- reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and specifications which are detailed herein;
- disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [10 September 2024];
- award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Goods/Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;
- split the award of the contract between more than one Supplier/Service provider, should it at Foskop's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- cancel the bid process;
- validate any information submitted by Respondents in response to this bid. This would include, but is not limited to, requesting the Respondents to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a bid, Respondents hereby irrevocably grant the necessary consent to Foskop to do so;

10. LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Respondent will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by Foskor's Legal Counsel, prior to consideration for an award of business. A material deviation from the Standard terms or conditions could result in disqualification.

11. SECURITY CLEARANCE

Acceptance of this bid could be subject to the condition that the Successful Respondent, its personnel providing the Goods/Services and its subcontractor(s) must obtain security clearance from the appropriate authorities to the level of **CONFIDENTIAL/ SECRET/TOP SECRET**. 12. NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Respondents are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Respondents must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Respondent who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

13. TAX COMPLIANCE

Respondents must be compliant when submitting a proposal to Foskor and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this bid that the tax matters of the successful Respondents be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Respondents' tax obligations.

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SECTION 3: BACKGROUND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. BACKGROUND

Foskor is one of the world's largest producers of phosphate rock (concentrate) and phosphoric acid. It is one of the world's few vertically integrated producers of phosphoric acid and is the second-largest supplier to India, the world's largest consumer of phosphoric acid.

The Company owns and mines phosphate resources and beneficiates the mined material to produce phosphate concentrate at Phalaborwa, in the Limpopo Province of South Africa. The phosphate concentrate is sold locally and transported to the Richards Bay plant on the coast of Kwa-Zulu Natal to produce phosphoric acid, sulphuric acid and granular fertilisers MAP and DAP from phosphoric acid and is the leading supplier of fertilisers in South Africa. In all about 95% of the phosphoric acid is exported and the granular sales are divided between exports and local markets. Since 1951 Foskor has supplied more than 95% of South Africa's fertiliser requirements.

2. SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

- 1.Design, supply, install and commission of the new switchgear.
- 2.Removal of existing old switchgear and transport to the agreed destination and deliver it to the location shown by Foskor engineer.
- 3.Removal of existing terminated cables on the existing panels so as to use the same cables on the new switchgears.
- 4.Tracing of the complete protection scheme wiring on the existing switchgear and do the wiring on the new panels so that existing protection and interconnection between the transformer primary and tertiary winding and related switchgear are not disturbed.
- 5.Cable from the switchgear to outside of the substation needed to be painted with flame proof paint for a meter on both side.

The scope of this work covers the design, manufacture, supply (and delivery), installation and commissioning of an 7 Tier 22 kV Medium Voltage Switchgear assembly according to the attached Switchgear Specification Sheet for the Foskor TTPS 22 KV Switch board replacement Project in Phalaborwa, Limpopo province.

The Works shall be designed, constructed, tested and commissioned in accordance with the applicable scope, regulations, specifications, standards and recommendations. The Contractor shall be deemed to have made an allowance in the tender to comply with the above.

The two (2x) incomer panels have two(2x) 3x702 PEX cables to be terminated on each panel. A provision must be made for the termination of all the cables. The feeder panels have up to one(1x) 3x70mm² PEX cables to be terminated.

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The Arc Protection scheme shall trip the feeder breaker where the arc originates, however if the arc is on the bus bars, the incomer and bus section breaker(s) of that bus must trip

The scope of this work shall also include obtaining the Foskor permit to do work for the installation of the switchboard.

All work shall also include the supply of all tools, labour, equipment, Transportation, Supervision by a Foskor authorized 2.9.2 supervisor and 2.6.1 subordinate manager, Quality management, Project management and communication, etc

Construction of the switchboard

- a. General Features
 - a) The Switchgear and control gear shall be vacuum or SF6 gas filled, single bus, indoor, modular, free standing metal clad type.
 - b) The Switchgear and control gear panels shall be bolted together to form a totally enclosed, continuous, self-supporting self-contained switchboard of uniform appearance.
 - c) The Switchgear and control gear must be of the horizontal isolating, draw out, truck type.
 - d) Any circuit breaker shall be interchangeable with any other similar breaker of the same rating on the board. It must not be possible to insert a circuit breaker into a higher current rated circuit.
 - e) All openings, joints, etc. in the entire switchboard shall be adequately vermin proofed.

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- f) The panels shall be built to withstand internal faults. In the event of an internal arc fault a person standing to the front or alongside the panel shall not be burnt or electrocuted. A means of pressure relief shall be provided and the Contractor shall describe in full the method used.

The underside of vent outlets, if used, shall be suitably supported to prevent accidental inward opening.

- G 220 V anti-condensation heaters shall be provided to ensure that no condensation can occur in any of the components. An auxiliary contact shall be provided to switch the heaters on when the circuit breaker is open.
- h) Doors shall have stops to prevent over swing of the door when opening to prevent interference with adjacent panels.

Circuit Breaker Features

- a) The contacts shall ensure rapid and consistent extinction of the arc with a minimum release of arc energy under all loading and fault conditions.
- b) The arcing contacts shall be tipped or coated with an erosion resistant material, preferably a tungsten alloy.
- c) The main contacts shall be self-aligning with a high contact pressure and a self-cleaning action

c. Circuit Breaker Mechanisms

- a) The closing mechanism shall be either of the hand charged spring or hand operated, spring assisted, magnetic, motor wound spring charging or solenoid-operated types as specified in the attached Data Sheet(s).
- b) The closing action of the hand operated, spring assisted mechanisms shall ensure that once closing is initiated the action becomes independent of the operator.
- c) All mechanisms shall be of the trip-free type and it shall not be possible for the mechanism to maintain the circuit breaker in a "closed" position during fault conditions or when the "open" signal has been initiated.
- d) The electrical closing circuitry shall be open circuited as soon as the closing sequence has been completed to prevent continued electrical loading of the closing coil and deactivate the closing signal until a new sequence is initiated.
- e) The mechanisms shall be capable of performing a "BREAK-MAKE-BREAK" operation.
- f) All electrically operated closing devices shall operate at any voltage between 80% - 120% and tripping devices for 50% -120% of the nominal control voltage at the device terminal.

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- g) Anti-pumping devices shall be provided on all mechanisms to prevent repeated closing whilst the closing circuit remains energised and the circuit breaker either fails to latch or trips on closing.
- h) The trip circuit shall ensure "fail safe" operation.
- d. Bus bars
 - a) Bus bars shall be of the totally enclosed air insulated type, insulated for 24 kV and manufactured of hard drawn high conductivity copper with rectangular cross-section.
 - b) The busbars shall be rated for the continuous current carrying capacity specified in the Detailed Technical Specification drawings and the specified fault levels. The bus bars shall be designed to withstand mechanical and temperature stresses for normal and fault conditions taking into account correction factors for different configurations, "proximity" and "skin" effects, the effect of ferrous enclosures, ventilation, etc. The maximum allowable temperature of bus bars carrying full load in the specified ambient temperature is 800C.
 - c) There shall be no barriers down the bus bar runs except on either side of the bus bar section switch. Barriers shall not be used to provide mechanical support for bus bars or connections.
 - d) Entry through barriers between cubicles within the same panel shall be by means of purpose designed bushings.
 - e) Applied insulation shall be in intimate contact with conductors and conductor joints to obviate voids.
 - f) A copper earth bar of not less than 37 mm x 6 mm is to be provided along the full length of the switchboard. All metal parts of each circuit breaker are to be adequately earthed to this bar which is to protrude beyond the switchboard to facilitate ready access for future Switchgear. An earthing terminal is to be located on either end at the rear of the panel conveniently placed about 150 mm above floor level.
- e. Painting

All equipment shall be painted and finished using a powder coating process to the requirements of SANS 1274 - 1979 type 2 (thickness 35 micron).

The colour finish shall be:

- Exterior, Electric Orange B26 (Foskor)
- Interior (Instrument Housing) White

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- f. Voltage Transformers (VT's) - (INCOMER CABLE SIDE)
- a) Voltage transformers shall be suitable for an impulse withstand level of 95 kV and shall have the following minimum accuracy classes:

- b) Approved plug-in type connections arranged for easy isolation and removal of the voltage transformers shall be supplied. When isolated, the plug connections on the switchboard shall be fully shrouded by means of automatic shutters, which can be locked by means of a padlock.
- c) The rating shall be suitable for the connected burden and a minimum of 50 VA per phase.
- d) Panel doors incorporating instruments shall be suitably earthed using a green insulated flexible 4 mm² copper conductor and voltage terminals are to be shrouded.
- e) Voltmeters shall be protected with easily accessible HRC fuses.
- f) Neon indicators shall be provided at all incoming & ring feed switch panels to indicate "Cable Alive".
- g. Current Transformers (CT's)
- VT's and CT's shall be provided with the correct VA rating and class to suit the prospective system fault level, circuit rating, purpose and burden for all protection, metering, instrumentation and PLC requirements. Where required for restricted earth fault protection, transformer star-point CT's shall also be provided. CT VA ratings as detailed on the single line diagrams are provisional only and must be verified by the vendor for correct rating in terms of the application
- a) All CT's shall be fully and solidly insulated by means of cast resin. They shall be installed and labelled so that the ratio, class etc. is clearly visible.
- b) The secondary windings of the protection class CT's shall be brought out to terminal and test blocks with no connections being made internally. The secondary windings shall be earthed at the star point adjacent to the CT.
- c) Test blocks are not required for metering CT's.
- d) Current transformer chambers shall be so designed that no secondary connections can enter the high voltage compartment.

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e) The class of accuracy for current transformers shall be as follows:

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f) Phase colour coding similar to the busbars (R, W, BL, and BK) must be provided for all wiring to current transformers (4mm² secondary wiring).

g) All CT's shall be tested and a certificate provided showing ratio, magnetising curve, secondary resistance and primary insulation to rated voltage, not type test certificates

h) Where metering CT's are supplied on behalf of a supply authority, they shall be removed and handed to that authority for testing together with the magnetised curve details and saturation factors, following which they shall be re-installed.

h. Protection Relays

a) Protective systems and relays shall be provided in accordance with the detailed approved design. Solid state protection relays will be provided for protection and will be suitable for control system interface via a communications bus.

b) All relays are to be dustproof and suitable for flush mounting.

c) Relay contacts shall be capable of repeatedly making and where required repeatedly breaking the maximum current possible in the circuits they control. Trip circuits will be interrupted by breaker auxiliary contacts once the breaker opens.

d) Tripping contacts shall be stable and not change state due to vibration.

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e) Relays shall contain flag (LED) indication on each operating element. Hand resetting shall be accomplished without opening the case. These relays shall be accessible to a person of average height standing on the floor.

f) Each relay shall be rated for its associated current transformer, to withstand the Over currents in the secondary winding of the current transformer under fault conditions and be continuously rated for any current setting.

i. Battery Terminal Units

Floor mounted folded Zintex sheet steel cabinet fitted with mains transformers, full wave rectifier, fuses, instruments, etc., all mounted in the upper compartment which shall have a hinged door forming the front control panel. Stainless steel hinges and catches shall be used. Batteries must be mounted in the lower compartment and pre-wired before delivery.

a) Battery Charging Unit

A constant voltage type charger with current limiting facilities shall be provided. The output voltage shall be kept within 1% of the float charge voltage designed for maximum charge conservation and maximum battery life for variations of +- 10% of the input voltage.

The voltage will be 110 V DC.

Batteries and charger will be rated for the load required and in all cases not be less than 10 kVA.

The ripple content in the output of the charger shall be less than 2%.

The battery condition shall be continuously and automatically monitored to ensure that tripping the Switchgear will occur regardless of the mains having failed. Local and remote alarm facilities will be provided on the equipment to warn maintenance personnel of impending failure of the battery set. The cancel button for the alarm will be mounted on the front of the panel.

Suitable LED's must be fitted in the circuit to show that the mains are switched on and that the primary supply is healthy.

A suitable load resistor and spring-loaded test switch shall be incorporated in the battery discharge circuit to simulate load conditions and enable the maintenance personnel to check the state of the cells on load.

The "Boost" function will be automated (no manual facility).

b) Batteries

The supply and installation of the Battery Terminal Unit (BTU) for the Switchgear with the ventilated dry type nickel cadmium batteries sized/specified based on the switchboard load to be supplied and to last for up to 12 hours with no power supply.

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j. Nameplates and Labels

The following requirements shall be deemed to be standard requirements.

- a) All nameplates and labels shall be in English.
- b) Each switchboard shall be fitted with a nameplate in a conspicuous position indicating:
 - Maker's name
 - Makers type number
 - Maker's serial number
 - Employers contract number
 - Service voltage
 - Number of phases
 - Continuous rating
 - kA rating
- c) Duplicate nameplates for all current transformers shall be mounted on the inside of the relay compartment where they can be easily read. In addition the phase colour with which each current transformer is associated shall appear beneath each rating plate.
- d) Interchangeable, engraved labels showing the designation, shall be fitted to the front and the rear of the fixed part of each cubicle associated with withdrawable equipment.
- e) Screws or rivets shall fix labels other than interchangeable labels. Interchangeable labels shall be fitted in a slide-in aluminium holder, which shall be fixed by means of screws or rivets.
- f) Identification is required adjacent to all electrical control and protection equipment, switches, relays, etc whether these are mounted on the front of the control panels or inside compartments. Labels shall be placed adjacent to all fuses to state the rating.
- g) All identification labels shall correspond with the designations used in circuit and wiring diagrams.
- h) All labels shall be made of composite sandwich type plastic material such as Trafolyte of the following colour combinations:
 - Identification labels: black lettering on white background.

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- Danger labels: white lettering on red background.
 - Incomer & Bus coupler Designation labels: Red lettering on white background.
- k. Low Voltage Wiring
- a) The low voltage auxiliary circuit feeders to each Switchgear panel shall be protected by means of moulded case circuit breakers. The moulded case circuit breakers shall have a rating suitable for the circuits protected.
- b) All instrument and control wiring shall be carried out in a minimum size of 1,5 mm² 0,67 mm stranded copper conductors, insulated with colour coded PVC wire, 600 – 1000 V grade to SANS 10142. Colour for Live conductor is RED and zero Volt conductor is BLACK.
- c) All CT secondary wiring shall be colour coded, numbered and a minimum dimension of 4mm².
- d) All wiring shall present a neat appearance and shall be suitably braced, placed in wiring channels or clipped and/or laced.
- e) All panel and equipment terminals, label, etc. shall be completely accessible after the wiring and cabling has been completed.
- Each end of every wire shall be marked with cable ferrules in black lettering on white or yellow background and preferably of PVC or similar material. Split or “clip on” cable markers are not acceptable.
 - Each end of every wire shall be marked with cable ferrules in black lettering on white or yellow background and preferably of PVC or similar material. Split or “clip on” cable markers are not acceptable.
- f) The Engineer shall approve the system of terminal numbering.
- g) Termination of all wiring shall be done using compression crimp lugs suitable for the intended equipment terminal or terminal strip.
- h) For voltage ratings in excess of 50 V the wiring insulation shall withstand a test voltage of 2 kV to earth for one minute. For voltages of 50 V or less the insulation shall withstand 500 V to earth for one minute.
- i) All wiring between different panels within the same switchboard shall be installed in wiring channels. Grommets shall be installed in each hole in the metalwork through which conductor's pass. Wiring shall also be kept away from exposed metal edges or shall be protected where they cross metal edges.
- j) Conductors may only be jointed at equipment terminals or numbered terminals strips.

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- k) To minimise the effect of electrolysis, DC circuits shall be so arranged that the isolator or N/O operation contacts are connected to the positive pole of the battery and all equipment operating coils or PC Boards connected to the negative pole of the battery.
- l) When approved for use, all fuses for the protection of auxiliary circuits shall be of the high rupturing capacity cartridge type and shall be mounted on insulated draw out carriers, which shall hold the fuses positively after withdrawal.
- m) The top terminals of fuses & MCB's shall be the live terminal in all cases.
- n) Fuses and MCB's shall be so positioned that they are readily accessible to a person of average height standing on the floor in front of the panel.
- o) Labels shall be fitted adjacent to fuses & MCB's stating their use, rating and duty.
- p) Secondary fuses and links shall be coloured as follows:
 - Fuses: Black
 - Solid link: White
- q) All external wiring and connections to auxiliary contacts, alarm, protection, intertripping, DC supply circuits, etc. shall terminate on numbered DIN rail mounted terminal strips, similar or equal to Klippon type RSFI. All numbers shall appear on the switchboard drawings. Box type terminals shall be used with a pressure pad between the conductor and clamping screws. Terminals of the type where clamping screws are in direct contact with the conductor are not acceptable. Terminals shall be spring-loaded type, which will capture the hook blade lug securely even when the clamping screw is not tightened correctly.
- r) Approximately 10% with a minimum of 6 spare terminals shall be provided on each terminal strip.
- s) Terminal strips to which low voltage wiring is connected to external cables shall be arranged to allow a clear space of not less than 150 mm between the cable gland plate and the lowest terminals.

I. Unspecified Items

The installation shall include everything necessary and shall be installed to the approval of the Engineer. The supply and installation of equipment required for adherence to the Standards and Codes may not have been indicated in detail on the drawings or in the other parts of the specification, but will, nevertheless, be considered included in the contract value.

The same makes and type of apparatus shall be used for similar items throughout the installation.

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Design Responsibility

The Foskor Project Engineer is responsible for preparing the scope, adjudicating the tenders, directing, controlling and co-ordinating the efforts of the Contractor to achieve completion on time within acceptable levels of quality and budget. The Project Engineer is not responsible for detailed design.

The Manufacturer will be responsible for the design, manufacture, supply, delivery, off-loading, installation, testing and commissioning of MV Switchgear, including the co-ordination of associated services to provide a proven, reliable, low maintenance system.

Design Review

The Engineer may decide to nominate a competent organisation (or individual) to perform an independent design review.

Equipment Maintainability

- a) Equipment must be designed and manufactured to require minimum maintenance over its lifetime.
- b) Parts must be easily accessible and interchangeable.
- c) Finishes (external/internal) and materials selected (piping, bolting, seals) must be able to withstand the environment and/or handling conditions they are exposed to.

Tests & Test Certificates

All component parts of the equipment shall be subject to type tests and routine tests in accordance with the relevant SABS, BS or IEC standard specifications.

- a. Factory Acceptance Testing
- a) Equipment type and rating check
- b) The ratio, polarity and magnetisation curve of each current transformer after their installation in the board.
- c) Samples of the characteristic curves of each protection relay where applicable.

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- d) The ratio of each voltage transformer.
- e) A functional test of the complete board, including all protective relays, by primary injection.
- f) Breaker opening & closing times.
- g) Mechanical function tests.
- h) System pressure test.
- i) Secondary wiring insulation resistance test.

b. Site Acceptance Testing

The equipment shall be tested on site after erection and prior to commissioning, in the presence of the Engineer.

The following minimum tests shall be performed as required:

- a) System pressure test.
 - b) Actual IDMT relay curves.
 - c) Insulation Resistance tests (Ducter Tests) on all Busbars & joints.
 - d) Primary injection tests.
 - e) Earth continuity and earth resistance tests.
 - f) Functional tests.
 - g) Any other test, which may be required to ascertain the correct functioning of the equipment.
- c. Test Certificates
- c) Copies of type test certificates shall be submitted.
 - d) Three copies of test certificates of all other works tests and on site tests shall be provided.

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Drawings and Manuals

- a. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to trace the existing schematic drawing on the existing panels so that each of the functionality of the system, protection and interconnection to the upstream switchgear can be maintained. It is also the responsibility of the contractor to produce an "as built" documentation record of design and construction.
- b. The Engineer shall endorse all "as built" documentation requirements. These records shall be presented in the form of a bound Data Book lodged with the Engineer.
- c. All drawings shall be generated on AutoCad RELEASE 14. The data storage format shall be 3.5 inch DS HD 1.44 MB stiffy computer disk DXF format, suitable for AutoCAD 14. The contractor shall be responsible for all back up procedures, and computer security and integrity. The Engineer shall verify the procedures. If reasonable systems are not in place the Engineer reserves the right to instruct the Contractor to rectify the situation at his own cost. The software package for spreadsheet work shall be MICROSOFT EXCEL.
- d. The Foskop drawing submitted with this tender is E 20 – 1 – 11 – 2. This drawing will act as a guide to the layout of the switchboard and the sizes of the circuit breakers and the protection and metering required by this tender.

Quality Assurance Requirements

For this Contract, the Manufacturer shall operate a documented Quality Assurance Programme/Management System. It is important that the system fully addresses the scope of work.

- a. For the purposes of filing and documenting the written Quality Assurance Programme, the guidelines laid down in ISO 9001 shall be used.
- b. It is the Manufacturer's responsibility to apply the appropriate requirements of ISO 9001 to any Subcontractor, to the extent necessary. The Manufacturer shall be required to verify and demonstrate that their Subcontractors are capable of meeting the quality requirements stated therein and the Manufacturer shall monitor the Subcontractors for implementation of the quality requirements.
- c. In the event that the Manufacturer considers that any of the criteria referred to in ISO 9001 are not applicable to the Manufacturer or his Sub-Contractor, the Contractor shall provide a written justification to the Engineer for consideration. If such justification is not submitted to and agreed by the Engineer, it will be assumed that all criteria are applicable.
- d. The Engineer reserves the right to verify by audits that the Manufacturer and any Sub-Contractor's have an implemented quality management system, which satisfies the requirements of ISO 9001 or approved equivalent.

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- e. For this Contract, the Contractor shall submit a quality plan(s). The quality plan(s) shall be submitted to the Engineer for approval and no work shall commence until such approval is given.
- f. All Sub-Contractors working for the Manufacturer shall work in accordance with the Manufacturer quality system, procedures and documentation. Sub-Contractor's documentation shall not be accepted.
- g. The Engineer will require access to the Manufacturer facilities and the facilities of any Sub-Contractors, for the purpose of quality audit and surveillance inspection.

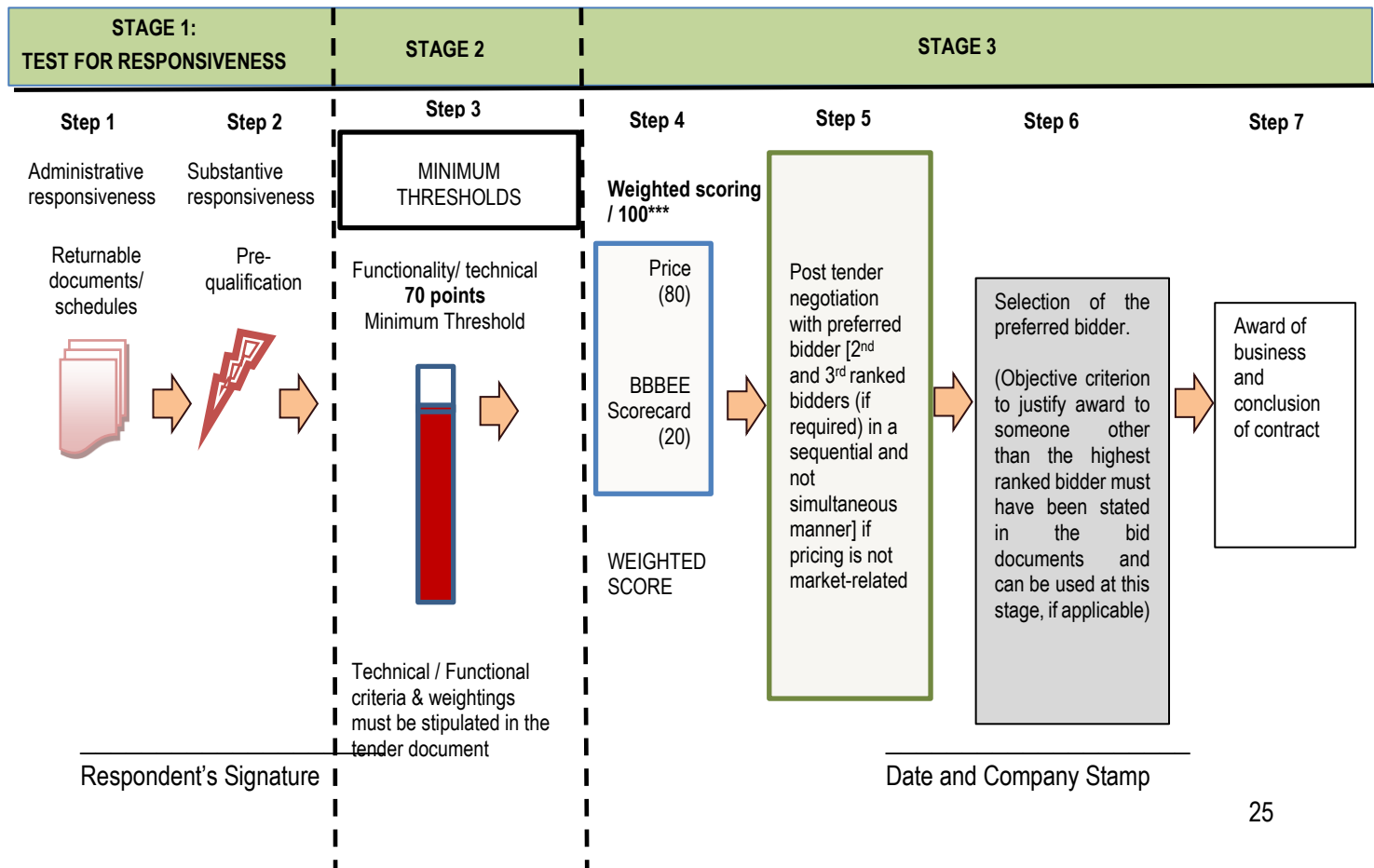

THE NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL PARTICIPATION PROGRAMME

INTRODUCTION

The National Industrial Participation Programme (NIPP), which is applicable to all government procurement contracts that have imported content, became effective on 1 September 1996. The NIP policy and guidelines were fully endorsed by the Cabinet on 30 April 1997. In terms of the Cabinet decision, all state and parastatal purchases / lease contracts (for goods, works and services) entered into after this date, are subject to the NIPP requirements. NIPP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. The Industrial Participation Secretariat (IPS) of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) is charged with the responsibility of administering the programme.

1. PILLARS OF THE PROGRAMME

- 1.1 The NIPP obligation is benchmarked on the imported content of the contract. Any contract having an imported content equal to or exceeding US\$5 million or other currency equivalent to US\$5 million will have a NIP obligation. This threshold of US\$5 million can be reached as follows:

 - (b) Multiple contracts for the same goods, works or services each with imported content exceeding US\$3 million awarded to one seller over a 2 year period which in total exceeds US\$5 million.
 - or
 - (c) A contract with a renewable option clause, where should the option be exercised the total value of the imported content will exceed US\$5 million.
 - or
 - (d) Multiple suppliers of the same goods, works or services under the same contract, where the value of the imported content of each allocation is equal to or exceeds US\$ 3 million worth of goods, works or services to the same government institution, which in total over a two (2) year period exceeds US\$5 million.
- 1.2 The NIP obligation applicable to suppliers in respect of sub-paragraphs 1.1 (a) to 1.1 (c) above will amount to 30% of the imported content whilst suppliers in respect of paragraph 1.1 (d) shall incur 30% of the total NIPP obligation on a *pro-rata* basis.
- 1.3 To satisfy the NIPP obligation, the DTI would negotiate and conclude agreements such as investments, joint ventures, sub-contracting, licensee production, export promotion, sourcing arrangements and research and development (R&D) with partners or suppliers.
- 1.4 A period of seven years has been identified as the time frame within which to discharge the obligation.

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2. REQUIREMENTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY

- 2.1 In order to ensure effective implementation of the programme, successful bidders (contractors) are required to, immediately after the award of a contract that is in excess of **R10 million** (ten million Rands), submit details of such a contract to the DTI for reporting purposes.
- 2.2 The purpose for reporting details of contracts in excess of the amount of R10 million (ten million Rands) is to cater for multiple contracts for the same goods, works or services; renewable contracts and multiple suppliers for the same goods, works or services under the same contract as provided for in paragraphs 1.1.(b) to 1.1. (d) above.
