TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A GABLE ROOF AT THE TRAFFIC DIVISION

1. Introduction

Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality (EMLM) requests Service Providers to tender for the construction of a Gable Roof at the Traffic Division.

2. Executive summary

Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality in the 2022/2023 financial year budget has made provision on the Amendment Budget for the project that is serving on this Bid document classified as follows:

Appointment of contractor for the construction of a Gable Roof for the Traffic Division.

2.1. Labour intensive based construction

Municipality expect the successful bidder to apply innovations on maximizing applications of labour intensive methods without compromising quality standard of the work. The municipality has estimated sufficient maximization of local labour components that were identified are but not limited to: -

- Site clearance,
- Removing and or adjustment of Canopy adjacent to Gable Roof Adjust and construct suitable, building plan compliant canopy brackets to accommodate new Gable roof.
- Construction of roof and ceiling,
- Brick laying work,
- Painting of ceilings and gutters.

2.2. Quality control and quality Assurance

The prospective service provider must show his/ her capabilities for offering to render for the service. The project team must be clearly indicated designation for each member of the team.

2.3. Health and Safety Requirements

The successful bidder must take into account all aspects of the occupational Health and Safety Act which has been enacted to provide for Health and Safety of person in connection with the use of tools, equipment, plant and machinery, the protection of persons against hazard to health and safety arising out or in connection with the activities of persons at work, to establish an advisory council for occupational health and safety and to provide for matters connected therewith. However, the contractor, shall still be accountable for the compliance and adherence to the OHS Act.

2.4. Estimated project cost

The works of the project and rates are once off.

2.5. Program of works

A clear preliminary program for the works must be indicated and although all activities of the project is set and must be inspected accordingly, the project is once off and payment will only be effected on completion of the project.

2.6. SCOPE OF WORK

- The service provider is required to prepare the identified site for construction by securing the area.
- The service provider is required to remove all furniture, files, cabinets, cupboards and equipment to a secure place as identified by the Manager Public Safety and also return all as and when construction is complete.
- The Service Provider must remove the old roof and rubble.
- Construct according to construction plan phased in time slots. The project requires inspection signed off by building inspector before commencement and or continuation of project.
- Adjust and construct suitable, building plan compliant canopy brackets to accommodate new Gable roof.
- The service provider is required to connect the electricity within the minimum requirements of the Building Regulations/SANS 0400 to the main electricity supply. (Electrical certificate (COC) for the connection must be provided).

3. DETAILED SPECIFICATIONS

- The Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality requires a constructed Gable Roof at the identified area of the Infra Structure/ Community Services Office (Erf 87) of Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality (Corner of Barlow & Robertson Avenue) that can meet its operational requirements. Those requirements are stipulated in the “Detailed Specification Table” shown below.
- **The specifications of the Gable Roof are as follows:**

Size	Floor Dimension of office that require the Gable Roof: • 6,2 meters x 9.5 meters (58,9 m²) The total roof tile area per square meter plus 10% wastage is: • 62 m²
Roof Construction	• Gable Roof build as per approved building plan and South African National Building Regulations (The rafters of the Gable roof must be diagonally braced on the undersides to provide extra strength) • As per approved Building plan provided by the Planning Division of Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality. • The Gable roof is constructed with pre-treated timber trusses. • Full Sisalation covering the whole roof, 405 / FR405 / FR430 to be drawn tautly over purlins and secured to the top and bottom purlins and fixed concurrent with roof covering; overlapped longitudinally by 150mm; on and including galvanised straining wire spaced at 275mm or 367mm; all in accordance with the manufacturers specifications. • Compulsory leakage test to be conducted before handover and a minimum of 12 months guarantee.
Canopy	Adjust and construct suitable, building plan compliant canopy brackets to accommodate new Gable roof.
Roof Tiles	Interlocking Double Roman Plus cement roof tiles (Colour – Terracotta matching current roof tiles)

Brick Laying	Outside wall to extend to top of Gable roof. The double wall face brick must match current face bricks and be constructed as per approved building plan.
Ceiling	The ceiling is a 6.4 mm thick plasterboard skimmed with 2 mm Crete stone to give a seamless effect. The floor to ceiling height is 2440 mm.
Carpentry	• Cornice (130 mm) for all interior walls. • Seamless Barge Board with Purlin clip to insure extra strength. • A runner bracket (Zinc alum / Chroma deck) is fixed to the timber. • This provides extra protection to roof timber and also provides a fixing point for seamless bargeboards. • The seamless bargeboards are fixed to the runner brackets with colour-matched pop rivets. (No nails, No screws are used.) • A cover strip to go over the roof tiles provides extra protection to timber. • This cover strip also serves to provide a smooth finish to the completed seamless bargeboard.
Safety and Security	Sufficient fire protection systems (fire retardant panels) that complies with the National Building Regulations, SANS 0400 and other applicable legislation.
Gutters	• Seamless galvanized gutters (80 mm x 80 mm) with gutter down pipe (80 mm x 50 mm) all round (Colour – White) – Storm water drainage system to accommodate gutter rainwater. • Install gutters and four (4) downpipes for structure.
Electrical	• Energy efficient lighting that provides between 600 to 800 lumen in each office, having lighting control sensors that activate on room occupancy and levels of ambient light with a on and off switch that can also allow for permanent light as and when we wish to disable the light control sensor.

- The work will also include the cleaning and removal of the unwanted substances before and after completion of the work.
