would line up in the sun waiting to be assisted. This centre was built to provide them with a shelter and a comfortable place to wait, which dignifies their visit. We also expect the Centre to be visited by the mourners, once they completed their burial services to remind them of how important this cemetery is and furthermore, how important it is to be associated with it. We also expect people who are interested in the history of South Africa to visit the exhibit to learn about the benign of those who are interred in the cemetery.
Background	Avalon Cemetery, founded in 1972 and approximately 172 hectares, is Johannesburg's largest and busiest cemetery with more than 300 000 people laid to rest there, many being struggle heroes. During the height of the struggle against the Apartheid Regime, in the 1970s and 1980s, funerals were one of the most powerful expressions of defiance against the apartheid government. For instance, thousands of mourners would gather at Avalon during burials, sing and chant banned and forbidden freedom songs and slogans during burials until they would be driven away by security forces. As such, in many ways, Avalon is associated with a history of a defiance struggle in South Africa. Until recently the cemetery has had a modest customer care centre where sometimes long queues would form as the customers, some being the elderly, wait for their queries to be resolved.

	JCPZ decided to improve this situation by building a modern customer care centre consisting of a proper seating and a queuing system to bring dignity to the visit. To further improve the visitor experience, JCPZ would like to create an exhibition which will share knowledge about this cemetery, providing details of its role in the struggle against the Apartheid Regime. The exhibition will also provide background information about those who contributed to liberating South Africa from the Apartheid Regime, but unfortunately died.
Description of the project (i.e. what is being proposed for the project)	The exhibition should relay the following messages: Will tell the story of Avalon. Share historical moments in the struggle against Apartheid. Tell the story of struggle heroes and heroines laid to rest in the cemetery. It will also depict how different ordinary/religious people would conduct burial ceremonies. The project should be a reminder of South Africa's moving past.
Purpose (Why do you want to do this? What are trying to accomplish, fix or change)	This project aims to relay the history of South Africa's largest cemetery, which has been designated as a heritage site. To demonstrate the significant role that Avalon continues to play, not just for Sowetans, but for all South Africans, as the country transitioned from a period of violent struggle to one of reconciliation and democracy.
Goals and objectives	The interpretive design aims to enrich visitors' experience at the Avalon Customer Centre, by: Creating an exhibition that adds intrigue, positivity, and a sense of tranquillity to the cemetery grounds, providing the enquirers with a sense of pride about the contribution of their forefathers towards South Africa's liberation. After participating in the interpretive opportunity, a visitor should be able to describe the history of the struggle against the apartheid system in South Africa and the role played by the people of Soweto and the individuals interred at the Avalon

	Cemetery. Furthermore, it must also show the history of Avalon Cemetery and its role in the struggle for freedom.
Target market	The customer centre is used by the residents of Soweto who visit the centre to locate the grave sites of their relatives and family members. Visitors to the cemetery, including mourners, families, and friends of the deceased. Community members using the cemetery as a peaceful retreat or for recreational activities. Cemetery users who visit the grave sites of their relatives and family members. Tourists and history learners who are interested in the history of South Africa's struggle against Apartheid System.
Topic	The role of Avalon Cemetery in the struggle against Apartheid.
Theme (The central message that must be conveyed to the target audience about the topic at hand).	The central message to be conveyed by the exhibition is that Avalon Cemetery played a significant role in the struggle against the Apartheid Regime. Similar, to other cemeteries, it became a front where defiance meetings could be held to inspire Black South Africans not to lose hope, but instead, to continue with their struggle for freedom. The second message is that heroes and heroines who laid down their lives so South Africa can attain freedom are interred in this cemetery and we will never forget their sacrifices.
Interpretive inventory (what do we have to work with)	The interpretation will be in the Customer Centre; however, the visitors come across the main identification sign when they enter the cemetery. They will also see a tariff board, and a heritage plaque mounted on a granite plinth before they enter the Centre. All the information they would have seen until then is different to the one on the exhibition. The blue plaque gives a snippet of the history of Avalon Cemetery but not in the detail that would be reflected on the exhibition.

Site inventory	What are the outstanding natural features within the cemetery itself? Avalon's cemetery covers 172 hectares, and up to 5000 trees have been planted there. It has a small koppie that showcases arts and artefacts by Sowetan artists. The cemetery has three memorial walls, viz. Mendi Memorial, June 16 Memorial and Lilian Ngoyi & Helen Joseph Memorial. What are the interesting human stories that the cemetery carries? As already mentioned in the brief above, many struggle heroes and heroines were laid to rest in Avalon Cemetery. Hector Pietersen, Tsietsi Mashinini, Lilian Ngoyi, Helen Joseph, Hastings Ndlovu, Charlotte Maxeke, Joe Slovo, Lesetja Sexwale, Antony Dali, Isaac Rakobo and many more are interred in Avalon. Mendi Memorial and June 16 Memorial are also located in the cemetery. See attached list of notable persons laid in the cemetery. There shared graves of Lillian Ngoyi and Helen Joseph were declared a national heritage site. There is also the Hero's Acre that has many struggle heroes from the June 1976 uprising. Avalon Cemetery has a rich history in our country.
