1 BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is a public entity established by Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997 as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the Commission can be divided into two categories, namely “regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries” and “administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)”.

The Board of the NLC has a mandate to: (i) regulate all lotteries and sport pools with integrity; (ii) ensure the protection of all participants; (iii) maximise revenue for good causes in a responsible manner; and (iv) distribute funds equitably and expeditiously.

The Legislative mandate of the NLC includes inviting applications from registered organisations to apply for grants in support of worthy good causes. The NLC currently has three main sectors, each of which receives a pre-determined percentage of the NLDTF namely Charities (47%), Sport and Recreation (28%) and Arts, Culture, National Heritage and Environment (23%), as well as a fourth fund for Miscellaneous purposes (2%).

Provincial Offices are responsible for receipt and assessment of grant applications and monitoring & evaluation of funded projects.

2 Monitoring and Evaluation

The Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Unit of the NLC has developed a comprehensive monitoring and evaluation system for NLC funded programmes across all sectors. The goal of the monitoring and evaluation (M&E) system is to produce data that are used to document progress towards pre-determined outputs and outcomes in each of the sector funded programmes. In addition, M&E also collects and reports on job creation and retention, together with skills development outputs across all sectors for corporate reporting.

The M&E data must be of high quality if they are to be relied upon for decision-making on funding policy, funding programs, and optimal allocation of funding resources, as well as meeting compliance and auditing requirements.

As part of the operational plan for 2021-22 M&E intends to conduct a data quality

assessment (DQA) of NLC's M&E Data. For this undertaking, we need to develop tools and systems to evaluate the capacity of our M&E system to collect, compile, and report quality data for planning; measure the accuracy of reporting priority indicators; troubleshoot data quality issues; and build the capacity of M&E officials to generate and use high-quality data.

In addition, a project to develop automation of M&E data using the ESRI ArcGIS platform is underway. It is anticipated that this system will replace the current manual, Excel-based system currently in use for M&E data production and analysis.

There is therefore a need for the Data Management Team (DMT) at Head Office, as well as the M&E Specialists and Officers in Provinces, to be trained in data management and quality assurance in the M&E context.

3 PURPOSE OF THE RFP

The purpose of this Request for Proposals (RFP) is to appoint a suitably qualified service provider to submit proposals to conduct a bespoke short course in data quality management (including how to conduct data quality assessment). The training will focus on the M&E sector-based funding frameworks and indicators. By the end of the training, M&E officials should be able to:

- Understand key concepts relating to M&E Data Management including sources of M&E data, Qualitative and Quantitative data collection methods and Participatory methods of data collection.
- Understand Data Quality Assessment (DQA) (What it is, why it is important, what are data quality standards, the relationship between data flow and data quality, and M&E system design for data quality) and prepare a DQA strategy and plan.

Additionally, the course should include a short introduction to GIS in M&E e.g., GIS analysis and mapping techniques, Data preparation for geospatial analysis and Geospatial analysis using GIS software.

The course duration is estimated for three days and will be conducted online. The course should be concluded by end of October 2021. In order not to disrupt

operations, it is envisaged that two cohorts will do the course at different times (in Provincial groups).

4 METHODOLOGY

The successful training provider will demonstrate expertise and competence in providing comprehensive online training on data management and data quality assurance in the monitoring and evaluation context.

The training provider will be expected to demonstrate relevant experience in developing and applying an instructional design that will adequately address the scope of work in relation to the training purpose.

5 TIMING AND DELIVERABLES

The training should commence within two weeks of signing the letter of appointment.

The duration of the training is estimated at three days each for two cohorts comprising provincial-based M&E Specialists and M&E Officers (15 people per group) as well as the Data Management Team (DMT) (5 people) located at Head Office in Pretoria.

It is expected that the training provider will provide a manual for course participants as well as creative and engaging presentations and course material to be presented on the digital platform.

The appointed training provider will be briefed by the DMT and will be provided with the following to customise the instructional design and materials:

- NLC's M&E framework and plan
- SoP for project monitoring and data collection
- Monitoring dashboard

6 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The Service Provider will report to the NLC's Acting Senior Manager Business Development or their delegate for the duration of the appointment; regular meetings will be held to track progress.

7 EVALUATION

Phase 1: Pre-Qualification Criteria (Mandatory Requirements)

Bidders must submit all the requirements mentioned below. The following mandatory requirements must be met to qualify for this bid:

- Signed standard bidding documents (SBD Forms). It is required that the bidder must provide correct information and declaration (where possible) in the SBD Forms.
- In the event of the bidder being in a joint venture, joint venture agreement must be submitted (*where applicable*).
- Central Supplier Database (CSD) Summary Registration Report. Kindly submit a copy of the recent CSD Summary Registration Report with valid tax compliance.
- Registration as an accredited training provider / Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). Bidders are required to submit proof of registration as an accredited training provider / HEI
- Membership of South African Monitoring and Evaluation Association (SAMEA) by the project lead and at least one other team member. Bidders are required to submit proof of memberships for the project lead and one team member.
- The bidder must have National Qualifications Framework (NQF) Level 7. Bidders are required to submit proof of valid full accreditation (current accreditation) NQF Level 7.
- Signed consent form in terms of the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 (POPIA) (consent form can also be downloaded on our website)

Any bid that fails to meet the above mentioned pre-qualifying criteria will be deemed unacceptable.

Phase 2: Functional/technical Evaluation

Only bidders that have met the pre-qualification criteria will be evaluated for functional evaluation. In this phase the evaluation will be based on the bidders' responses in respect of the bid proposal (evaluated on the minimum functional specifications). Prospective bidders who score a minimum of 70 points or more will be considered for the next phase 3 (Price and B-BBEE status level contributor).

Service Providers are at liberty to structure their Proposals according to any format, if it covers all areas specified in this document.

Evaluation of the Proposals will be based on the service provider's responses in respect of the according to the following criteria:

Specific details must be given to indicate the extent to which these previous experiences relate to the work described in the TOR. A summary profile (in a matrix format) of the proposed trainers / facilitators, their qualifications, technical and professional skills, and why they are suitable to undertake the training as outlined, should be included in the proposal. Abbreviated Curriculum Vitae (CV's) of key personnel to be involved in the implementation of project(s), not longer than one page each, shall be included in an Appendix. CVs should demonstrate qualified and experienced trainers / facilitators in the relevant field with membership of relevant associations / professional bodies where applicable (e.g., SAMEA).

Phase 3: The 80/20 Principle-Point System based on Price and B-BBEE status level contributor.

Only bidders that have met the 70-point threshold in phase 2 will be evaluated in phase 3 for price and BBEE. Price and BBEE will be evaluated as follows:

i) Stage 1 – Price Evaluation (80 Points)

The following formula will be used to calculate the points for price:

Where

Ps = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration

Pt = Comparative price of bid under consideration

Pmin = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid

ii) Stage 2 – BBEE Evaluation (20 points)

a. BBEE Points allocation

Points will be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contributor in accordance with the table below:

8 GENERAL GUIDELINES

8.1 Submission Instruction

The Proposal should be submitted on a USB drive in PDF to the address specified below, with the following in the subject line:

Take note of the following:

- No costs have been prescribed for the;
- All proposals **must** be costed in South African Rand, inclusive of VAT;
- The costing must remain valid and open for evaluation for a period of at least thirty (30) days from the time of submission.

8.2 Costs to be borne by service providers

All costs and expenses incurred by the service provider in any way associated with the development, preparation and submission of responses and providing any additional information required by the NLC, will be borne entirely and exclusively by the service provider.

8.3 Disclaimer

The NLC reserves the right not to select a service provider. The NLC also reserves the right to:

- Award the contract or any part thereof to one or more service providers;
- Reject all proposals;

- Decline to consider any proposals that do not conform to any aspect of the requirements;
- Request further information from any service provider after the closing date for clarity purposes;
- Cancel this or any part thereof at any time; and
- Should any of the above occur, it will be communicated in writing to the service provider.

8.4 Confidentiality

- Proposals submitted will not be revealed to any other party and will be treated as contractually binding;
- All information pertaining to the NLC obtained by the service provider because of participation in this is confidential and must not be disclosed without written authorisation from the NLC; and
- The successful service provider will be issued with a letter of appointment outlining the requirements of the project.

8.5 Disqualification

- Any form of canvassing/lobbying/influence regarding the RFP will result in disqualification;
- Any non-disclosure of any other information pertaining to this RFP will result in disqualification; and
- Non-compliance with the requirements will invalidate the proposal.

8.6 Price adjustments

- Application for price adjustments must be accompanied by documentary evidence in support of any adjustments;
- The project implementation costs to be quoted during the contract with the successful service providers.

8.7 Payment Terms

The NLC undertakes to pay valid tax invoices in full within thirty (30) days from statement date for services rendered;

All supporting documents for services rendered should be submitted together with the tax invoices

8.8 Validity
