1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is a public entity established by the Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended, to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The NLC's functions include the regulation of the National Lottery and other lotteries, as well as the administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF).

To ensure business resilience and continuity of critical operations, the NLC has implemented a Business Continuity Management (BCM) Policy, Framework, and Business Continuity Plans (BCPs) for its Head Office and provincial offices. Following successful implementation and testing of the Head Office BCP, the NLC seeks to extend and strengthen its Business Resilience Programme across all provincial offices.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this RFQ is to appoint a suitably qualified and experienced service provider to support the NLC in enhancing its **Business Resilience Programme** through:

- Review of the Emergency Response Plan (ERP);
- Development of a Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP); and
- Delivery of Business Continuity Management (BCM) training;

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The appointed service provider will be required to undertake the following:

3.1. Review of the Emergency Response Plan (ERP)

- Conduct a comprehensive review of the current NLC ERP.
- Benchmark against relevant legislation, ISO 22320, ISO 22301, and best practices.
- Identify gaps, risks, and areas for improvement.
- Provide recommendations and an updated ERP ensuring effective emergency response and staff safety.

3.2. Development of the Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP)

- Assess NLC's ICT environment, critical systems, and dependencies.
- Develop a comprehensive DRP aligned with ISO 22301 and ISO/IEC 27031 standards.
- Define Recovery Time Objectives (RTOs) and Recovery Point Objectives (RPOs).

- Provide an implementation roadmap and testing strategy.

3.3. Business Continuity Management (BCM) Training

- Develop and deliver customized BCM training for management, risk owners, and staff.
- Include BCM awareness, roles, responsibilities, and response procedures.
- Incorporate practical exercises, case studies, and scenario-based simulations.
- Provide training materials, attendance registers, and post-training evaluation reports.

4. DELIVERABLES

The service provider will deliver the following:

6. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The service provider will report to the **Chief Risk Officer (CRO)** or delegated official in the **Enterprise Risk Management Division** throughout the project duration.

7. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The expected duration of the project is three (3) Months after the receipt of the appointment letter and the purchase order.

8. SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

8.1. Terms and Conditions of Request for Quotations

- 8.1.1. This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the Commission.
- 8.1.2. No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from the Commission.
- 8.1.3. All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the Commission.
- 8.1.4. Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 8.1.5. No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official Commission Purchase Order form has been received.
- 8.1.6. This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act of 2000 and PPR 2022.
- 8.1.7. Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za.
- 8.1.8. Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant.
- 8.1.9. All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded to quotation@nlcsa.org.za, within two (2) days of the closing date.
- 8.1.10. Any supplier who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform the Commission via email.

8.2. General rules and instructions

- 8.2.1. News and press releases
 - 8.2.1.1. Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFQ or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the Commission.
- 8.2.2. Precedence of documents
 - 8.2.2.1. This RFQ consists of several sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFQ and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFQ submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFQ shall take precedence.
 - 8.2.2.2. Where this RFQ is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations

addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the Commission may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by the Commission.

8.2.2.3. It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFP. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the Commission as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent.

8.2.2.4. Bidders hereby acknowledging that the decision of the commission in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

8.2.3. Preferential procurement reform

8.2.3.1. The commission supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the commission insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B- BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.

8.2.4. National Industrial Participation Programme.

8.2.4.1. The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).

8.2.5. Language

8.2.5.1. Bids shall be submitted in English.

8.2.6. Gender

8.2.6.1. Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other

genders.

8.2.7. Headings

8.2.7.1. Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.

8.2.8. Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993

8.2.8.1. The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any contractor that may be appointed) cover in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFQ and/ or subsequent agreement. The commission reserves the right to request Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to the commission.

8.2.9. Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information

8.2.9.1. All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA and NLC SCM Policy.

8.2.9.2. The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the commission is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the commission is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.

8.2.9.3. All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the commission Data Privacy Policy.

8.2.9.4. The commission will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e., the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the

procedures as specified in the commission PAIA manual.

- 8.2.9.5. In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

9. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

- 9.1. Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information.
- 9.2. The Commission may not award business to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD.
- 9.3. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.
- 9.4. The CSD can be accessed at <https://secure.csd.gov.za/>

10. Confidentiality

- 10.1. Bids submitted for this Request for Proposals will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding.
- 10.2. The Commission reserves all the rights afforded to it by POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in Bid Proposals.
- 10.3. The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The Commission and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the Commission in terms of this bid award and only for the purposes as detailed in this RFQ and in accordance with any applicable law.
- 10.4. The Bidder shall notify the Commission in writing of any unauthorized access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and report such crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

11. Communication

- 11.1. Specific queries relating to this RFQ should be submitted Quotation@nlcsa.org.za and cc lucky@nlcsa.org.za,

by no later than 2 days before the closing date.

- 11.2. In the interest of fairness and transparency, the Commission's response to such a query may be made available to other bidders.
- 11.3. It is prohibited for bidders to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of the Commission in respect of this RFQ between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 11.4. Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

12. Supplier Performance

- 12.1. The National Lotteries Commission conducts regular performance reviews in accordance with the requirements for the classification of the contract and or stakeholder by making use of supplier evaluation forms. The evaluation is conducted against the deliverables or scope of the contract with a minimum of an annual review done for contracts longer than a year and a review at completion of contract for those contracts less than a year.
- 12.2. Ad-hoc performance reviews shall be conducted where non-performance is identified outside the review period.
- 12.3. Non-performance will be addressed with at least a formal letter advising specific non-performing areas and stating remedial action/s required within specific time frames. Non-adherence to remedial actions shall lead to escalating performance management actions.
- 12.4. Any party to this agreement may request to participate in a joint performance review where appropriate and seek continuous improvement opportunities.

13. SECTION 3: EVALUATION CRITERIA

The Commission will evaluate all proposals in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2022 and the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act. No. 5 of 2000 (PPPFA).
